### FIRST SEDERUNT.

At Charlottetown, and in Zion Church, on Tuesday, the second day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven years, at half past seven o'clock, p. m.:

The Synod of the Maritime Provinces, in connection with the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, met, and after an appropriate sermon, preached by Rev. Thomas Duncan, from 2 Cor. v. chap. 14th verse, "The love of Christ constraineth us," was constituted.

At the request of the Moderator, Rev. Dr. McGregor acted as Clerk, clerk, pro tempore, and read the following changes in the rolls of the respective Presbyteries, as reported by their clerks:

#### REMOVAL.

In accordance with the deliverance of the General Assembly, the name of the Congregation at Earltown and River John, formerly in connection with the late Synod of the Maritime Provinces, and which

had not entered the Union, and of the Rev. R. McCunn, Minister of the said Congregation of River John, were removed from the roll on October 5th, 1878.

Election of Moderator.

Proceeded to the choice of a new Moderator, when Rev. James Byers was chosen, and took the chair accordingly.

Stated Clerk.

Rev. Peter M. Morrison was then chosen clerk, in the room of Rev. A. Falconer, who had, since last meeting of Synod, left the Maritime Provinces, by call and appointment to the charge of the Presbyterian Congregation of Port of Spain, Trinidad. The Clerk's fee was fixed at fifty dollars per annum.

Business.

Com. of Bills & A Committee of Bills and Overtures consisting of Clerks of Presbyteries present, and the first elder on the roll of each Presbytery present, was appointed. Rev. John Forrest was appointed Convener.

Hours of meeting & adjournm't.

It was agreed that the hours of meeting and adjournment during the present Synodical Session shall be as follows: - Meet daily at 10 A.M. and adjourn at 1 P.M.; meet again at 3 P.M. and adjourn at half-past five; meet at half-past 7 P.M. and adjourn at half-past nine.

The Synod adjourned to meet in this place at 10 o'clock, to-morrow morning, of which public intimation was given, and the Sederunt was closed with the Benediction.

#### SECOND SEDERUNT.

In the same place at 10 o'clock, Wednesday morning.

The Synod met, pursuant to adjournment, and was constituted by the Moderator.

An hour was spent in devotional exercises.

The Minutes of the First Sederunt were read and sustained.

Mr. Thomas Sedgewick presented the report of the Business Report of Business Com. Committee. It was received, and the proposed order of business adopted.

Mr. Maclean Sinclair gave notice of a motion for a Standing Com Notice for Com. mittee on Bills and Overtures and Business.

An application from the Building Committee of the Colchester Applicat'n anent Reform Club, to the trustees of the Seminary building in Truro, for information as to terms of rental or sale of said building was read. On motion, it was agreed that the paper just read be referred to the Board of Superintendence of the Theological Hall.

The application of Mr. Fitzpatrick, a Licentiate of the Presbyterian com. on Mr. Church in the U. S., to be received as a Probationer of this Church; Application. and referred by the General Assembly to this Synod, was entrusted to the following Committee, namely, Revs. Professor Currie, Dr. Burns, A. Maclean Sinclair, James Anderson, J. C. Burgess, Neil McKay, G. M. Grant and T. Sedgewick, ministers; and Messrs. Blanchard, J. Taylor, D. McDonald, Harrington, Gardener, Nicholson and Jones, elders.

The Dissent and Complaint of the Rev. John Murray, against the Dissent & Comfinding of the Presbytery of Sydney anent the application of John Murray. Certain Presbyterian inhabitants of Lingan and Victoria Mines to be placed under the care of the Session of Falmouth St. Church, Sydney, was taken up. The papers in the case were read as follows:-(1) The petition from Victoria Mines and that from Lingan. (2) The action of the Presbytery of Sydney thereanent. (3) Dissent and Complaint of Mr. Murray against the deliverance of the Presbytery. (4) The Reply of the Presbytery to Mr. Murray's Rossons; and a resolution appointing Messrs. David Drummond, Alex. Farquharson and D. McLennan to support the action of the Presbytery in the matter complained against. The parties were then cited to the bar of the Court. Mr. Murray appeared for himself and Mr. Farquharson for the Presbytery of Sydney. The complainant was first heard, then Mr. Farquharson as the representative of the Presbytery. While the complainant was speaking in reply, the hour of adjournment arrived, and the Synod adjourned accordingly, till three o'clock in the afternoon, of which public intimation was made, and the Sederunt was closed with the Benediction.

### THIRD SEDERUNT.

Same place and day, and at three o'clock in the afternoon.

The Synod met and was constituted by the Moderator.

