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**STANDING RULES  
FOR THE  
CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT  
OF THE  
NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY.**

I.—This Society shall be called "THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

II.—The Officers of this Society shall consist of a Patron, a President, and Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and a Secretary; or Secretaries, with a Committee of Management of Sixteen Members, of whom the four senior shall retire every year. Five Members shall constitute a quorum. No person shall be re-elected to serve on the Committee until the expiration of a year from the date of his retirement.

III.—His Excellency the Governor for the time being, shall be requested to accept the Office of Patron; the Lord Bishop shall be President; the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; and all the Officers of the Society, with the Clergy of the Church resident in St. John's, *ex-officio* members of the Committee:—the rest of the Clergy of the Church throughout the Colony honorary members of the same.

IV.—All persons paying the annual sum of Ten Shillings currency shall be members of the Society, with power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

V.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the funds, to the furtherance of the Gospel in this Island, under the recommendation and sanction of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese;—the objects to which such appropriation shall be made, being the following:—1st, the maintenance of the Clergy; 2nd, the erection or enlargement of Churches, Parsonages, and School-rooms. 3rd, the supply of Bibles, Prayer Books, School Books, and Religious Works and Tracts.

**V.**—The Committee shall meet on the first Monday in every Month.

**VII.**—The Committee shall appoint each year, three of their members to audit the Treasurer's account.

**VIII.**—A Monthly Meeting of the Society shall be held on the second Wednesday in every Month, at 7 o'clock; and a General Annual Meeting on the second Wednesday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint.

**IX.**—No existing law shall be repealed or altered, or any new Rule established except at a General Meeting—the proposed change having been first recommended by the Committee, and approved by the President.

**X.**—All Meetings shall be opened and closed with the Prayers recommended to be used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts.

**XI.**—The Members of the Church in every part of the Island shall be invited to co-operate, by forming Local Committees, under the direction of the Clergy, in each Mission or Parish.

**XII.**—The Treasurers of the Local Committee shall transmit to the General Treasurer in St. John's, the amount of the Collections made in their respective Districts.

## PROCEEDINGS

*At the Twelfth Anniversary of "THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY," held at St. John's, 8th June, 1853.*

*His Excellency the GOVERNOR, Patron, in the Chair.*

THE Report of the Committee, having been read by the Rev. G. M. JOHNSON, Secretary, and the Treasurer's Account, submitted,—It was

Proposed by the Hon. JAMES CROWDY, and seconded by F. K. HEPBURN, Esq.:—

1.—That the Report be received, adopted, and printed, with the Treasurer's Account, under the direction of the Secretary.

Proposed by the Rev. T. M. WOOD, and seconded by J. TUNBRIDGE, Esq.:—

2.—That this meeting desires to acknowledge with devout thankfulness the blessing of Almighty God, which has enabled this Society to prosecute its work with increased success since the last Anniversary Meeting.

Proposed by the Hon. C. F. BENNETT, and seconded by T ROW, Esq.:—

3.—That the Church Society records its sense of the great goodness of the Divine Head of the Church in having restored our beloved Bishop in safety to his Diocese; and earnestly prays that the same merciful Providence, which has so recently delivered him, may ever watch over and preserve his Lordship, in all future perils and dangers to which he may be exposed in fulfilling the duties of his high and sacred office.

Proposed by THOMAS BENNETT, Esq. and seconded by C. D. NEWMAN, Esq.:—

4.—That this Society has received accounts of the continued prosperity of the Church Societies existing in other Colonies with the greatest satisfaction, and would express its undiminished interest in their success wherever established.

Proposed by the Rev. J. C. GATHERCOLE, and seconded by CHARLES CROWDY, Esq.:

5.—That the thanks of the Newfoundland Church Society be given to the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop for his council and assistance, and to the Treasurer, Secretary and Committee, for their services during the past year; that the Rev. G. M. JOHNSON be requested to accept the office of Secretary and G. T. BROOKING, Esq., that of Treasurer; and that B. ROBINSON, T. ROW, JAMES BAYLY, W. H. MAKE, and W. BODEN, Esqrs., be appointed on the Committee in the place of those gentlemen who retire by rotation.

Proposed by the Ven. the ARCHDEACON, and seconded by BRYAN ROBINSON, Esq., Q. C.:—

6.—That the cordial thanks of this meeting be respectfully tendered to His Excellency the Governor, for having consented to become the Patron of, and a Subscriber to, this Society; and for his kindness in having presided on the present occasion.

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## ADDRESS OF THE GOVERNOR.

