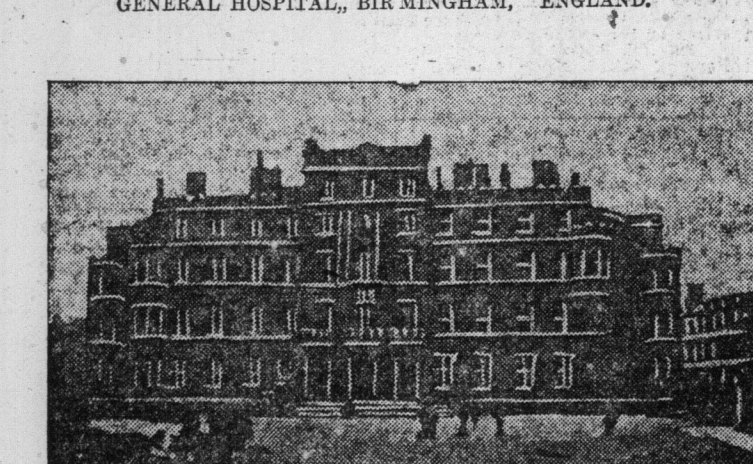
THE ROYAL INFIRMARY OF EDINBURGH.



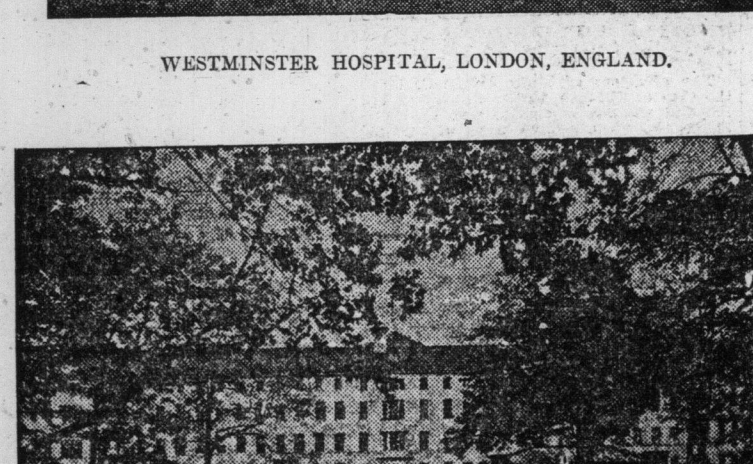
VIEW OF ST. THOMAS' HOSPITAL, LONDON, ENGLAND.



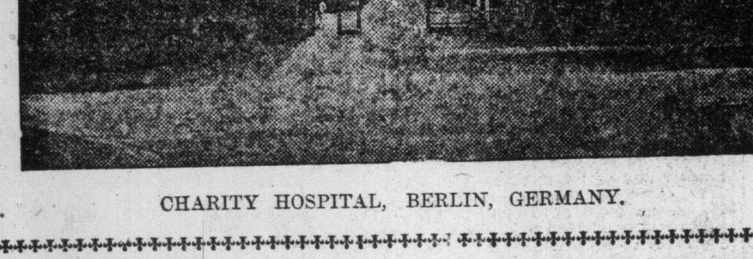

The combined number of beds in the hospitals named amount to 10,278, out of which 12,482 were occupied during Dr. Soper's visit. While in Berlin, Germany, Dr. Soper had the honor of being entertained by Professor H. Wislizenus of the Berlin University.

Through careful investigation Dr. Soper found that the greatest number of patients treated by any one hospital in Europe is by the London Hospital in 1899. In 1899 and 1900 20,000 Out-Patients were treated by the London Hospital in 1899, making a total of 202,872 patients treated in one year. This hospital is supported by voluntary contributions, and the passport for admissions is illness or injury.

An anonymous donor gave the London Hospital £22,000; and the income for 1899 amounted to £105,100.

Dr. Soper attended the inauguration of Rugby Hospital, Glasgow, by Her Royal Highness, Princess Christian, June 23, 1900. The doctor claims that this hospital will challenge comparison with any kindred institution in the world. It includes thirty-four distinct blocks of buildings, the principal of which are six-story pavilions for the reception of patients. Second in interest to the pavilions is the administration building, which has a frontage of 200 feet by 185 feet in depth. The entire cost of the Rugby Hospital is nearly £300,000.

DR. SOPER'S NATIONALITY.

