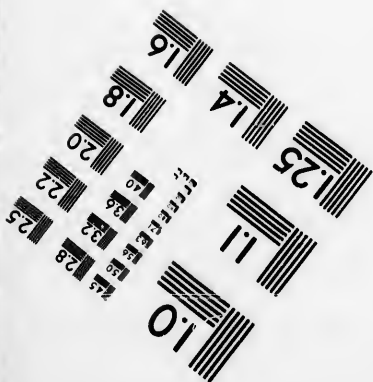
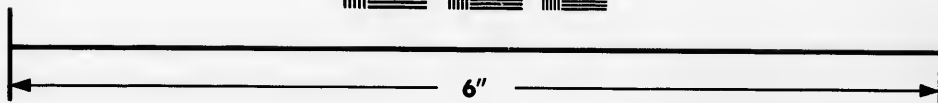
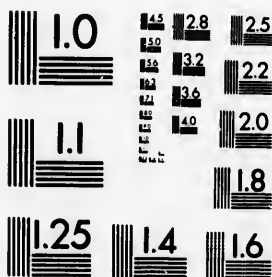


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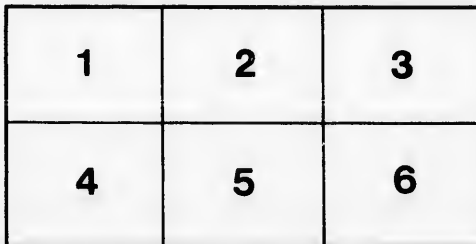
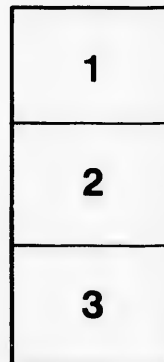
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(First Week.)

SABBATH EVENING.

GOD and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ ; who has blest us with spiritual blessings during this sacred day, we pray for the growth of good fruit from our thoughts, meditations and exercises in church and house. MONDAY MORNING.

We beseech Thee, strengthen and guide us by Thy grace that we may spend it wholly on Thy service, aiming at Thy glory and the salvation of our fellow men. And even as Thou sheddest now the beams of the Sun upon the Earth to give light to our bodies, so illumine our souls with the brightness of Thy Spirit to guide us in the paths of Thine obedience. May all our purpose be this day to honor and serve Thee ; may we look for all prosperity to Thy blessing, and seek no object but such as may be pleasing in Thy sight. Enable us, O Lord, while we labor for the body and the life that now is, ever to look beyond unto the heavenly life which Thou hast promised Thy children. Defend us in body and soul from all evil. And, seeing it is a small thing to have begun well, unless we also persevere, take us, O Lord, into Thy good keeping this day and all our days ; continue and increase Thy grace within us, until we shall be perfectly united in the glory of Thy Son, our Lord, the Son of Righteousness, who shall replenish our souls with His eternal light and gladness. And that we may obtain all these blessings, be pleased to cast out of Thy remembrance all our past offences, and of Thy boundless mercy to forgive them, as Thou hast promised those that call upon Thee in sincerity and truth. Hear us, O God, our Father and Redeemer, through Jesus Christ our Lord, in whose name we pray, as He hath taught us, saying—Our Father, etc., etc.

(First Week.)

MONDAY EVENING.

O MERCIFUL GOD ; Eternal Light, shining in darkness, who dispellest the night of sin and all blindness of heart, since Thou hast appointed the day for labour and the night for rest ; we beseech Thee, grant that our bodies may rest in peace and quietness, that afterward they may be able to endure the labour they must bear. Temper our sleep that it may not be disorderly, that we may remain spotless both in body and in soul ; yea, that our sleep itself may be to Thy glory. Enlighten the eyes of our understanding that we may not sleep the sleep of death ; but always look for deliverance from this misery. Defend us against all the assaults of the devil. Take us into Thy holy protection. And, although we have not passed this day without greatly sinning against Thee, we beseech Thee, to hide our sins with Thy mercy, as Thou hidest all things on earth with the darkness of the night, that we may not be cast out from Thy presence. Relieve and comfort all those who are afflicted or distressed in mind, body or estate ; pity the helpless, be a friend to the widow and the orphan, succor the poor and oppressed ; deliver the tempted, sustain the sick and receive in mercy the spirits of the dying. Grant that the things which we have asked faithfully we may obtain effectually through Him who hast taught us to say, Our Father, etc., etc.

(First Week.)

TUESDAY MORNING.

