# RUSSIAN CAV ALREADY BEATING THE JAPANESE

## Nine Thousand Horsemen Try to Cross the Hun River to Strike Oyama's Left, While Shells Hammer Centre.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 15.—The Russian cavalry has begun an extensive offensive movement against Field Marshal Oyama's extreme left. Last night they were attempting to cross the Hun River west of Liaoyang with 9,000 horsemen. The operation began west of Chaiyuan and simultaneously another cavalry force approached Tacha, which is situated 15 miles southwest of Chaiyuan and 27 miles west of Liaoyang. Nine thousand cavalry, with artillery, were ordered to cross the river at Tacha and attempted to cross at 6 o'clock in the evening, advancing on Heikotai (Peikowai). The shelling of Oyama's centre continues.

### FIRMS ALL DAY.

Mukden, Feb. 15.—The Japanese began a heavy cannonade Tuesday afternoon on the Hun River right in front of the Russian lines. The shelling continued all thru the day.

### RUSSIAN DRIVE JAPS.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 15.—Gen. Sakharoff telegraphs that the Russian cavalry has destroyed the buildings and walls of Nangang, from which the Japanese had been bombarding the Russian trenches. The Japanese were driven out. In regard to the attack on the bridge, Gen. Sakharoff says the Japanese force comprised 100 cavalry and 200 infantry. The Russian frontier guards drove off the attackers, who subsequently destroyed a few railroads and a bridge. The Russians were reinforced and pursued the Japanese 27 miles.

### ONE SHELL TOLD.

Russian headquarters, Hsiao Mountain, Manchuria, Feb. 15.—During the Japanese bombardment of Poutouff (Lonsai) Hill, the Japanese shells and one of the head of a lieutenant, and wounded a soldier. The Russian soldiers, who were playing cards in front of Koudsai on the right bank, the Russians are trying to get away from the entrenched siege and mortar batteries, with good results, firing as many as 20 mortars simultaneously.

### RUSSIAN RESOLVE.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 15.—The departure of Admiral Nikolagoff's division of auxiliary cruisers from Liaou yesterday reinforced Admiral Rojostevsky's command. It is not stated, but it is understood that the point of rendezvous for Rojostevsky is not the Indian Ocean, Admiral Rojostevsky has been ordered to proceed to the Indian Ocean, along the Hun River, where it is believed that a battle is likely to be opened within a short time.

### ALL UP WITH PARENT.

Majority House on His Grounds, But He Still Hangs On.  
Montreal, Feb. 15.—(Special.)—Majority House on his ground in over Mr. Parent's crucial meeting to be held here to-morrow. This would seem suicidal from a party standpoint, for, if Sir Louis Jetté should grant Mr. Parent an appointment, it would mean that he would no doubt run candidates in every county where the two factions are in evidence. The inventor, Mr. Langlois, the member for St. Louis, is managing affairs, making the following statement regarding the number of members in the legislature that has already promised to support Messrs. Gouin, Turgeon and Veir, in resigning from the cabinet: "We persist in maintaining that at the cabinet at the Chateau Frontenac 44 members declared their adherence to the government who have not yet been taken by these ministers. In addition, we state, in the most absolute manner, that at least six of these are expected to join the government within a few days ago and had not desired to pronounce themselves on the present crisis, have declared in the presence of witnesses that they would give their hearty support to the three members who had resigned. Fifty members out of 74 does not make a respectable majority, and as it is the government that rules in a democratic country we believe Hon. Mr. Parent will succumb to the wishes of the majority."

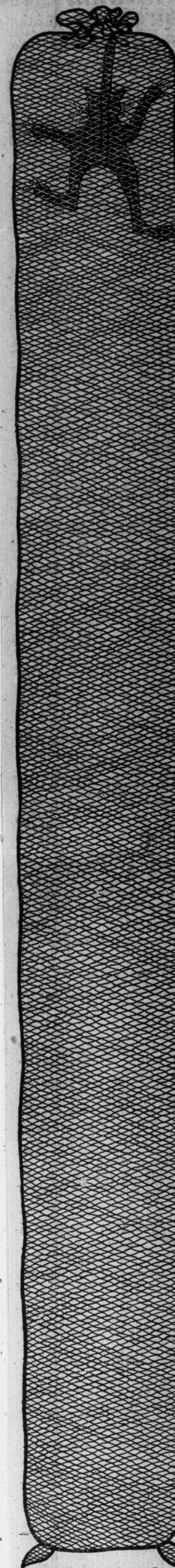