Dr. Soper is a Canadian, was born in Oxford County, Ontario, April 30, 1852. He obtained his early education in the public schools of Canada, attended the Galt Collegiate Institute and entered the Trinity Medical School, Toronto, where he remained from 1877 to 1879.

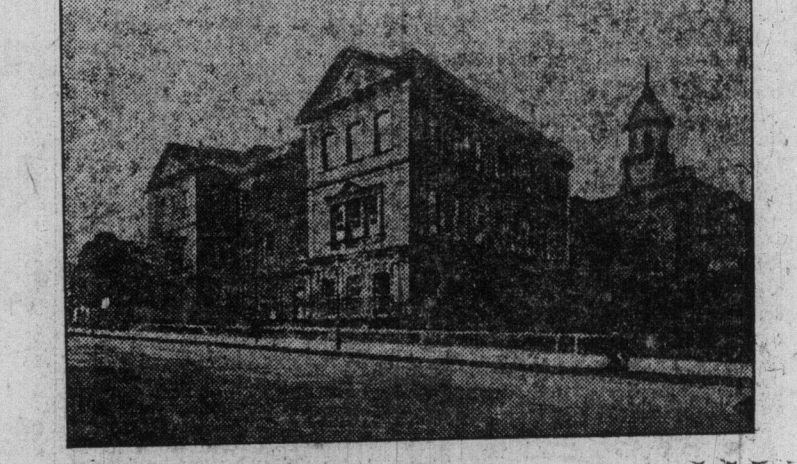

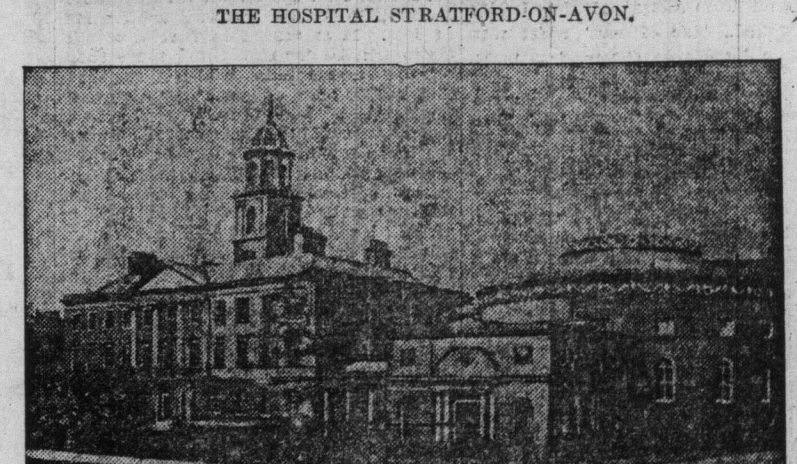

FORT WILLIAM'S PROGRESS
PROPERTY BOOM IS NOW

Immense Railway Development Means an Era of Industrial Activity for Gateway of West.

The Town of Fort William affords a most striking example of western progress. The population has doubled in two years and is now 8,000, and it is expected that in three years Fort William will have 25,000 people within her borders. This remarkable growth has passed through the elevators of the town, and its unexcelled railway and steamship facilities. It is the gateway to the great west, it is the spot of the hopper from which pours millions of bushels of grain grown on the western prairies, and a large proportion of which is transhipped there to be carried down the lakes to Georgian Bay points or to Cleveland, Buffalo, Kingston or Montreal. The facilities for handling this great crop are increasing from year to year. The elevator capacity of Fort William is 15,000,000 bushels and it is asserted that since the grain was cut 50,000,000 bushels have passed through the elevators of Fort William and have been carried on to seaboard towns.

Three transcontinental railways have terminals at Fort William, the Grand Trunk Lake Superior branch, the C.P.R. and the Canadian Northern, and these lines are spending millions in erecting elevators, tracks, freight houses and in laying new tracks.

Within the last few years real estate has advanced in value and it is expected that within two years it will further advance from 100 to 500 per cent, according to location.

A large piece of property immediately adjoining the Town of Fort William has been laid out in building lots, with a considerable section for warehouses and factories. This section is the connecting point of the three transcontinental railways and from this point the Canadian Northern, the Grand Trunk and the C.P.R. will carry the goods of the J. I. Case Company of Racine, Wis., has purchased a site for a large farm and implements factory, and a number of other large enterprises.