*My Lord, Ladies and Gentlemen,*


I have accepted the invitation, which I have had the honor to receive, to preside on this occasion, under a conviction of the inestimable value and social benefits of true religion, and that it is needful even for the temporal welfare of the people.

It is one of the designs of this Society, as His Lordship has just stated, to procure funds for the maintenance of the Clergy, the erection or enlargement of Churches, Parsonages and School-rooms, and the supply of Bibles, Prayer Books, School Books and Religious Tracts. These are laudable objects.

Here, where there is no legal provision for the support of public religion, the duty of making contributions for the maintenance of the open worship of Almighty God, devolves upon individuals. By such tributes we may evince our love and reverence towards Him from Whom we receive life and health, and to Whom we are indebted for every mercy that visits our earthly path ; and it is thus that, as a community, we may link ourselves to the things of Heaven.

It is a Divine Ordinance that they who preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel. Moderate as is the provision which circumstances permit to be made for the support of the Ministers of Religion in this climate which, although healthy, is still for a great portion of the year rugged, and thus increases their toil and adds to their claim upon our consideration ; yet, their duties remain the same, and the serious responsibility does not the less attach to them, of proclaiming in their heavenly purity, those evangelic truths which alone are effectual to diffuse regenerating life.

I will not detain the meeting from the business of the evening.



## R E P O R T .

THE first duty of the Committee of the NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY, on the occasion of celebrating their Twelfth Anniversary, is the pleasing one of inviting all its members to join them in praise and thanksgiving to Almighty God, for the blessing year by year vouchsafed, of increased success in the prosecution of their work and purpose, to the edification of His Church in this Diocese, and the glory of His great Name thereby, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

It is very gratifying to your Committee to observe that the soundness of the principles under which the Society has worked from the beginning, has received confirmation by the foundation of precisely similar associations, not only in the other Dioceses of North America, but also in Australia and other parts of the world. The Report of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, speaks thus favorably of such Societies, in allusion to the formation of a new one in the Diocese of Guiana : "The recent foundation of a Church Society in this Diocese, is an important and promising indication of vitality in the Church."

It is however a matter of regret to your Committee, that the meaning and objects of this Institution, after so long existence and such successful operation in almost all parts of the Island, are yet, in some places, but imperfectly understood and appreciated. They can indeed hardly hope to remove these misapprehensions as to the means by which the Clergy are supported, and how this association is intended to minister to that purpose, by any explanation they can give in the compass of a Report like the present, and they might content themselves with a simple reference to

the standing rules under which the Society is governed as sufficient. Your Committee will however offer a few words on this subject.

The Clergy do not receive any payment from the government either of this Colony or of the mother country. The only foreign assistance the Church in this Diocese receives towards their maintenance, is derived from the venerable and noble Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, which at an annual expense of more than £4000 stg. is at present contributing to the support of 35 Missionaries. Neither is that Institution endowed for this purpose by the British Government as some are led to suppose. The Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, is supported by the free-will offerings alone of the members of our Church; but with this great difference, that support is asked and given to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel to provide the ordinances of religion for the inhabitants of distant lands; while those who contribute to our own Church Society, are required to give for the maintenance of Clergy to minister to and for themselves and their children.— Again, be it understood and remembered, that the venerable Society is supported quite as much by the offerings of the poor, as is the Church Society of Newfoundland; and your Committee believe that they do not exaggerate, when they declare that these offerings to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel are in the main the contributions of the poor, to secure the ministrations of our Holy Church to persons in many instances far better able to provide for themselves. No true member of the Church, your Committee are assured, will refuse or be unwilling to assist in maintaining those who minister to him in spiritual things. Assistance is all that is asked though surely where there is ability to give it, a full and sufficient maintenance will not be begrimed.

Your Committee now proceed to submit a summary of the various topics usually brought forward at this Meeting.

They have still to lament, that owing to some causes they are not able to appreciate, many returns have not yet been received, which must necessarily to some extent render the

Report incomplete and unsatisfactory. Great inconvenience must always result while this cause of complaint exists, which can only be removed by promptness and punctuality on the part of the Clergy. The Committee would venture again to suggest, in order to render the Report as complete as possible, that the Returns should be regularly forwarded by the middle of May. The Returns, as far as they have been received by the Secretary, show an increase in the aggregate on those from the same missions last year of £240, and the whole amount paid into the Treasurer's hands during the past twelve months has been £1841, 17s. 4d.

The Treasurer's account will exhibit the state of the finances of the Society at this date. The balance in his hands, it is gratifying to observe, is larger than at the last annual meeting. To this account, which will be printed, your Committee beg to refer for a detailed statement of the manner in which they have appropriated the monies subscribers have committed to their trust.

