

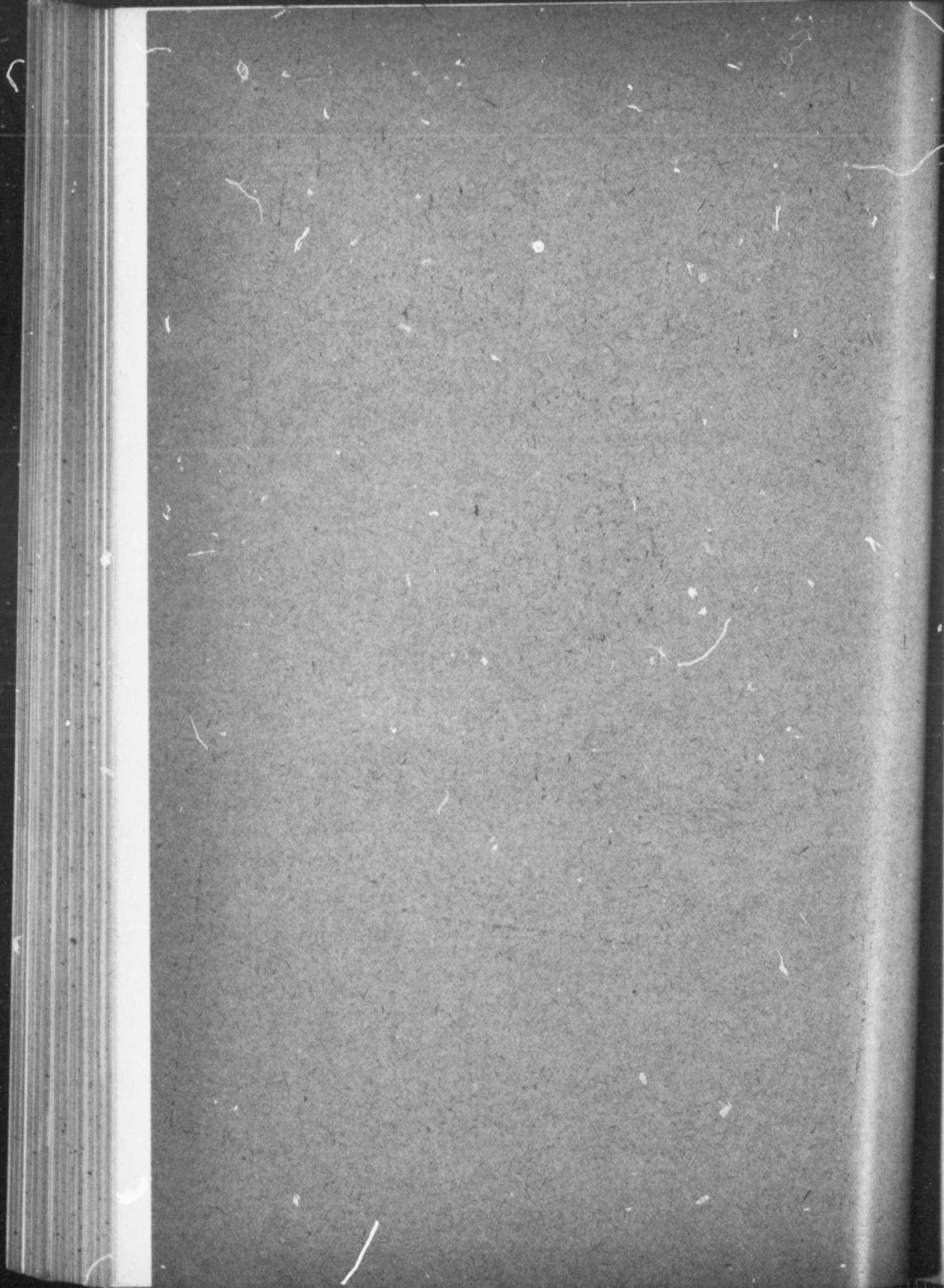

THE REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
Dominion of Canada Rifle Association,
1889

The Council has the honour to submit the Twenty-second Annual Report of the Proceedings of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, and at the same time to congratulate its members on a most successful year's work.

A reference to the report of the Commandant of the Wimbledon Team, shews that Canada's representatives achieved the object they were sent over to perform, namely, the winning of the Kolapore Cup, besides which, they won the very respectable sum of £430 sterling in money prizes.

The annual competition in September at the Rideau Range was the most largely attended meeting since the first held at Laprairie in the year 1868, and the range was tried to its utmost capacity, shewing that if the number of competitors continues to increase in future years as it has in the past, larger target accommodation will have to be provided or the matches will have to extend over a longer period.

This state of things leads the Council to hope that the supporters of the Association will continue their assistance, and enlist others in the good cause.

The thanks of the Association are due to His Excellency Lord Stanley of Preston, Governor General of the Dominion, for the deep interest he takes in the welfare of the Association, for his very liberal contribution to the funds thereof, and for his gift of Silver and Bronze Medals to Provincial Associations.

To the Government and Members of the House of Commons the thanks of the Association are also due for the liberal grant voted last Session.

To the Hon. Sir Adolphe P. Caron, K.C.M.G., Minister of Militia and Defence, the Association is indebted for presenting the Prizes won at the last Annual Matches and for the continued interest shown by him in its welfare.

To Lt.-Colonel the Hon. J. Alderic Ouimet, M. P., Chairman of Council, and Thomas C. Brainerd, Esq., President of the Hamilton Powder Company, the Association is indebted for the handsome subscription of one hundred dollars each.

To Mr. J. H. Steward, Optician to the Association, 406 Strand, London, England, for a handsome Clock ; and to the Canada Club of London, who again presented through the Secretary, Malcolm O. Sim, Esq., a valuable Silver Cup, to the Member of the Wimbledon Team making highest aggregate score, the thanks of the Association are also due. The Cup was won by Qr.-Mr.-Sergeant John Ogg, 1st Brigade Field Artillery.

The Council have very much pleasure in recording the fact that the Imperial Army and Navy were represented at the Annual Matches by ten competitors from the Duke of Wellington's Regiment, under Captain French, and five from H. M. Ship Bellerophon, under Lieut. Murray. Their presence amongst the Militia of the Country was thoroughly appreciated, and it is hoped that this visit will be the first of a series of regular annual visits.

The attendance of competitors still continues to increase year by year, but the increase this year is greater than usual, as shown by the records of the last six years.

The entries in 1888 numbered 7536, whereas in 1889 they numbered 9413, an increase for the year of 1877 entries.

The present lease of the Rideau Range expires in May next, and no time should be lost in renewing the lease or finding other ground, as, if the shooting continues to increase, the accommodation must be enlarged, or more time would be taken up by the matches than many of the competitors could afford to lose. An extension of the present lease for a term of years would be most desirable, as no ground can be found so conveniently situated, and ten more targets will be sufficient to accommodate all comers for a few years to come.

