

That all Trade and Commerce hould be prohibited with the Colonies therein mentioned, and that all Ships and Cleffels of or belonging to the Inhabitants of the said Colonies, together with their Cargoes, Apparel, and Furniture, and all other Ships and Mellels whatsoever, together with their Cargoes, Apparel, and Furniture, which thould be found trading in any Port or Place of the faid Colonies, or going to trade, or coming from trading in any such Port or Place, hould become forfeited to his Wajelly, as if the same were the Ships and Effects of open Enemies, and thould be so ad= judged and taken in all Courts of Admiralty, and in all other Courts whatsoever: And whereas Clessels, Effects, Boods. oz Werchandize, belonging to Inhabi= tants of the faid Colonies, who were loyal Subjects to his Majesty, may have become forfeited, and may have been adjudged and condemned as lawful Pzize under the said Ad; be it enacted by the Authority afores faid, That it Hall and may be lawful to and for the Commissioners appointed by this Ad, to enquire into Lottes suctained in Consequence of the said Act, by any fuch Inhabitants, who have prefented or delivered Claims for such Losses to the said Commissioners, or any Two of them, and who thall give sufficient Proof, to the Satisfaction of the faid Commissioners, of their Lopalty to his Wajetty, and Attachment to the British Bovernment.