Votes have been made under the recommendation of the Bishop as follows; to Clergymen £839 17s. 11d. ; towards the erection or repair of Churches £138 ; and of Parsonage Houses £73 ; besides a sum of £72 5s. 0d. for miscellaneous objects. In addition to these votes, there have been specially contributed, and expended in different localities without having been paid into the Treasurer's hands, and submitted to your Committee, the following amounts;—for Clergymen £152 12s. 4d. ; for Churches £70 ; for Parsonage Houses £105 17s. 0d ; and for other purposes £238 19s. 0d : making in all for Clergymen £992 10s. 3 ; for Churches £208 10s. 4d. ; for Parsonage Houses £178 17s. 0d ; and for miscellaneous objects £311 4s. 0d.

It will be seen from these statistics, that so far as accounts have been received, a sum total of £1691 1s. 7d. has been raised and expended within the Diocese for Church Society purposes during the last year. Were all the returns complete, no doubt the amount would be much larger.

Much difficulty has often been felt by the Committee

about making votes to Missions where there has been no Collection for this Society. They are sensible of, and appreciate the self-denial of many of the Clergy in making collections for, and spending money on, local objects, where often a collection might have been made for this Society, of which the Clergyman would have received the benefit himself; but while they would wish to afford all possible encouragement in these cases, they hope the Clergy will be assured of their sympathy where no assistance can be given, and that allowance will be made for the difficulty experienced.

The Committee desire to avail themselves of this opportunity of acknowledging the very handsome donation of £20 towards a Church in course of erection at Aqua Forte, by a widow lady residing in that place.

They would also mention, at the suggestion of the Bishop, in terms of grateful acknowledgment, that the very munificent sum of £250 stg., on his Lordship's representation, was at once placed at his disposal by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, to aid in the work of building Churches in this Diocese. By means of this amount, the Bishop has been enabled to render very opportune assistance to several Churches which are now being built in different Missions.

The same Society has also very generously voted £50 stg. to furnish parochial lending Libraries, to be distributed as the Bishop shall consider best; the only condition attached to this benefaction being, that the people for whose use they are intended, shall pay for each set of £10 value, not less than £5.

While on the subject of gifts and benefactions, the Committee are of opinion that it cannot be out of place to speak of the noble bequest of the late Chief Justice CHIPMAN of New Brunswick, who was lately left to the Church Society of that Diocese, the valuable legacy of "£10,000, the annual income and product thereof to be expended and applied to the support and promotion of the Missionary objects of the Society." The Report of the New Brunswick Church Society thus speaks of the pious testator. "The Society is this year called to mourn

over the departure of one of its earliest and most steadfast friends. Wheresoever its members meet, or its funds are expended, the name of the Honorable WARD CHIPMAN, late Chief Justice of New Brunswick, will be cherished with gratitude. Ever one of the most generous contributors to the Society, by his large bequest to further its objects, we see how one of unquestioned piety and sound judgment estimated the work in which we are engaged."

Your Committee have already so fully expressed their opinion on the system of Education now sanctioned by the Legislature, as to make it unnecessary to speak of it now. They look for a favourable change after another year.— To those members of the Legislature who have supported a system of Education favorable to the spiritual interests of the children of the Church of England, your Committee desire to offer their best thanks.

It is gratifying to observe that the sales at the Depository of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge for 1852, have been larger than during the preceding year. There have been sold since the last Report 230 Bibles, 147 Testaments, 1123 Prayer Books, 496 other Bound Books, and 1744 Miscellaneous publications and Tracts. Your Committee would remind Out Harbor members of the Church that as our Diocesan alone, of right, bears the title of "Lord Bishop of Newfoundland," so there is but one Depository for supplying religious books under his Lordship's patronage, which is established at Mr. McCoubrey's in Water Street, and they would call attention to this Depôt as the best place for the purchase not only of Bibles, Prayer Books, and Testaments, but also of other Religious and useful Books. During the past year, Branch Depôts have been established at Bay Roberts, and Trinity for those Deaneries, and the Bishop has conveyed to the Committee the pleasing intelligence, that he hopes soon to establish a larger Depository at Mr. GODDEN'S in Harbor Grace.

Five Gentlemen have been admitted to Deacon's Orders since the Society's last meeting, and one beneficed Clergyman in Priest's Orders, has generously offered himself for the service of the Church on the uninviting shores of

Labrador. Your Committee have been pleased to learn that the Missionary and his family at Forteau, Labrador, have passed the winter in health and comfort, and that the Services of the Church have been observed with the greatest regularity.