The presentation of prizes was held in the Rideau Skating Rink, kindly lent by the President and Directors for the purpose. The Hon. Sir Adolphe Caron, K.C.M.G., Minister of Militia and Defence, was good enough to present the prizes, assisted by General Sir Fred. and Lady Middleton. The attendance of the public was large, but the attendance of prize winners was hardly what it should have been.

The Minutes of the Competitors' Meeting, held on Tuesday evening, 3rd Sept., will be found at the end of the Report; it was largely attended.

The Council with deep sorrow has to announce the loss of one of its members by the death of Lt.-Colonel McKinlay, of Halifax, for years Vice-President for the Province of Nova Scotia, and always a strong supporter of the Association.

Before closing this part of the Report, the Council has great pleasure in thanking the Executive Officer, Lt.-Col. Maunsell, D.A.G., and the Staff generally, for their strong support in carrying out the matches so successfully. The meeting being the largest on record since the first the capacity of the Range was tested to the utmost, and unless all had worked well, such a meeting could not have been carried through in the time allotted.

FINANCE.

The Treasurer's Statement of the finances of the Association, duly audited, is submitted herewith.

Receipts from all sources for the year amounted to \$18,710.12, which, with the balance of \$2,443.08 brought forward from last year, make a total of \$21,153.20 to the credit of the Association.

The expenditure amounted to \$18,860.86, showing a balance of \$2,292.34 in favor of the Association at the end of the year.

The affiliation fees from Rifle Associations—including \$66.00, the value of 22 Bronze Medals issued,—amounted to \$879.00 as against \$873.00 received in 1888.

The number of affiliating Rifle Associations this year was 58, as against 63 in 1888, a decrease of 5 Rifle Associations.

The Assiniboia Rifle Association, N. W. Territories, affiliated this year as a Provincial Association in place of the Moosomin Association.

The annual subscriptions for the past year amounted to \$322.00, as against \$300 in 1888, an increase of \$22.00. It is still a subject for regret that a larger number of persons does not join the Association, the annual subscription being only \$2.00.

The amount received from Associate Members to qualify them for competition at the Annual Matches this year was \$351.00, as compared with \$287.00 in 1888, an increase of \$64.00.

The Receipts from Special Donations amounted to \$700.00, as against \$920.00 received last year, a decrease of \$220.00 under that head.

The Special Donations from Banks amounted to \$800.00, the same as last year.

The number of competitors at the Annual Prize Meeting was greater than the previous year, the net receipts from entry fees, including post entries and fines, and exclusive of the charge for ammunition, amounted to \$4,384.92, as against \$3,746.86 in 1888, an increase of \$638.06.

Receipts from the sale of ammunition this year amounted to \$1,161.90, as against \$1,071.02, an increase of \$90.88.

Cash Prizes and Badges amounted to \$7,423.39, as against \$7,206.57, an increase of \$216.73, as compared with last year, this includes an extra prize list of \$60 for a special match for the Army and Navy, represented by teams from H. M. Regular Forces stationed at Halifax.

The expenditure on account of the Wimbledon Team this year amounted to \$5,753.73, as against \$5,782.00 in 1888, a decrease of \$28.27.

A detailed statement of the expenditure made by Lt.-Colonel Bacon, Commanding Wimbledon Team of 1889, is also submitted and will be found in the appendix.

REPORT OF LIEUTENANT-COLONEL BACON.

Commanding Wimbledon Team 1889.

*Lt.-Colonel, Hon. Geo. A. Kirkpatrick, M.P., President Dominion of Canada
Rifle Association.*

OTTAWA 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1889.

SIR,—Having been honoured by the appointment to command the Canadian Wimbledon Team for 1889, I now beg leave to submit to you this report of their doings, which I hope will prove as satisfactory to you and the Council as they were pleasing to me.

I left Ottawa on Tuesday, the 18th June, and met the Ontario contingent, (with the exception of Major Sherwood who joined at Quebec, and one member of the 63rd from Halifax,) fourteen in all, at Montreal that afternoon. Having been inspected by Captain Hood, the adjutant, and found in every way properly equipped for the expedition, we went on board the Allan steamship "Parisian" the same evening, and sailed for Quebec at early morning, arriving about 1 p.m. Wednesday, where we were met by the remainder of the Team, all from the Maritime Provinces, with the exception of Major Sherwood.

We left Quebec about 9 o'clock Thursday morning, and after a very enjoyable and quick passage, arrived at Liverpool about 2 p.m. Friday, the 28th of June, where we were met by Mr. Ennis (Messrs. Allan Bro's., agent,) Mr. Dyke's assistant, and the agent of the London and North Western Railway Co. By the kind assistance of these gentlemen, and the courtesy shewn to the Team by the Customs authorities, we were enabled to push on, in cars especially provided for us, to Cambridge, where we arrived about $\frac{1}{2}$ past 11 p.m., too late to go into Camp that night, so found quarters at the Lion Hotel, where we were made very comfortable.

Next morning after breakfast we moved into the Camp on the University Rifle range, where, thanks to the kindness of Lt.-Colonel Roberts, Commanding Cambridge University Vol. Rifles, and his Adjutant, Major Riddell, we found everything ready for us; the caterer, Mr. Arpin, caretaker of the range, provided excellent meals and gave very general satisfaction.

On Monday, rifle practice was commenced, and was carried on steadily and systematically throughout the week. I sent Captain Hood to London to complete the entries for the team, and to make arrangements with the several contractors for the usual conveniences required at Wimbledon. The practice at Cambridge was most satisfactory, the scoring being exceptionally high.

Whilst at Cambridge, we fired a match at Queen's Ranges, 7 rounds each, with the Cambridge Town Corps, ten men a side, and had the satisfaction of winning by 101 points, with an average of $90\frac{1}{2}$ per man; and the next day the

same team of ten men made within a very small fraction of 92 per man. Such splendid practice augured well for Wimbledon, and put the members of the team in good spirits. The weather during the week's practice was too fine, there was but one change of wind, and the light was almost invariably the same.

I have to thank Colonel Roberts and Mr. A. P. Humphrey, and other members of the University, for the kindness and hospitality shown to us during our stay in Cambridge, which we left on Saturday morning in the same cars which had brought us from Liverpool, and were conveyed to Putney without change the same afternoon, and went directly into camp at Wimbledon.

On Monday, the 8th July, the work of the team commenced in earnest. In the "Alexandria" Match, the first on the programme, we had eight prize-winners, a very good commencement, and the team won at least one prize in every competition for which they entered.

