TWO WARS.

The two English-speaking nations of the world are at present engaged in military operations of a somewhat similar character. What is transpiring in South Africa is like what is taking place in the Philippines in that in both places there is a prolonged, although irregularly conducted, resistance to a conquering army.

A MIGHTY FORCE.

There recently assembled in San Francisco a convention of members of the Epworth League of the United States and Canada. This League, as most people know, is the young people's society of the Methodist Church.

It originated one hundred and seventy years ago at Oxford, and its founder was a curate of the Established Church.