The Office of Patron of this Society having become vacant by the removal of Sir GASPARD LE MARCHANT to the Government of Nova Scotia, it was accepted by His Excellency KER BAILLIE HAMILTON, Esq., immediately on his arrival. His Excellency received the Officers and Committee, who waited upon him with an address asking this honor in January last, very kindly; and has promised the Society his fullest support both pecuniarily and otherwise. Your Committee hail his presence and assistance here on this important occasion with the liveliest satisfaction, and a full sense of the honor conferred, and desire cordially to congratulate this meeting on this most auspicious circumstance, and to express the hope that this Society will continue thus to enjoy the countenance of His Excellency upon many future occasions.

A wish was expressed at the last meeting and seemed to be very generally concurred in by those present, that more particular intelligence respecting the missionary work carried on in the out harbours should be embodied in this Report. In compliance with this feeling a circular asking such information was addressed early in April to each Clergyman in the Diocese. Extracts, from such replies as have been received are given below.

#### St. John's.

The subjoined letter has been received from the Ven. Archdeacon Bridge:—

THE RECTORY,  
ST. JOHN'S, 30th MAY, 1853.

REV. AND DEAR SIR,

In reply to your application for some information respecting this Parish and Mission, I have great satisfaction in stating that there is reason to hope and believe, that the work of the Church has, under the Divine Blessing, prospered and progressed. The public services, both in the Cathedral and at Quidi Vidi, have been attended by numerous, and I trust, devout congregations. The aver-

age number of communicants has increased, at the monthly celebrations of the Lord's Supper, and on the great Festivals—particularly on Easter Day, was unusually large. The Sunday Schools have been in regular operation, and well attended, considering the sad prevalence of sickness amongst children during the winter; the answers of the scholars at the Catechising in the Cathedral, have shown, I venture to think, that the pains bestowed upon them by their teachers have not been in vain.

The number of sick and afflicted individuals and families who have been visited, has been considerable; and I humbly trust that those who under such circumstances have claimed and received attention, have been benefitted by our ministrations. Without entering into details, which it would not, in my opinion, be right to do, I feel thankful for the proofs which have been given, that the Lord is doing a gracious work among the people committed to my pastoral charge. To Him be all the glory.

### Bay Roberts.

A meeting was held of the Clergy of the Deanery of Conception Bay, on the 28th of October, being the Festival of St. Simon and St. Jude. At morning Service in the Church, a Sermon was preached on behalf of the Newfoundland Church Society, by the Rev. J. C. Harvey, of Port-de-Grave. The Clergy present, afterwards assembled at the Parsonage, and an opportunity was afforded, of mutual conference on the affairs of the Church, in that locality.

The proceedings of the day, concluded with a meeting in the School-room, the chief object of which was to explain the nature, and enforce the claims of the Church Society. Several of the inhabitants besides the Clergy spoke to the several resolutions, and the Rev. Mr. Blackmore, gave a useful and interesting account of the manner in which the contributions for the past year, subscribed towards completing the Parsonage, and painting the Church had been expended. The evening was very unpropitious, but the School-room was occupied long before the hour appointed with persons, many of whom had come from distant parts of the Mission. All seemed highly pleased, and though no direct appeal was made for contributions at the meeting "it is gratifying," says Mr. Blackmore, "to be able to add, that several offerings to the Church Society, were voluntarily sent to me the day after the meeting by persons who had not subscribed before."

### Island Cove.

The Rev. Mr. Walsh writes, "The scheme of the Newfoundland Church Society, is, I believe perfectly satisfactory to my people, except that in some instances they cannot afford to pay at the rate of 5s. per head. I trust that the increase of subscriptions is the best proof of its being approved of by the people. If they are prospered in their occupation and calling in my Mission, I may in time reach £60 instead of £40, which I expect my collection this year will amount to." The Rev. Mr. Walsh has since made up his collection, to more than £45, whereas the most ever collected before has been only £18 12s. 9d.

### Heart's Content.

The following is an extract from the Rev. Mr. Lind's letter to the Secretary of your Society. "You will be glad to hear that the people in this Mission manifest an increasing desire for the services of our Church. If I had an assistant, he would not only strengthen my hands very materially, but would add to the comfort and improvement of my flock. In New Perlican, a new Church is commenced, but owing to the poverty of the inhabitants it is not finished, and I fear if left to them it never will be completed. They do, however, from time to time give some small donations to that object. The old building is in so bad a state that it is almost unsafe to hold service in it."