In the "Windmill," Quarter-Master Sergeant Ogg won first prize, £25; besides which, he was the winner of the Corporation of London Silver Cup, value £30, and the handsome Silver Cup annually given by the Canada Club, which the Secretary, Mr. Malcolm O. Sim, was good enough to bring down to our camp, accompanied by the Hon. O. Mowat and other members of the club. Mr. Mowat, in a very appropriate speech, presented the cup to the winner.

In the third stage of the "Queen's," Staff Sergeant Ogg and Private J. A. Armstrong, G. G. F. G., were respectively twenty-ninth and thirtieth, winning £12 and badge. In the "St. George's," Captain S. Maynard Rogers, 43rd Bn. and Major B. A. Weston, 66th Bn., won £9 and badge each, and in the Grand Aggregate, Staff-Sergeant Ogg, 1st Brigade Field Artillery, Guelph, was sixteenth, winning £5 and bronze cross.

On Wednesday morning, the 17th July, the event of the meeting, so far as Canadians were concerned, was to be decided, namely, the competition for the Rajah of Kolapore Cups. Much interest was manifested in it, the Mother Country team was looked upon as exceptionally good, but at the conclusion of the match was found to be not quite good enough, for after a very close competition, the Canadians were the winners by three points. The match depended on the last shot of the Mother Country team, which was fired by Private Wattleworth, who only made an outer. The description of the match published in the London *Times* of the 18th, is so true, that I cannot do better than quote it, premising that during the firing at 600 yards, a thunder storm and heavy rain prevailed, so much so that for a time the targets were quite invisible.

Extract from *Times*, 18th July, 1889:—"In the morning came the competition for the Kolapore Cups, shorn of much of its interest by the fact that the supply of competitors from the colonies and dependencies of the Empire was lamentably small. Only the two Channel Island teams and the Canadians appeared to contest with the Mother Country the honour of holding the cup, and those who looked down the list of men in the team representing the Mother Country, and remembered what each man had done and what his reputation for steadiness was, were for the most part of opinion that none of their rivals had a chance of succeeding. On the other hand, it was worthy of recollection that the Canadians had been shooting together as a team exceedingly well, and those who looked back to their performances in the early stage of the Queen's Prize, which have already been noticed, might be excused for thinking well of their chances. The shooting at 200 yards was very good; only a single man, Ingram, of the 3d Lanark, failed to make an average of inners, and the majority were two, three, or more points better; only a single man, the same who has already been named,

got less than an inner with any shot. At the end of the range there was very little to divide the competitors. Canada, with 245, led; then came the Mother Country with 242; then Guernsey with 239, and Jersey with a point less. At the next range the Canadians forged ahead rapidly, Ashall in particular shooting magnificently. They added eight more points to their lead over the Mother Country. Here Jersey shot fairly well, very well considering the small population from which their team is extracted, and Guernsey fell into the background. At 600 yards there was one conspicuous failure in the Canadian team, that of the veteran M'Vittie, who, after all his practice with the Martini, and all his experience of Wimbledon, could not put together more than 19. Meanwhile, the Englishmen were improving. Parry, who made 32 with a magpie, proclaimed himself the best individual shot of the four teams by thus raising his aggregate to 95; and Brown, Bates and Ingram all shot steadily and well. But the home team had lost too much ground and could not quite reach the Canadians, who won after a close and interesting contest by three points."

Many and hearty were the congratulations we received on our victory, and not the least hearty were those tendered to us by the teams who shot against us; I should not omit to mention here, the fact that Private J. A. Armstrong, G. G. F. G., who made the highest score on our Team, headed the scores of all the teams competing in 1884 when the Cups were last won by Canada. Before closing this subject, I would like to say, that this makes the fifth victory for Canada, and that the Cups were won by Canada, on the *first* and *last* occasion, when competed for at Wimbledon by a Team sent over under the auspices of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

Not long after the completion of the Match, I received by cable, the congratulations of the G. G. F. G., signed by Lt.-Colonel Tilton, and soon following it another cable from Sir Adolphe Caron congratulating the team on its "brilliant success." The next day came congratulations from His Excellency the Governor-General, Lord Stanley, and a cable from the Marquis of Lansdowne Viceroy of India, from Simla, worded "Well done Canada;" all these when read to the team were highly appreciated and cheered to the echo.

On Tuesday, the team was honoured by a visit from His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, Commander-in-Chief, who inspected them, and was pleased to praise their appearance and express the pleasure it gave him to again meet a representation from Canada; he recognised some of the members, as having met them before at Wimbledon, and said that he hoped to have the pleasure of meeting them again on other ground. On this occasion Sir Charles Tupper, Lord Wantage, Colonel Hon. H. F. Eaton, Comandant of the Camp, and Colonel Pemberton, His Royal Highness' Military Secretary, were present.

The Marquis of Lorne paid several visits to our camp and took great interest in our proceedings; he expressed the pleasure it gave him to see Canada again so well represented at Wimbledon.

Our camp was visited by many other distinguished individuals, amongst them Lady Knutsford, wife of the Colonial Minister; Lady Tupper, Lady Frere and daughters, Lord Fortescue, Sir Henry and Lady Fletcher, Bart., Admiral Purvis, Dr. Rae, Capt. E. St. John-Mildmay, Capt. Pixley, Major Waller, Colonel Wilson of Bannockburn, and many others; and amongst Canadians, Senator Gowan, The Mayor of Toronto, Hon. Mr. Mowat, Premier of Ontario; Mrs. Vance Graveley, Mr. Fred. Judah, Q. C., Montreal; Mr. Louis Foote, Quebec and many others.

I have to return thanks to Lord Wantage and the Staff of the National Rifle Association for the courtesy shewn to myself and team; nothing could exceed the consideration we received,

To Major Alexander and the officers of the London Scottish we owe a debt hard to pay, their mess was open to us all the time, and we were not slow in availing ourselves of its privileges. We were also made members of the other messes in camp, of which we made use as occasion offered, and I have on the part of the team to express our gratitude for the kindness shewn to us on all sides.

The presentation of prizes at Wimbledon is an imposing ceremony and is visited by a very large concourse, the Canadian Team received an ovation when marching up to receive the Kolapore Cups, "Well done Canada" was heard over and over again amidst cheers, and individual members were also much cheered on going up to receive their prizes.

And now it is my pleasing duty to record my appreciation of the bearing of the team I had the honour to command; nothing I can say will adequately express my appreciation of their conduct; from first to last it was unexceptionable, and made the trip one of the happiest episodes of my life.

To Captain Hood, my efficient Adjutant, I have to give my thanks for the excellent way in which he performed the duties pertaining to his office, the actual work of coaching the team by him, left me very little more to do than watch the shooting, and attend to the many visitors who honoured us with their presence in camp.