The Minutes of the Second Sederunt were read and sustained.

Mr. J. Murray resumed his speech in reply to the Presbytery of Sydney; at the close of which questions were put to the parties, when, on motion, they were removed from the bar.

It was then moved by Mr. R. Murray and seconded by Mr. Houston,

"That the Synod appoint a committee to take the whole matter of this Dissent and plaint of Mr. Complaint into consideration, with power to confer with the parties, in order to suggest Murray. Some way of reaching a satisfactory settlement; said committee to report to-morrow

The vote having been taken, the amendment was adopted.

On motion the Synod then adjourned to meet at half-past seven in the evening, of which public intimation was made, and the Sederunt was closed with the Benediction.

#### FOURTH'SEDERUNT.

Same place and day, at half-past seven o'clock in the evening.

The Synod met, and was constituted by the Moderator.

The Minutes of the Third Sederunt were read and sustained.

Discussion on Mr. Murray's Complaint.

The business of the last Sederunt was resumed.

Mr. N. McKay moved, and Mr. Blackwood seconded,

Mr. N. McKay's Motion.

"That the Synod sustain the complaint, set aside the action of the Presbytery, grant the prayer of the petition, and remit to the Presbytery to place the stations of Lingan and Victoria Mines under the care of the Session of Falmouth St. Church, Sydney."

At this stage it was agreed that speakers in this case be restricted to Speakers limited to 10 minutes. ten minutes each.

Moved as a second amendment by Mr. Maclean Sinclair, seconded by Mr. Wm. Stuart,

"That the Synod, waiving the question of dismissing or sustaining the complaint, A. Sinclair's resolve to remit the whole subject to the Presbytery of Sydney; and would recommend them to consider whether the stations in question could be united with the Congregation of Glace Bay."

Moved as a third amendment, by Mr. Goodfellow, seconded by Mr. McNeil,

"That the Synod sustain the complaint; and inasmuch as the Presbytery, when P. Goodfellow's erecting the stations of Lingan, &c., did not take the usual and proper steps to ascertain the condition of those districts, and the wishes of the people in regard to supply, remit the matter to the Presbytery, instructing them, by deputation or otherwise, to meet as soon as possible with the people for consultation; and, if it shall appear that there is a general wish to be placed under the charge of the Session of the Falmouth St. Church, Sydney, that the Presbytery so order it in the meantime, and until they indicate a desire for more supply than Mr. Murray may be able to afford."

Moved as a fourth amendment by Mr. John McKinnon, and seconded by Mr. Melville,

"That, waiving the question of sustaining or dismissing the complaint, the Synod, J. considering the present depressed state of business at Lingan and Victoria Mines, and the deficiency of laborers in the Home Mission field, would remit the whole matter to Sydney Presbytery, with the expression of its mind that, in these circumstances, it sydney Presbytery, with the expression of its mind that, in these circumstances, would be advisable, in the meantime, to grant the people of these Mines their petition, would be advisable, in the meantime, to grant the people of these Mines their petition, with the understanding that, should business revive and the population increase, they shall be organized into a separate mission charge; and direct the Presbytery accordingly."

The vote was then taken, when the third amendment was carried vote on Motions against the fourth by 53 to to 21, against the second by 61 to 13, against Complaint. the first by 65 to 12, and against the original motion by 69 to 2.

. McKinnon's Amendment.

The yeas and nays having been called for on the third, or Mr. Goodfellow's amendment, it was carried by a large majority, and became the judgment of the House.

From this judgment Messrs. R. Murray, G. M. Grant and Thomas Dissent entered. Sedgewick entered their dissent. Mr. A. Farquharson, in the name of Protest & Appeal the Presbytery of Sydney, protested and appealed to the next General of Mr. Farquharson.

On motion, the report was received and its recommendation adopted.

Next meeting of Synod.

The Synod proceeded to appoint the time and place of next meeting. It was moved and seconded that the place be Prince St. Church, Pictou: in amendment, St. Paul's Church, Fredericton. On a division, the motion was carried, and the Moderator declared accordingly.

It was moved and seconded that the time be in the Spring: in amendment the Autumn.

A vote having been taken, the amendment was carried, and the Moderator so pronounced.

The date was then fixed on the first Tuesday of October, A. D. 1878, and at half-past seven o'clock in the evening.

Com. on Obituary notices.

Dr. McGregor moved for the appointment of a committee to prepare obituary notices of members of Synod, deceased since last meeting. The motion was seconded and passed, and the following Committee appointed, namely, Dr. McGregor, Dr. Patterson and Mr. J. McKinnon, -Mr. McKinnon, Convener.

