I. N. COMPANY IN LIQUIDATION

Meeting of Company Called for March 16th to Consider Matter.

THE CAUSE.

The Intercontinental Navigation Company will go into voluntary liquidation at an early date. This is the outlook at the present time.

The Intercontinental Navigation Company was organized to place an up-to-date steamer on the Campbellton-Gaspe route. Its members are all Bay Chaleur people. The steamer Lady Ellen was purchased, and the route successfully until last season, when she was wrecked at New Port Island. This was a severe blow to the company, and as the vessel was a complete loss it was felt best to withdraw from the field.

A call to the stockholders has been issued to meet next Tuesday at Port Daniel to take up the matter of choosing a liquidator, and taking the necessary steps to wind up the company.

"CANADA" HAS LANDED GASPE CONTRACT.

Campbellton's Wishes Said to Have Been Ignored and Old Boat Put On.

THE OUTLOOK.

The Graphic learns on very good authority that the government has awarded the subsidy for the Campbellton-Gaspe service to the company which has recently purchased the steamer Canada, and that this steamer will perform the service this year.

The Canada is an old boat and at present has no first class accommodations for passengers, although the company has promised to contract for a new and better in good shape. She is a slow boat, with some of the modern conveniences, and it is said those who know that she is not suited for the route she is expected to serve.

Campbellton people will regret to hear that the Steamer is not to receive the subsidy but it may be that she is put on the route independently at least the busy part of the season. Every encouragement should be put out to the Thompson Company to put this steamer on, if only the tourist season of the year is made. It will mean thousands of dollars to Campbellton this season.

We may add that Messrs Reid and Gill did all in their power to have the contract go to the Steamer, but the contract is considered a Gaspe venture naturally. Mr. Lesieur wishes their influence, and we understand that strong pressure was brought to bear from interested parties in Gaspe.

TOWN COUNCIL HELD MEETING

Special Meeting Held Last Night When Delegates to Municipality Meeting Were Appointed.

OBJECTS OF UNION.

The Town Council held a short session last evening, the full board meeting. The finance, fire, police and water and sewerage committees reported on accounts and other matters referred to them at a previous meeting. Robert H. Ward was appointed a member of the finance committee to enter upon his duties on Monday.

Application from John White concerning an unfair assessment on land asking for a rebate was referred to the Committee on Assessments and Appeals. A resolution was adopted concerning the Town of Campbellton and the Union of New Brunswick Municipalities for the current year and the Mayor Murray Councillor Mowat were appointed to represent the Town at the meeting of the Union which will be held on Monday the 29th and 31st inst. P. Q. LEGISLATURE NOW IN SESSION. (Continued from page 3) been a source of revenue for the settlers of the province.

Up till last year the law compelled the settler who cut any merchantable lumber in the process of clearing his land to sell it to the limit holder from whom the lot had been taken.

Again there are many settlers and farmers in the province who have not sufficient wood to their lots for building purposes and for their fences, and we passed a law a few years ago giving the settler the right on producing a certificate to that effect, to go and cut on the crown domain what lumber he may need for his own personal use and if these lots are crown lands in the vicinity the right is extended to cutting the lumber in question of the limits.



P. Q. LEGISLATION NOW IN SESSION

Interesting Session of House Now Well Under Way—New Party and Leaders.

MR. KEELY'S SPEECH.

The Quebec Legislature that opened on Tuesday last with Sir Panteleone Pelletier and the new lieutenant governor, promises to be one of the most interesting since the days of confederation. The first night of its opening the house sat till past twelve o'clock and last night it was away in the small hours of the morning before the house adjourned. The presence of the new party, the Nationalists, having as its leaders Mr. Bourassa and Mr. Lavigne, and the presence of the new leader of the opposition Mr. Kelly, all tend to give an unusual atmosphere to the House, which it has not known for many years.

Mr. Bourassa and Mr. Lavigne have been holding meetings all over the province since the last few years make all kind of suggestions and it now remains whether they can be accepted as practical.

Mr. Bourassa and Mr. Lavigne profited of the first day of the opening of the Legislature to start the ball a rolling, and at every step they were met by the government which showed how their arguments could not stand when put into practice. Mr. Lavigne having made certain insinuations against Mr. Kelly member for Bonaventure, took up the programme of the Nationalistic party and clearly demonstrated the impossibility of accepting a single item of their programme.

Mr. Kelly's Address. Mr. Kelly, member for Bonaventure, then followed Mr. Lavigne and replied to the unjustified remarks that fell from the lips of the member of Montserrat. He recalled the fact that they had both been boys together at school and had the same bed together in the same office during several years. Knowing the ability as a speaker that Mr. Lavigne had displayed when a student, and after having passed four years in the House of Commons he had expected to hear from the honorable member the speech of a statesman with ideas worthy of the position he has occupied. On the contrary however the speech delivered by the honorable member is one of mere personalities against the men who took and nursed him in the cradle of his political life, and who had helped make him what he is. He did not contest the right of the honorable member to change his opinions as often as he chooses. He has changed them in the past, so has changed them today and he will change them tomorrow, according to the opportunity that presents itself, but while he has that right he should at least have a little respect for the men who differ from his views and who were instrumental in securing to him his first seat in political life. Taking up the question of the Territories or Colon Lands (referred to in the free settlers' speech) Mr. Kelly proposed that the territory should be given to the settlers and which means nothing. The proposition says that we should give the land to the settlers in one part of the province and the settlers in the other and keep them separated so that they may do as they please on their own points. That is a fine theory but how can it be put into practice under present circumstances. The land for the settlers are applying in many cases are lands that have already been sold in years gone by to the limit holders and on which the limit holders have their rights. The present system of selling crown lands was inaugurated about 1842, and in those days and up till recent years the various governments that have preceded the present one did not look to the question of settlement that was to take place in the future. And hence it is that we have the settler and the limit holder each claiming equal rights in many cases to the same land. If the honorable
