THE WORK.

The usual Sunday and week-night services have been maintained with interest and profit during the year. We trust the sorrowing have been comforted, the weak made stronger, the tempted restrained and all have been inspired to a nobler and better life. Twenty-seven members have been added to the church during the year. Present membership 229.

We report six marriages, eight burials, two adult and fourteen infant baptisms. 350 copies of *Church Tidings* and over 300 copies of other religious papers have been distributed by the pastor. Our aim is to visit all the families at least twice during the year, also extra calls where deemed necessary. The Choirs, Sunday Schools and Leagues have immensely helped in the work.
