ACCOUN Making Hay.

to turn by hand a heavy crop of grass when it was cut with a side-cut machine. I had to do it in order to make good hay; but for three years past I have used the Eureka mower, and have not turned one forkful. The longer I use it the better I like if. It is mere play to cut six acres between 2 o'clock and 6, and the grass is left in such shape as to cure quickly and make choice hay at about half the expense that we used to be at. Lought, perhaps, to say in this connection that the Eureka has had one defect, which made it do rather poor work in Hungarian grass, but I understand that the defect has been remedied in the new machines. Inquiry is often made in the Country Gentleman about hay caps. They are nice things, and sometimes will save their cost. in a single storm. 
