REMOVED BRITISH INTERVENTION IN YUCATAN.—By the brig F. Smith at New Orleans on the 24th ult., from Havana on the 16th ult., the New Orleans papers have the news of a proposed intervention by the British government in the affairs of Yucatan, for the purpose of restoring peace there, on condition of receiving a portion of the territory.

THE CIVIC ELECTIONS in Halifax took place on Monday last. The Nova Scotia of Wednesday says that local feeling, spathy, and other causes have led to several changes in the representation, and to an accession of Conservatives in the Common Council.

ISLAND OF CUBA.—It is 624 miles in extreme length, with a width varying from 22 to 117 miles, and covers an area of 37,000 square miles, being about the size of the State of Maine. It contains a population at the present time of 1,500,000, of which 610,000 are whites, 190,000 are free coloured, and 690,000 slaves.

ARRIVAL OF TREASURE FROM CALIFORNIA.—On Saturday, 70 tons weight of gold dust from California, and dollars from Valparaiso, were brought by Her Majesty's ship Calypso. The specie arrived by special train from Portsmouth, and was removed from the London-bridge terminus in 20 vans, drawn by 80 horses, and escorted by the police.

An express with the English news for Boston and New York, will be run for the next two weeks from Halifax to Sackville; after that time it is expected the whole line will be complete to Halifax.