A Reference from the Committee of the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Reference from Com. on Aged Ministers' F'd. ed Fund was read. In it the Committee call the attention of the the Synod to the low state of the Fund; and, looking on the regulations passed by the General Assembly for its future management as unsatisfactory, ask the Synod to consider the same; and, if it see fit, overture the General Assembly for the changes it may deem desirable.

The Reference was supported by Dr. Patterson and A. Maclean Sinclair.

In regard to the first part of the Reference, on motion of Dr. Burns, seconded by Mr. Millar, it was unanimously resolved,

Aged and Infirm "That this Synod express increased interest in the Aged and Infirm Ministers' Ministers's F'd Fund; and, inasmuch as there is a deficiency of one thousand dollars, for the present commended to year, strongly recommend this important scheme of our Church to the sympathy of all fiberality, of our congregations." ## REASONS OF APPEAL.

1. Because the Presbytery of Sydney, in taking charge of, and grouping these stations, acted in accordance with their constitutional rights, and with the instructions

2. Answer to Reason 2nd:—(1) In reply to the statement "it was not shown that the Presbytery acted unwisely," the Synod has already given its judgment by a vote of 65 to 12; (2) The representative of the Presbytery never professed that the steps directed by the Church to be taken in such cases, had been taken, but candidly confessed that they had not been taken; and (3) The Synod feel that the true way to strengthen the authority of a Presbytery is to convince the people that the Synod exercises such a supervision over all Presbyteries, that the rights of all parties, whether weak or strong, shall be carefully guarded.

3, Answer to No. 3:—Without discussing the accuracy of the theory stated, the Synod are convinced that neither the facts of the case as brought out in the evidence, nor the circumstances of the Church as regards our destitution of laborers and funds, warrant its being carried into effect in the present case; besides, neither the distances, nor the extent of Mr. Murray's charge preclude his giving adequate present supply to these stations, as he has an undoubted constitutional right to do (see Blue Book, chap. 1, sec. 1, 5). Should the necessities of these sections call for more supply in the future,

provision is made for that contingency in the last clause of the decision appealed against.

4. Answer to No. 4:—Whenever the number of laborers in the employment of Synod shall in any measure come up to the necessities of the Church, we feel this reason may have some force, and perhaps the Synod may then see fit to offer a reply.

## In Memoriam.

## THE REV. JAMES BAYNE, D. D.,

was born at Dunbar, Scotland, in December, 1815. He passed through the curriculum of arts at the University of Edinburgh, and studied theology at the United Secession Hall. Being led by circumstances to Nova Scotia, he was there licensed to preach the Gospel, and on October 6th, 1842, ordained to the collegiate charge of the congregation of Londonderry, N. S., where he laboured till the year 1851, when he became pastor of the congregation of Prince St., Pictou, where he labored till his doath.

During his pastorate in these important congregations the Lord blessed his labours, and souls were added to the Lord. During the whole period of his connexion with the Church in these Provinces, he was deeply interested in all her work, and was actively employed in her various measures for the promotion of God's cause. In particular he was a member of the Foreign Mission Board for 32 years, and its Secretary for 20 years. Personally he was a man of genial spirit, kindness of heart and genuine piety, and died in the faith and hope of the Gospel which he had so long preached.

## THE REV. JOHN MUNRO

came out to this country as a student of the Free Church of Scotland, in the year 1846, was licensed by the Presbytery of Halifax, and after laboring for some time he was ordained and inducted by the Free Church Presbytery of Pictou in 1847, into the pastoral charge of the extensive and scattered congregation of Wallace. Pugwash and the Cove. In this charge his pastorate was largely of a missionary character. For 30 years he laboured in this field with unwearied diligence and success. As a member of the Church Courts he was attentive to business and kind and courteous to his brethren. He was zealous in the cause of truth, and most unwearied and successful in his Master's service.

### THE REV. JAMES ROSS

came to this country in the year 1851 as a Licentiate of the Free Church of Scotland, and laboured with much acceptance for a considerable time within the bounds of the Free Church Presbytery of Pictou. Thereafter he laboured in the Island of Cape Breton, and was ordained and inducted into the pastoral charge of Grand River congregation where he laboured with much diligence and success during the period of 23 years, or until the time of his death. Mr. Ross was a regular attendant in the Courts of the Church, took an active part in their proceedings, and by his amiable and straightforward character, endeared himself to his brethren in the ministry.

The Synod would express its sympathy with the widow's or the departed brethren, in their bereavement, and with the congregations left vacant.