### Trinity.

The Annual Report of the Trinity Branch of this Society, speaks of the probable completion of a Church at Trouty in this Mission, in the course of the summer. Mention is also made of the progress of two other Churches in Bonaventure and British Harbor. These three Churches in this Mission alone, are being added to the number already existing. These have each received votes from this Society. The following favorable testimony is also borne to the working both of the Parent Society and its Branch Association at Trinity. "Your Committee in particular at this time invite attention to the great benefits conferred on this Island at large, through the instrumentality of the Church Society, in increasing the number of the Clergy, and extending their services along the shores of this Colony. And they regard the efforts made by this Branch in an important light, for securing to the congregation of St. Paul's in Trinity, the constant services of men in Holy Orders, and for more efficiently ministering, serving, and directing in Spiritual things in the adjacent settlements. They would also note a further benefit conferred on this Mission, during the past year in the formation of a Depôt of Bibles, Prayer Books, Testaments, and various sound Religious Works from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge."

### Greenspond.

The Rev. Mr. Moreton writes, "I was seriously hindered in making any collection last fall by long illness, which obliged me to be absent from my mission at the time proper for this duty. This, however, I believe, has enabled me to judge only the more truly of the present working of the system of the Church Society in this place. Though under the great disadvantage of beginning in December, I have found far less difficulty, my collection has been made with less labour, and has cost me very much less explanation and persuasion, than usual, many persons brought me their contributions unasked, and I think that the fact that my collection made under such circumstances, rather exceeds than falls short of the amount in previous years, when it was chiefly made in September and October, proves that the principle is better understood and the duty more recognised." In another part of his letter Mr. Moreton adds, "I believe I am speaking very moderately, when I say that were one clergyman equal to the labour of making the collection properly, my mission would in the past year have yielded double the amount returned. The unwieldiness of the mission impedes this work as much as it does other duties."

Mr. Moreton also speaks of the difficulty of reaching young men who are servants or sharemen, who being almost without expense can best afford to give. He says, "opportunities can rarely be found of speaking to them, and unless it be exactly at the time of settling, it is almost useless to attempt a collection amongst them." "Yet I think" continues Mr. Moreton, "they are not to be supposed generally less willing to contribute than others. The only sure method of obtaining their contributions is by getting the master of each crew to collect from his men at the time of settling."

### Harbor Buffet, Placentia Fay.

Very interesting accounts have been received in the course of last year, of the self-denying exertions of the poor people at Oderin in this Mission, to secure to themselves a Church. These are the more gratifying as there is no Clergyman resident there. Mr. White the Missionary is at Harbor Buffet, distant forty miles, and only able to pay an occasional visit. Thirty-four men gave labour in the month of October last, amounting to 377 days, and 18,500 shingles; some contributing both labour and material, and others who had nothing else to give, willingly their time, strength, and skill. And all this was done, let it be observed, over and above their usual payments to the funds of this Society. Surely these efforts are an evidence of the readiness of the men to make sacrifices on behalf of their Church. Mr. White reports in a subsequent letter that the number of communicants, which at the Bishop's visitation in 1851 was 15, had increased at Christmas last to 26, and at Easter to 33. And that

at Spencer's Cove where there were none in 1831, there were 13 last Easter. He adds further, that the subscribers to the Church Society, who numbered in Harbour Buffet, the place of his residence, 26 in 1831, were 52 in 1832.

### **Hermitage Cove.**

(DEANERY OF FORTUNE BAY.)

Accounts have been received of the building of a new church in this place. Materials for this purpose have been sent from England, and the Church, which will be of brick, will it is hoped be a great comfort and blessing, as the inhabitants have hitherto had no building for Divine worship either in Hermitage Cove or within a considerable distance.

From more than half the Missions your Committee regret to say no such reports as those from which the above extracts are made have been received. They would earnestly invite the Clergy to communicate any such, or other intelligence to their Secretary before the time comes round for another general meeting, or whenever they may have it in their power to furnish it. They always receive with interest any communication respecting either the advancement of the Church in general or the prosperity of this Society.

Thus has this Society your Committee trust been truly blessed in working out its intention and purpose. Abundant proof is believed to have been shewn that the blessing of God is with us in our sacred work. May He, without whose assistance nothing is strong, nothing is holy, ever vouchsafe His strengthening support, that the Newfoundland Church Society may flourish and prosper continually, and may the Church in this Diocese always increase and grow, that she may (as she will, if faithful to God, her duty and obligation) be the blessed instrument of bringing many souls to righteousness, through Jesus Christ our Lord.