Before closing, I would like to mention a matter which struck me forcibly as of importance to the success of future teams going to England; that is, the squadding of our men for the various matches. It was quite evident to me, that although we were not charged post entry fees, we were squadded with the post entries, and this leads me to say that the entries for the Canadian Team should be made some time in April, so as to insure us a better chance of favourable squadding than we have now; I am promised by Mr. Rook, the Secretary's able assistant, that a copy of the prize list for next year shall be sent out to me at the earliest possible day, so as to give us time to make the entries at the time I suggest.

I must not forget to thank Private Armstrong, who volunteered to undertake the duties of Quarter Master Sergeant, for the very efficient manner in which he performed those duties; he was unremitting in the work, and saved the rest of the team much anxiety as to the safety of their baggage, thus rendering them very great service.

I submit herewith the accounts of receipts and expenditure, which I hope will prove satisfactory to you and the Council.

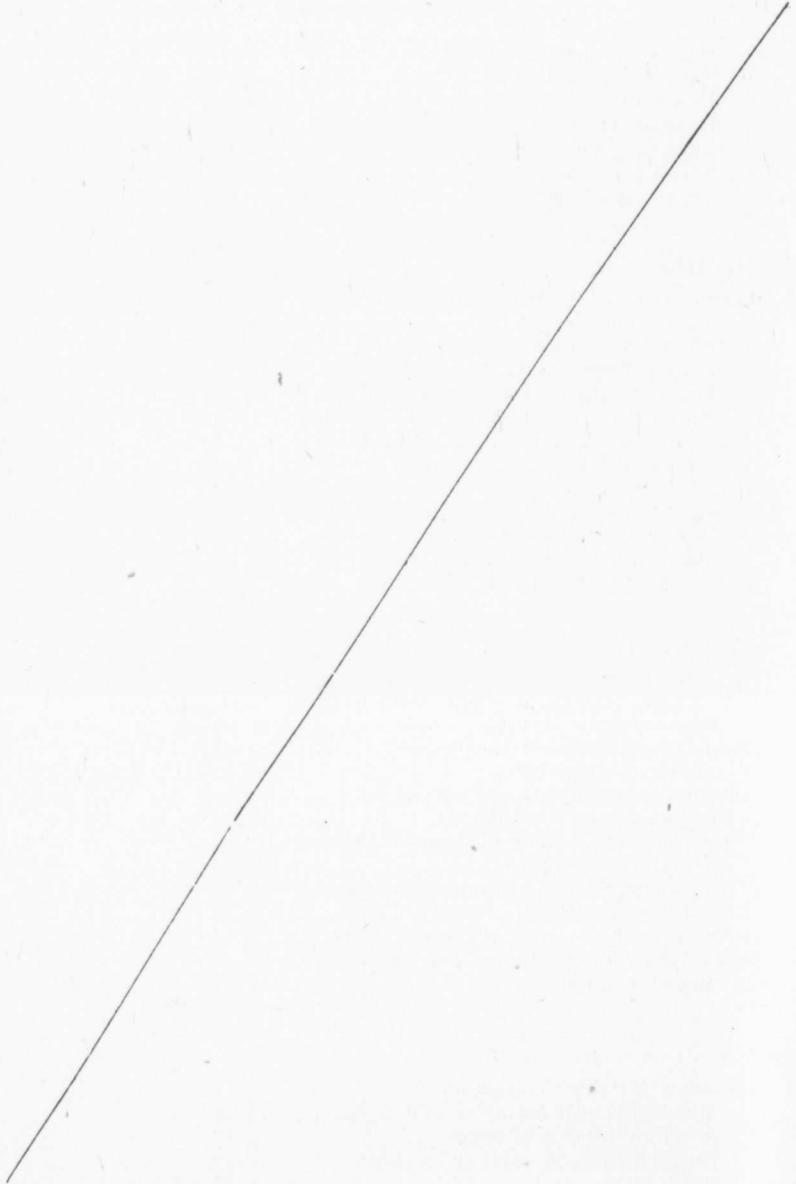

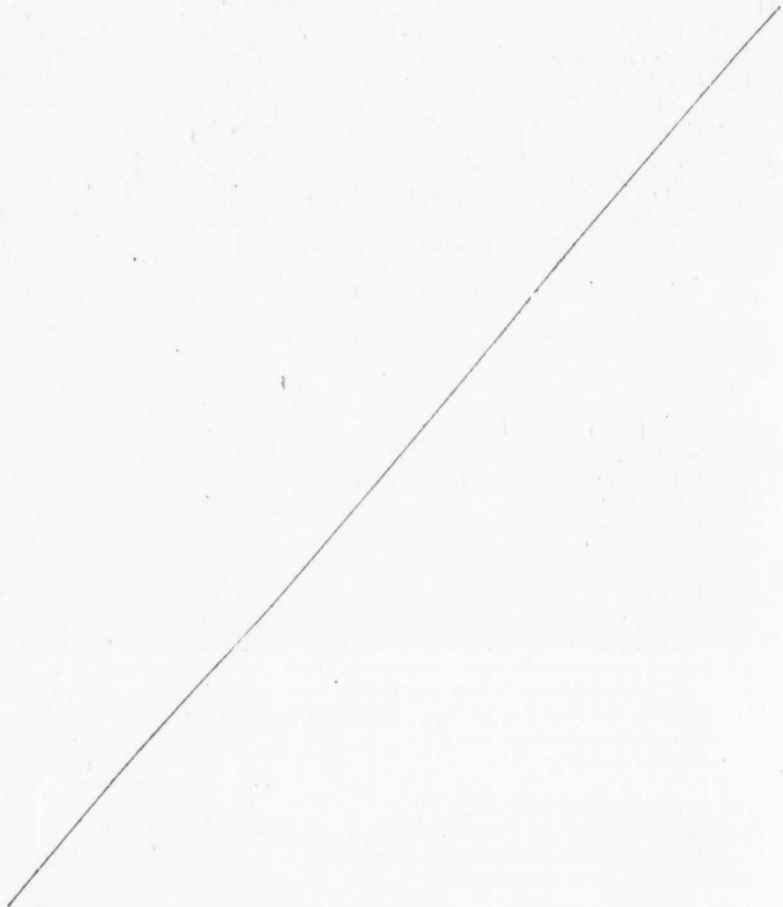

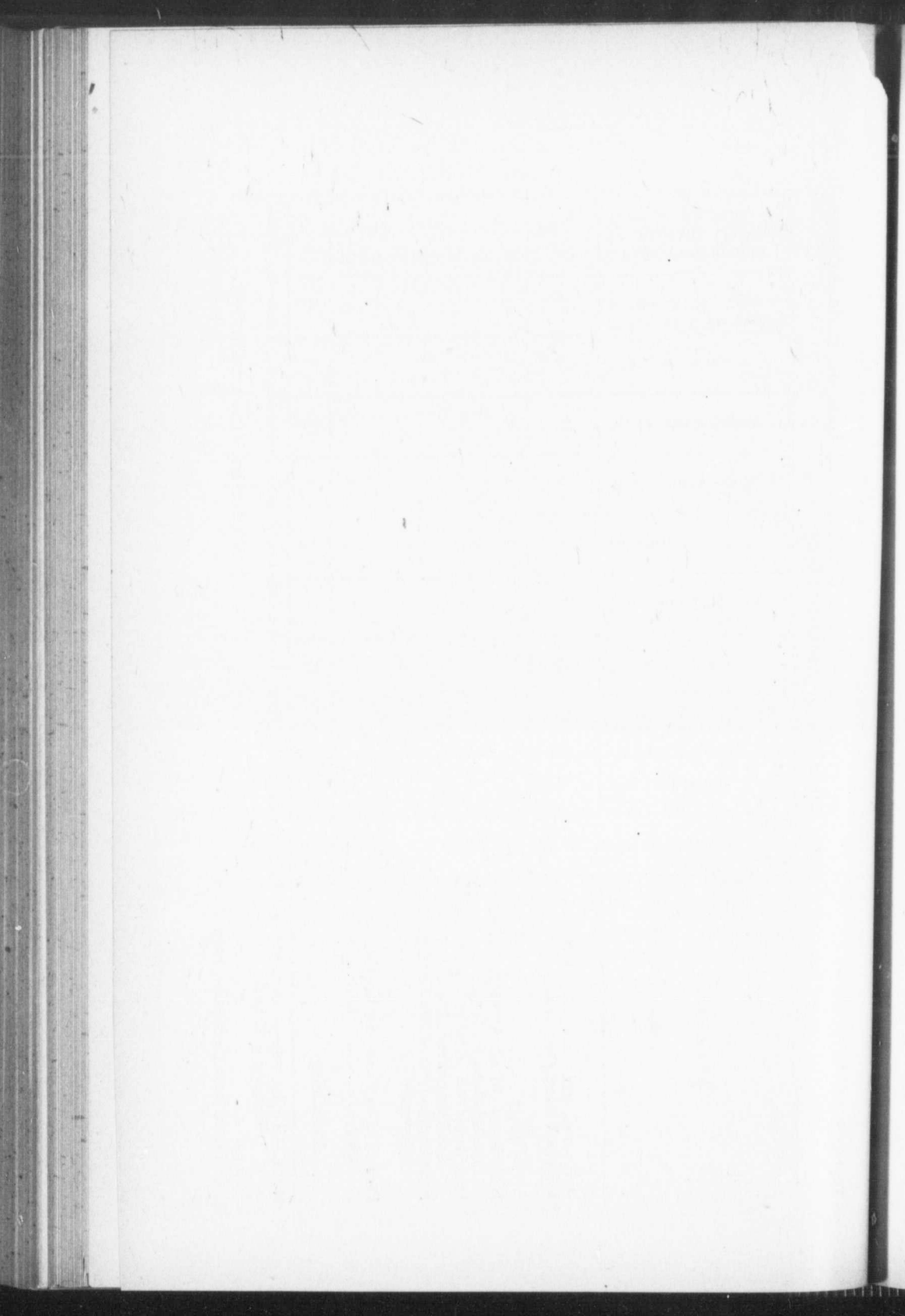

Lt.-Colonel White, presiding.

The Minutes of the Meeting held 18th April, were read and confirmed, and Major Perley proposed, seconded by Major Blaiklock—

“That a repair shed, not to exceed \$130 in cost, be erected on the (Rideau) Range to facilitate the preparation of the Targets, and storing them after the matches.”—Carried.

Moved by Major Perley, seconded by Lt.-Col. Anderson—

“That the Members of the Wimbledon Team from the Province of Ontario be instructed by the Secretary to report at the Brigade Office, Montreal, on Tuesday the 18th June, at 10 a.m., for inspection, and to embark that day on board the Steamer Parisian, and that the members from the Province of Nova Scotia be instructed to report on board the Steamer Parisian at Quebec on the evening of the 19th June.”—Carried.

Moved by Major Blaiklock, seconded by Lt.-Col. Anderson—

“That 60 silver and 20 bronze medals be purchased from Messrs. P. D. Ellis & Co., Toronto.”—Carried.

Moved by Major Blaiklock, seconded by Captain J. Hood—

“That Lieut. S. L. Shannon be appointed acting Secretary during the Secretary's absence in England.”—Carried.