O GOD, who art light and in whom is no darkness at all, we praise Thee for having called us into the marvellous light of Thy gospel, and we pray that our hearts may be more and more enlightened, quickened and governed by Thee, so that our path may become as the shining light which shineth more and more unto the perfect day. During the unconscious hours, Thou hast kept us so that we have not slept the sleep of death. Grant us the will and the power to employ the life, which Thou hast preserved, in holy obedience to Thy commands. TUESDAY EVENING.

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

If Thou seest meet to afflict us, deny us not Thy help, but overrule all trials for our growth in holiness and final victory. Having called us unto the grace of Christ, increase it in us more and more. Defend our minds from all corruptions of Thy truth, and so reveal Christ to us in the Gospel that we may love Him more and that we may live in Him and He may live in us. As night has come and day has ended, so may we prepare for the night in which no man can work. Grant us a strong and unshaken hope of a day in which the light shall never cease. Let Thine ever watchful eyes be upon us this night. Help the helpless and relieve the wants of the destitute and needy ones of the earth. THURSDAY MORNING.

(Second Week.)

(Second Week.)

WEDNESDAY MORNING.

As we are sinful at all times and our days upon the earth are few and evil, hold up our goings that we may never fall away from Thee. Judged by Thy law, there is no moral soundness in us. (Third Week.)

FRIDAY EVENING.

O GOD, who in the darkest night, we ask Thy continued protection during the shadows. Father in heaven, may we be merciful as Thou art merciful, that in the Spirit of Thy Son we may follow Thee as dear children. Give us by faith such a lively view of heaven, and so raise our minds that, though we dwell here below, we may always have our thoughts, our desires and our conversation there. Enable us to follow Thy saints in all virtue and holy living, that we may with them come to those unspeakable joys which Thou hast prepared for them that love Thee. Increase among the nations the dispensation of Thy saving grace; that the wilderness of sin may blossom with beauty. May all such as profess to know and love Thee be filled with wisdom to apprehend, and zeal to do Thy will. Help us to rest this night in peace with all men, in perfect love toward our friends, and in entire trust in Thee. Our Father, etc.

(Third Week.)

SATURDAY MORNING.

O GOD, who keepest our soul in life, so that we are among the living to praise Thee, our voice shalt Thou hear when joy cometh in the morning. Glory is due to Thee in all parts of Thy dominion, but chiefly from such as have known Thy saving health among all nations. We thank Thee that the Saviour promised by prophets and typified by ordinances appeared in the fulness of time, when the Word was made flesh and the hosts of heaven celebrated His arrival and manifested His glory. Before this great mystery of God incarnate, His being born, and that in a low condition, being made under the law, undergoing all the miseries of this life, the wrath of God and the cursed death of the cross, being buried and remaining under the power of death for a time, we bow in humble adoration. Be Thou our helper this day, that all our work may be to Thy glory, through Jesus Christ. Our Father, etc., etc.

(Third Week.)

SATURDAY EVENING.

GLORY to Thee, O God, this night for all the blessings of the light. Our days are a handbreadth and our age is as nothing before Thee. We are strangers with Thee and sojourners as all our fathers were. At our best estate we are vanity and our life is as a shadow that declineth. We therefore praise Thee that Jesus Christ has by His life, His doctrine, His works, His death, and His resurrection, brought life and immortality to light. All that was dark and perplexing before is now made clear, and the shadow of death is filled with light. This dark and gloomy passage has been trodden by the Prince of life who holds the keys of death and of hell. Merciful Saviour, deliver our souls from the corruption of sin, the parent of death. May we fear sinning more than we fear dying. Perfect Thy strength in our weakness, and enable us to resist and overcome the sins that do most easily beset us. Help us in this conflict with our spiritual foes. May nothing in heaven or earth separate us from the love of Christ. We are liable to doubt and fainting and fear, but Thou art mighty and the Captain of our salvation is made perfect by suffering. May we ever hear and obey the voice of the great shepherd of the sheep and follow Him wherever He calls us to go. As we are baptised into the death of Thy blessed Son, Jesus Christ, so by continually mortifying our corrupt affections, grant that we may be buried with Him, and through the grave and gate of death may we pass to our joyful resurrection. and to behold Him face to face, in the glory of His kingdom. We present our supplications for the people of God in all lands, and for our fellow-worshippers in particular, that they may be prepared for Thy service by a spirit of truth, unity and concord. May the thoughts of all this night turn to Thy word and the glories of Thy church and kingdom. Sanctify us body and soul, that we may tread Hear us when we each confess our faith, say—Thy courts with gladness on the morrow. ing, "I believe in God," etc., etc.

(Fourth Week.)

SABBATH MORNING.

