WE showed yesterday the extent of participation occasionally permitted to Canada in the negotiation of imperial treaties. But the rule is that treaties are concluded between Great Britain and foreign nations in which our interests may be directly affected, and in the making of which we are not even allowed the privilege of urging a suggestion. Under these circumstances it is not surprising that the colonies should frequently be exempted from the operation of treaties advantageous to Great Britain.