Moved by Captain Hood, seconded by Major Blaiklock—

“That the Range Committee of 1888, be re-elected for 1889, viz : Lt.-Col. Bacon, Lt.-Col. Anderson and Major Perley.”—Carried.

Moved by Captain Hood, seconded by Major Blaiklock—

“That Lt.-Col. Tilton and John Macpherson and Major Toller form the committee to carry out the arrangements for the public presentation of prizes.

The Meeting then adjourned.

The minutes of meeting held 28th May, were read and confirmed.

The question of the formal presentation of prizes was brought up, and it was resolved that the matter should be left with the Special Committee to make the necessary arrangements.

The Acting Secretary was authorized to see Mr. Surtees relative to bringing a water pipe on to the grounds of the camp, to enable the competitors to have better facilities for obtaining water.

It was resolved that some additional W. C.'s should be put up.

Capt. Sims proposed, seconded by Major Blaiklock,—

“That a Sub-Committee consisting of Col. White, Col. Anderson and Col. Tilton be a committee to look after the catering of the D. R. A. Meeting.”—Carried.

The account of Askwith & Neville for \$130 for building a store shed on the Range, was passed and the Treasurer requested to pay the same.

STAFF FOR THE ANNUAL MATCHES.

Major Toller proposed, seconded by Lt.-Col. Tilton,—

“That Lt.-Col. Maunsell be the Executive Officer at the D. R. A. meeting.”—Carried.

Lt.-Col. Macdonald proposed, seconded by Capt. Sims,—

“That failing Lt.-Col. Maunsell's acceptance of the position of Executive Officer, that Lt.-Col. Mattice be appointed.”

Lt.-Col. Anderson proposed an amendment, seconded by Lt.-Col. Tilton,—

“That in the event of Lt.-Col. Maunsell refusing to act, the appointment of an Executive Officer be left in the hands of a Special Committee.”

The amendment on a division was declared lost, and the main motion relative to appointing Lt.-Col. Mattice in the event of Lt.-Col. Maunsell refusing, was then put and carried.

Lt.-Col. Anderson requested that his vote against the motion be noted in the minutes.

It was resolved that the following gentlemen be requested to act as Range Officers:—

It was suggested that the Extra Series and Pool Tickets be checked off from day to day as sold, and that every Register Keeper must provide himself with binocular glasses.

