GENTLEMEN: Having been personally requested, and requested also by a requisition signed by many thousands of you, to stand as a candidate for the Mayoralty of 1885, I have, after due consideration, agreed to do so.

My views upon the subject of municipal government are tolerably well known to many of you. As a large property holder, I have always done my utmost, in and out of the Council, to place the administration of the finances of the city upon a business-like basis, and gratifying progress during the past four years. This has necessarily involved extensive local improvements, such as new pavements, new sewers, and new water works, and has carried out enterprises not strictly required by present wants, and I fear that unless these improvements are summarily checked, the city will be loaded with a heavy and oppressive burden of debt, and that the welfare of the city will be thereby injured.

The consolidated debt of the city is not being reduced, although a large sum has been raised, while a very great addition has been made to the debt for local improvements, amounting to about one million two hundred thousand dollars, which, with expenditures under control, will bring it up to about two millions of dollars, for which the ratepayer is specially taxed over and above the ordinary rate. It seems to me, most clear and certain, that the present system of municipal government is not only inefficient, but is also a source of great expense to the city, and that the ratepayer is being unfairly taxed to support it.

I do not mean to say that the present system is entirely to be discarded, but I do mean to say that it should be reformed, and that the ratepayer should be able to elect a mayor and council who will be able to manage the city's affairs in a business-like and economical manner.