O GOD, who givest power to the faint, Thou hast delivered our soul from death and made us see Thy loving-kindness among the living. As Thou leddest Thy people in the wilderness, so lead us this day. As Thou didst smite the rock and give them water to drink when their souls fainted; so refresh our soul with the living waters of salvation by Him who is the way, and the truth and the life, and cheer us with consolation by the mission of the Comforter. Purify Thy people from all guile, unite them in the bonds of love and peace, and pour upon them all manner of spiritual gifts. As Jesus died and rose again, so may we die unto sin and rise into a new life in Him. In the sanctuary cause us to see Thy power and Thy glory. Though our sins do always hinder our worship, we pray Thee to help us, O God, by subduing our evil nature. Lift us above earthly cares, interests and passions, so that we may feel that Thou art near us, that we are in Thy house, and that Thy church is the gate of heaven. Give unto all preachers a door of utterance to proclaim the mystery of Christ. Arrest the progress of vice. Let none that profess Christ profane Thy holy day. Magnify Thy power in the turning of many to the wisdom of the just. Our Father, etc., etc.

(Fourth Week.)

SABBATH EVENING.

O GOD, heaven and earth are full of the majesty of Thy glory. The glorious company of the Apostles praise Thee. The goodly fellowship of the Prophets praise Thee. The noble army of martyrs praise Thee. The Holy Church throughout all the world doth acknowledge Thee, the Father of an infinite Majesty, Thy true and only Son, also the Holy Ghost, the Comforter. Thou hast this day made us to possess the green pastures of Thy word, and hast led us by the still waters of Thy grace. We have united with Thy church and appeared with those we love in Thy presence upon earth. We have presented our feeble and imperfect offerings of praise and prayer in Thy holy church, and among Thy chosen people. Alas ! with what prevailing sin and interruption we have sought Thee ? But Thou raisest up the humble and revivest the contrite. Be pleased, O God, to accept our offering through Thine infinite mercy in Christ, and quicken our zeal and love. Draw us near to Him in whom all fulness dwells. Make this day a step towards heaven, a preparation for its purity, peace and perfection, and may we be ever ready to hear the voice of Him who waits for us. Open the door of our hearts unto Him who knocks. Ever may Thy people be willing to hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches. To all the world send speedily Thy glad message of salvation, that the thirsty and weary souls of men may receive freely of the water of life. May the shepherds of the flock be strengthened and cheered by their own doctrine. Grant us all that most excellent gift of charity, without which whosoever liveth is dead before Thee. Be pleased, O God, to comfort and succor all those who in this transitory life are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity. During the dark and silent hours protect and preserve us. Our Father, etc., etc.

(Fourth Week.)

MONDAY MORNING.

O GOD, who didst of old lead Thy people with a cloud by day and fire by night, we praise Thee for peace and preservation. Thou hast restored the light to our eyes and our eyes to the light. We have awakened, for Thou hast sustained us. Justly Thou mightest have made our Sabbaths and our solemnities to cease, and taken away all our comforts in life. In our Christian course keep us ever looking to Jesus, who meekly bore the pain and agony of the cross to atone for our sins, and who was made a spectacle to the universe, that He might be Lord of all. (Fourth Week.)

MONDAY EVENING.

O GOD, who hast again brought back the stillness in which Thy creatures seek repose, we now seek the holy place in which Thou hearest prayer. With the close of the busy day cause our souls to cease from the cares of the world, that we may receive the peace of God. Give us the rest of faith, that we may enter into the rest of fruition. Our sins have filled our souls with divers spiritual diseases and unclean spirits have grievously tormented us. We have broken Thy law and cannot attain innocency. Lord Jesus, Thou Holy One of God, forgive our iniquity and rebuke our disorders, cleanse our hearts and make us holy. As day follows day, and night follows night, enable us to redeem the time from evil and do all the good we can. Unite us firmly with the Catholic church, which is one body, and in which there is one Spirit, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in all. Make all who are near and dear to us Thine own in the day when Thou writest up the people. May all the afflicted look to Christ, that they may be healed. Strengthen the sick on the bed of languishing, and to the dying make the day of death the day of birth into a better life. We thank Thee for all Thy servants who have left this world in Thy faith and fear and whose works do follow them. May the wicked who are still alive upon earth turn and not die eternally. While we sleep guard and bless us. Our Father, etc., etc.

(Fourth Week.)

TUESDAY MORNING.

O GOD, who givest and preservest life : we magnify Thy name this day. We have to confess that we have too often employed the life which Thou hast given and prolonged in disobeying Thy just and holy commands. The wickedness of what we have done or attempted, as well as omitted, we humbly acknowledge and lament. Not to our deserving, O God, do we ascribe our preservation or continuance or temporal well-being, but to Thy sovereign favor and inexpressible love. Thou hatest sin and castest forth the wicked from Thy presence, yet Thou sparest the souls that seek a refuge in Thy grace. By great love and much forbearance Thou art leading us unto repentance. Cover our dear ones with Thine Almighty wings. Illumine with faith and hope the troubled souls that cry to Thee, and cause the dying to triumph over death. Our Father, etc., etc.