Captain Sims proposed, seconded by Lt.-Col. Macdonald—

“That the regulation signed bull’s-eye be used for Pool Targets.”—Carried.

Col. White referred to Rule 25, Part IV, “Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of Government issue. Field sights will not be allowed.”

After discussion, it was resolved that a suitable gauge for foresights and backsights be procured to test rifles.

The meeting then adjourned.

Martini Rifles to be used. Ranges 200, 500 and 600 yards, seven shots at each.”—Carried unanimously.

The meeting then adjourned.

D. R. A. Competitors' Annual Meeting.

OTTAWA DRILL HALL, 3rd September, 1889.

Col. White was, on motion of Major Garrison, Halifax, seconded by Lieut. Macnachtan, elected Chairman.

Major Sam Hughes was appointed Secretary.

Col. White briefly reviewed the work done at last Competitors' Meeting. He also explained the object of the meeting to be to suggest improvements in the competition.

Mr. Macnachtan stated that owing to the regular annual increasing attendance at the matches, it was evidently necessary to increase the target accommodation by at least eight or ten additional targets.

Col. White announced that the question had already received the attention of the Executive.

Major Perley, Engineer of the Association, explained the terms under which the present ranges are held. A Committee will report next February. He hoped to have ranges extended by next year.

Col. Gibson, Hamilton, moved, seconded by Captain Adam, Hamilton, a resolution as follows :—

Moved by Lt.-Colonel Gibson, seconded by Captain Adam.—

“That the Riflemen now assembled, representing all the Provinces of Canada, desire to express their great satisfaction, that the Canadian Team at Wimbledon have this year, once more brought across the Atlantic the Kolapore Cups, and generally made a capital record,—and also to congratulate Lt.-Colonel Bacon, the Commander of the Team, Captain Hood, the efficient Adjutant, and the whole Team, on the splendid record that has been made by them on behalf of Canada.”

In speaking to the resolution, Col. Gibson eulogised Col. Bacon, Commandant of the Wimbledon Team, and Capt. Hood, Adjutant, on their personal fitness for the positions they held ; and he believed the great success attending the team was in great part due to the officers in command. Col. Gibson also explained how the “Old Land” teams were selected, and concluded that the victory of the Canadians in the “Kolapore Cup” competition was all the more creditable. The motion was carried unanimously.

Col. Bacon briefly replied to the motion. He expressed the greatest admiration of the members of the Team, and also for his Adjutant, Capt. Hood, than whom no fitter officer could be selected. Col. Bacon, though leaving the greater part of the practical work to Capt. Hood, yet, was not absent from the ranges, unless on business for the Team.

In the absence of Capt. Hood, Major Blaiklock briefly thanked the meeting; but meantime Capt. Hood entered. He said that from the time of leaving Quebec there was nothing whatever to complain of in the Team of 1889. He had the honor as Adjutant of the Team to be able to claim on behalf of the ten men who competed on Queen's Ranges, against Cambridge Team, the highest scores ever made, an average on one occasion of 90 points out of 103, and on another 92 points. Capt. Hood also expressed regret that provision was not made to wire to Canada the scores of winning Canadians. He suggested that the Executive of the D. R. A., should consider the suggestion. In every match a Canadian came in winner, and crowned all by bringing back to Canada the "Kolapore" Cups—a matter of much importance to the Canadian militia.

Col. Tilton, of the G. G. Guards, referred to the absence of news from Wimbledon during the competitions, and regretted that full information was not forthcoming. He complimented the London Agent of the Toronto "Globe" of several years ago, who then was extremely anxious to obtain all data.

Major Sherwood referred to there being a number of riflemen who came here ready to shoot and who were refused entrance.

Col. White explained that the only entries refused were residents of Ottawa. He was not aware that any from a distance were refused.

Major Sherwood stated that a number of those refused entrance were farmers, who could not make earlier application owing to the state of the harvest.

On motion of Capt. Adams, Halifax G. A., seconded by Capt. Hood, 5th Royal Scots, the following was unanimously carried:—

"That this meeting views with pleasure the attendance at these matches of teams respectively representing the regular Army and Navy of the British Empire, in the person of representatives from the 'West Riding Regiment' now at Halifax, and from H. M. war ship 'Bellerophon,' now at Quebec, and trusts that the practice will continue, and that the same be conveyed to Col. Commanding W. R. Reg., and the Commander of the 'Bellerophon.'"

Lieut. Sutherland, 43rd, brought up the question of "Pool" targets, and inquired why none can be utilized on the ranges.

Col. White explained that this year the want of target accommodation was the cause of their being no pools.

Major Perley explained that the Executive had given the question serious consideration, and endorsed the remarks of Col. White.

Capt. Hartt thought the Executive had done well not to allow "pools" until special targets can be set apart for that purpose. Capt. Hartt had a grievance in regard to Extra Series Range Officers. He thought range officers should be instructed to cause competitors to fall in line and have their tickets marked.

Capt. Adam explained all this to be due to the want of target accommodation, and hoped no one would think the Executive had in any way been negligent or remiss in their duties.

He moved, seconded by Major J. Hughes, 45th Bn., a vote of thanks to the Executive of the Association as follows:—

"That the thanks of this meeting be tendered to the Executive of the D.R.A. for the very satisfactory way in which the general work of the meeting has been conducted."

Major Sam. Hughes, 45th Bn., moved, seconded by Capt. P. Grant, 20th Bn.

"That this, 'the Competitors' Meeting,' expresses its approval of the practice of the Canadian Government in granting assistance to local Rifle Associations throughout the Dominion, and hopes the same may be continued and, if possible, extended."

Major McSpadden, 12th York Rangers, inquired whether complaints were being received *re*-ammunition. Major Garrison expressed satisfaction with the ammunition, but had heard several complaints on the ranges here. Capt. Hood stated there were a number of cartridges in which the caps had not exploded.

Capt. Hartt on behalf of N. B., was pleased with the ammunition of 1888, but was not so satisfied with that of 1889.

It was moved by Capt. Hartt, seconded by Major Garrison—

"That the competitors present at this D. R. A. meeting are unable to express the same satisfaction with the 1889 ammunition as they last year experienced with the cartridges of 1888 make."

Major Perley explained that in the Metropolitan Matches, some of the 1889 cartridges were found to be defective, and he, as engineer officer, had given the matter official attention. The matter was, at present, before the Militia Department.

REGULATIONS.

The Prize Meeting of the Association will be conducted by a Special Committee of five members (three to form a quorum), appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other Members of Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision or that of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

1. *Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the conditions of any match for which they have entered as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.*
2. *Competitors must refer to the Notice Board morning and afternoon to ascertain whether orders have been issued altering the original detail of the shooting, or affecting them seriously.*
3. *Competitors must, when at the firing point, comply with all orders given by the range officers on duty.*

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.
- II.—No Officer, Non-commissioned Officer, or Private, employed by the D. R. A. for duty at the firing points or in the butts, shall shoot either for a prize or for practice.
- III.—In competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corps shall be worn, in accordance with the Regulations and Orders of the Militia, viz.:
 - a. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket. Elbow caps of leather or other material will not be allowed,

b. Trousers.

c. Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it. Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and great coats or waterproofs over uniforms.

Officers of a corps must all appear dressed in the same order as must also Non-commissioned Officers and Privates. Where a duly authorized undress for officers exists, they (the officers) may appear in it, although the Non-commissioned Officers and Privates may be in full dress. *Waist belts must be worn, except when firing.*

d. In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia, competitors must appear strictly in uniform as above, or wholly in plain clothes. (See Reg. XIX c.)

NOTE.—In "Military Matches" the above rules shall not apply, as special details for dress are issued.

IV.—All protests or objections shall be made at once to the Secretary or Range Officers on duty, and when practicable, in writing. When a protest is in the first place made verbally, it must subsequently be put in writing, and handed to the Secretary not later than one hour after the occurrence on which the protest is founded, and the Executive Committee reserve the right to refuse or accept any protest received or presented after the expiration of that time.

V.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

VI.—Fixed or artificial rests will not be allowed, except in Skirmishing Matches.

VII.—Competitors shall only use the mats provided by the Association. Cork beds and elbow rests will not be allowed.

VIII.—No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

IX.—"Blowing off" shall not be allowed at the firing points, or after competitors have taken their position for firing. Pits will be provided at places near the firing points where competitors can "blow off" *before joining their squads* on presentation of a "blow off" ticket, which will be sold for 5 cents each, and include the cost of *one* round of ammunition to be obtained from the person in charge, on delivery of ticket.

X.—No competitor shall load until he has taken his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word "All Clear."

XI.—Slings may be used in all matches, but they must be of the Government length and pattern, white, brown or black, and attached to the rifles as in Government arms,

XII.—In individual competitions—competitors may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided their doing so causes no delay in the shooting.

XIII.—After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person, except the Register Keeper, or an Officer on duty, will be permitted to speak to him.

XIV.—In *Matches* where both team and *individual prizes* are being competed for, *coaching* of any kind is strictly prohibited.

XV.—In *Matches* where the prizes are offered to *teams only*, the members of each team shooting together will be permitted to “coach” or “spot” for each other, and to use binoculars or telescopes for that purpose, provided their doing so does not delay or impede the shooting. The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint spotters to assist him. With the above exception no other persons will be allowed within the ropes, or permitted to offer advice or instruction to the competitors.

XVI.—Any violation of these rules, or any part of them, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Officer, that the case may be dealt with by the Special Committee as laid down, under the head of “penalties,” and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

XVII.—PENALTIES—DISQUALIFICATIONS.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own ; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so ; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target ; or
- (d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever ; or
- (e) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council, Executive or Special Committee ; or
- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Council, Executive or Special Committee may consider discreditable ; or

- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council, Executive or Special Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct, or the aforesaid offences ; or
- (h) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangement with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize,

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council, Executive or Special Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association, until reinstated.

XVIII.—EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or
- (b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing ; or
- (d) Who from a proper want of care discharges his rifle accidentally. [If such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given]; or
- (e) Who shall alter or make any erasures on his firing ticket; or
- (f) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous;

shall upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

XIX.—DISALLOWANCE OF SCORES.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or with the orders of the Executive or Range officers; or

- (b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize, or
- (c) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes,
(See Reg. III. d);

shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed, and if such disallowance refers to the Grand Aggregate, he shall also forfeit all claim to shoot in the Governor-General's Match.

XX.—FINES.

Any competitor who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is "excluded from further competition," or where his "score is disallowed," for any particular prize, the *circumstances only* under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the NAME of the individual implicated.

In case of "disqualification," the NAME of the offender as well as the particulars of the case shall be posted on the notice board.

XXI.—MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

The Special Committee shall have power to vary, mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

XXII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

- (a) Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than one prize in any competition.
- (b) Winners of prizes will, on signing the official prize list, receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) If a formal presentation of prizes takes place, winners being Active Militiamen, must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps.
- (d) All Challenge Cups and Shields must be returned to the Secretary on or before the 15th August, 1889.

XXIII.—DISTANCES AND TARGETS.

The Targets must be of the following dimensions :

MILITARY MATCH TARGETS.—At all ranges 6 feet long, 2 feet 6 inches high.

XXIV.—SIGNALLING—SCORING.

1. The signalling will be as follows :—

- (a) Bull's Eye, counting —5— White disc.
- (b) Inner —4— Red disc.
- (c) Magpie —3— Black and White disc.
- (d) Outer —2— Black disc.
- (e) Ricochet —R— Black bar.

(f) *Misses* will *not* be signalled ; but if a target is lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the marker will wave a *black* disc, to signify that the target has not been struck.

2. When *two* shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be signalled with the *signal disc*, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with the shot, provided he has fired. *Both shots will*, however, be shown by spotting discs.

3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, will be shown by the spotting discs when the target is again raised.

4. The signalling shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may have struck the target, he may call on the Officer in charge at the butt to examine the target, *and the result of such examination as signalled shall be final.* Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of *fifty cents* with the officer in charge of the firing point, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

5. If on a target being raised the *spotting disc* appears manifestly to disagree with the *signal disc*, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstances to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.

6. All claims for shots signalled *must be made before* another shot is fired at the target in question.

7. If at the moment at which a competitor fires, his target should be lowered in such a manner as to falsify the result of his shot, the Range Officer is empowered to cancel the result of such shot, and to permit the competitor to fire another shot in its place.

8. All alterations of the register must be initialled by the officer making them, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his first having signalled to the butt.

9. No person will be permitted to go and examine a target during the meeting except the Executive Officer or such person as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted from every such hit in excess of the number of shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the targets in excess of the number of shots allowed, could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

XXV.

The rifles shall be Snider (Long and Short) and Martini-Henry rifles, either of the Government issue or of *bona fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Government viewer's mark.

1. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9 lbs. 12 oz. Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9 lbs.
2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate will be allowed.
3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Field sights not to be allowed.

(a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but black and white must not be mixed so as to produce grey, and no application of colour will be allowed after the competitor has taken his position at the firing point.

No application of a permanent nature will be allowed.

No shading of sights will be allowed.

(b) The *back sight* may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at any angle by any extemporized means.

(c) The sliding bar may be inverted and used on either side of the uprights. *One* permanent centre line for the Snider, and *three* for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or line of any kind removable at pleasure may be used, but not consisting of slips of paper or other substance capable of being shifted or removed.

XXVI.—AMMUNITION.