(Fourth Week.)

WEDNESDAY MORNING.

FATHER of mercies, now when the sun again shines, we would renew our prayers and vows. Many have lain down to rest who shall see no more the light that shines upon us. Not in our own merits, as if we deserved such gifts and favors, do we trust, but in Thine own manifold mercies, and we come to Thee in the name of Thy beloved Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who is our Mediator and Advocate toward Thy Majesty. O Thou, who didst for us tread the painful path of this mortal life, and endure sorrows like no other sorrows, help us to follow in Thy footsteps. Because of the infirmities of our flesh, aid us by the power of Thy heavenly intercession. Touch with Thy healing power the fountains of sinful desire and subdue every evil purpose. Let virtue go forth from Thy risen body, exalted to the throne of the universe, and penetrate all our life. (Fourth Week.)

(Fourth Week.)

(Fourth Week.)

FRIDAY MORNING.

O GOD, who renewest every morning the face of the earth, give us minds to mark and to admire Thy glory, and hearts to love and adore Thee. As the world is filled with light, so may our souls be filled with love to Thee and all men, especially our believing brethren. As our bodies have been refreshed by Thy power, so may our souls be comforted with Thy grace. May the calmness and repose of sleep be to us the emblem of that peace which the world can neither give nor take away. Holy Father, cause the light that lighteneth every man, that cometh into the world, to shine into our minds and enkindle the flame of heavenly love. By the blessed volume of the book in which Christ speaks, and is spoken of, by the instruction it affords, the consolation it ministers, the immortal life it reveals, the glory it promises, illumine our path through this world, and direct us to the attainment of everlasting life. By the wondrous things of Thy law, and by the delights of Thy commandments, render our souls more and more dead to the light that leads astray, even when enriched with the splendor of genius. (Fourth Week.)

(Fourth Week.)

SATURDAY MORNING.

ALMIGHTY GOD, and most dear Father, who restorest our soul in the morning, honor and praise be to Thee for all Thy mercies. It has pleased Thee freely to bestow blessings so many and great that our cup runneth over; to create us after Thine own image; to redeem us with the precious blood of Thy dear Son; to sanctify us with Thy Holy Spirit in the revelation and knowledge of Thy holy word; to help us in all our needs and necessities; to protect us from all dangers of body and soul; to comfort us in all our tribulations; and to spare us so long, and to give us so large a time for repentance. As we have received these benefits, most merciful Father, of Thine own goodness, so we beseech Thee to grant us always Thy Holy Spirit, whereby we may grow continually in thankfulness, may be led into all truth and be comforted in all our adversities. (Fourth Week.)

SATURDAY EVENING.

O GOD, who didst ordain in the beginning, and in our creation, six days labor and a seventh day's rest, and didst Thyself rest on the Sabbath day and hallow it, we praise Thee for the past week, now ended, and for this holy Sabbath eve now begun. In the darkness of the night as well as in the brightness of the day, Thou hast preserved us from all evil. How precious are Thy bounteous and gracious thought unto us, O God? May there be in us the mind of Him who, though he was rich, yet for our sake became poor, that we, by His poverty, might become rich. Feeling always Thy presence, may we be a holy family before Thee, and be received hereafter into the family of heaven, for which Thou didst send Thy Son to prepare us, and which He has gone to prepare for us. We thank Thee for all Thy faithful servants departed; help us to follow them as they followed Christ. Hear our confession of faith, "We believe in God," etc., etc.

ON A COMMUNION SABBATH
MORNING.

Visit in Thy mercy those who are withheld by infirmity or affliction from worshipping in Thy house and communicating at Thy table. May all Thy true disciples throughout the world be blessed by Thy presence and enriched by the assurance of Thy love. Let grace, mercy and peace be multiplied to all who love the Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity. Amen.

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WHEN THERE IS SICKNESS IN THE HOME.

Through the merit and intercession of our Redeemer be pleased to comfort *him* with the assurance of forgiveness and cheer *him* with the hope of eternal life.

O Lord Jesus, our Saviour, who in great compassion didst bear our sicknesses, we pray Thee to speak the word and our dear one shall be healed. Bless the skill of the physician and the virtue of the remedies, that *his* health may be restored and *his* days prolonged to serve Thee here. Help every one of us to say from the heart, "Thy will be done." And grant that whether in health or in sickness, in joy or in grief, in life or in death, we may be enabled to glorify Thy holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Amen.