None but the ammunition issued by the D. R. A. on the ground shall be used or allowed.

XXVII.—POSITION.

Unless otherwise specified the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position, with the head to the range.

In the Standing position the whole of the left hand must be in front of the trigger guard, and the left elbow clear of the body.

XXVIII.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

1. Competitors must be present at the firing points punctually at the time detailed on their tickets, otherwise they will not be allowed to shoot; the time to be regulated by the clock in the Secretary's office. "Blowing off" and all other preliminaries must be completed before hand, and will not be allowed as excuses for delay.

2. In all ordinary competitions competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by files, and fire shot and shot *alternately*.

3. When but *one* competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay; but the officer in charge of the firing point or *some one named by him*, must witness the shooting, and countersign the register. Failing such verification the score will be invalidated. Any person present whom the competitor may name will watch the score recorded, and if need be raise objection *before* the next shot is fired.

4. No two competitors shall shot in any competition except in the Martini matches, with the same rifle; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range during a competition unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Officer in charge.

5. The competitor must, after delivering each shot, pay attention to the score called out by the Register-Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the Register, so that any objection to *the score recorded* may be investigated before the next shot is fired.

6. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor or of such delay as the Range officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the score forfeited and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.

XXIX.—TIES.

Ties shall be decided as follows:—

A. *Individual Competition for a Series of Prizes.*

1. If at more than *one* distance by the range totals in *inverse order*, commencing at the longest range.
2. By the fewest *outers*.
3. By the fewest *muggies*.
4. By the fewest *inners*.
5. By the *value of each shot in iaverse order*.

In the case of ABSOLUTE TIES.

- (a) If for PRIZES, IN KIND, by *shooting off* as in clause B.
- (c) In the case of a prize PART IN KIND AND PART IN MONEY, by *shooting off for the Price in Kind and dividing Money*.

These sub-sections apply also to competitions at single distances. Where a "possible score" is made, the maker shall fire *three* shots immediately after.

N. B.—In all competitions the *order* of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possible, but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketted.

B. *In Individual Competition for a Single Prize.*

1. By the aggregate score in *five* rounds at the longest distance.
2. By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C. *In team Competitions.*

1. If at more than distance, *by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.*
2. By the fewest *outers.*
3. By the fewest *moggies.*
4. By the fewest *inners.*
5. By the highest scores in each team *shooting off*, as in clause B.

D. *Grand Aggregate.*

Equal numerical scores for the first 5 places, and for the last place or places, shall be decided by the result of firing 5 shots at 500 yards, with Snider Rifles, after that, if the scores be still equal, by single shots until decided.

For other places :

1. By the *total score in each match in inverse order.*
2. By the *total scores at 600 yards.*
3. By the *total scores at 500 yards.*
4. By the *total scores at 400 yards.*
5. By shooting off as in Clause B.

In the Governor-General's Match, scores of equal numerical value shall be treated and placed by the before-stated Rule B.

In Military Matches, by largest number of hits.

E. *In cases not met by the foregoing.*

1. By any *special rules attached to the conditions,*
2. By the *fiat of the Committee,*

NOTE.—Where ties have to be decided by “shooting off” the Snider Rifle only shall be used.

XXX.—ENTRIES.

The Executive and Special Committees reserve to themselves the power of refusing any Entry for any match, or of cancelling at any moment any entry that may have been previously accepted.

The privilege of Entry is restricted to members who have paid their subscription (\$2.00), and to associate members, who pay the fee of \$1.00 at the time of entry.

1. Entries for the several competitions shall close on days to be named by the Committee.

2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of the competition.

3. No entry shall be accepted after the hour fixed for the commencement of the competition to which admission is sought.

4. Entries shall be classified :

(a) Ordinary (at the published rates of entrance fees.) To include those made and received by the Secretary of the D. R. A. on or before 4 p.m., Wednesday, 29th August.

(b) Post (at an increase charge of 20 per cent. on the published rate of entrance fees.) To include those made or received after 4 p.m. Wednesday, 29th August.

N. B.—The acceptance of Post Entries will be entirely governed by circumstances. As a rule the privilege will be withdrawn as soon as the target accommodation allotted for each competition is absorbed, and whenever the Special Committee may determine.

5. To meet the case where difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required entries by the 29th August, Officers commanding corps and Secretaries of Provincial or Local Associations will be permitted to send in their application for (state No.) competitors, accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees; and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries, until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such cases the Register Tickets will not be issued before the nominal return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for in the following regulations ;—

XXXI.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Entrance Fees in full will be returned to those—
 - (a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting ; or
 - (b) Who attend the meeting but are incapacitated from illness or accident ; or
 - (c) Whose entries the Executive or Special Committee may have cancelled.
2. Claims based on other consideration than the above will, if allowed, be subject to a penalty of half forfeit.

XXXII.—SQUADDING.

1. In the case of competitors classified as Ordinary Entries, arrangements will be made and details published of the day, hour, and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.
2. In the case of Post Entries, the hour of shooting cannot be predetermined or announced, and competitors so classified must await the orders that the progress of the meeting may render practicable.

XXXIII.—ALTERATIONS OF SQUADDING.

1. Any alterations which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be a sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration, unless verified by the initials of the Secretary or Executive Officer, will cancel the ticket.
2. The place of publication for all notices affecting the detail of shooting shall be the board fixed without the tent of the Secretary, and the posting of a notice on such a board must be taken and accepted as a good service on all affected thereby.

XXXIV.—REGISTER TICKETS.

1. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity of competing for the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association in regard to such competition, *and no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except upon special circumstances.*
5. Any *erasure or substitution* of one name for another, unless made by the Secretary or Executive Officer, shall invalidate the ticket.

The Council reserves the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing regulations as circumstances may require.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association, for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at

which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the name of the winner and details of the matches at which it is won shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patron, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:—

Fourteen	[14]	from Ontario,
Ten	[10]	" Quebec,
Six	[6]	" New Brunswick,
Six	[6]	" Nova Scotia,
Four	[4]	" Manitoba,
Four	[4]	" British Columbia,
Four	[4]	" Prince Edward Island,
Two	[2]	" each of the N. West Territories so soon as

the Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dom. Rifle Association, as Provincial Associations, one-half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Association of the respective Provinces at their annual meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Association to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its members own the Chairmen of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The President of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.
12. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.
13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendance of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instruction as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.
15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.
16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.
17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or an adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all Members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

General By-laws of the Association.

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. ^{Meeting of Council}
The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct— notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings. ^{Extraordinary Meetings.}

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to inspection of any Member of the Council. ^{The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings.}

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three Members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting. ^{Finance Committee.}

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association. ^{Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Banks.}

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. ^{Expenditure of sums for current expenses.}

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association. Ependiture of a general nature.

A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November. Annual Accounts
