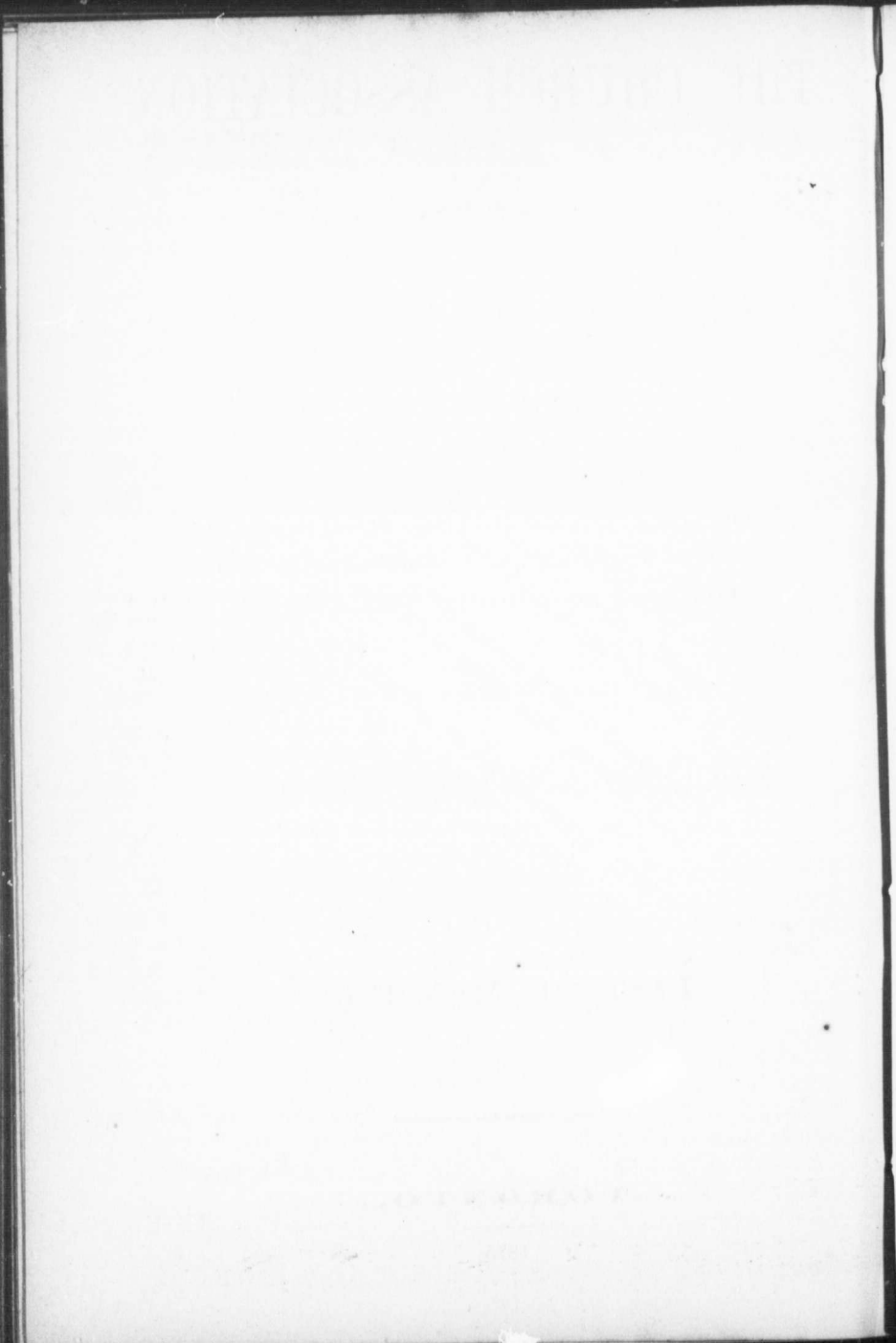

Church Association of the Diocese of Toronto.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1875.

In reviewing the work of the past year, the Executive Committee of the Church Association of the Diocese of Toronto cannot but recognize, with deep thankfulness to Almighty God, the important results which have been brought about in a wholly unlooked for manner as the fruits of their labors in defence of the simple Protestant worship, and the scriptural teaching and services of the Church of England in Canada.

When the last annual report was presented to the Association, the Lord Bishop of the Diocese had sent forth a pastoral—addressed “To the Churchwardens, Delegates, and other Lay Members of the Church of England in the Diocese of Toronto,”—in which he declared his “conviction that we have not in a single instance in this Diocese an approach to the extravagancies in Ritual which in many cases are so painfully exhibited in the Mother Country,” and added that he had “never received from any congregation in his Diocese a complaint that unsound doctrine was preached.” Such an authoritative declaration seemed to many to confirm the belief that no cause existed here to justify the formation of an Association to resist innovations and novelties borrowed from the Church of Rome, or derived from that Anglican school of Ritualists of whom Monsignor Capel, a dignitary of the Church of Rome, has recently declared: “Our experience bears witness to the fact that a steady and ever-increasing current has set in from the Ritualistic party to the [Roman] Catholic Church.”

Such a testimony in reference to the dangers now assailing the Church of England in the Mother Country is alone sufficient to justify an attitude of jealous watchfulness, and to show that this is no time for the cry of “Peace.” Unhappily, the Bishop

of this Diocese and the majority of its clergy were of a different opinion. In his charge to the Synod, the Lord Bishop denounced this Association for disturbing the peace of the Church, stating his conviction that the course pursued by its originators is one calculated only to "excite suspicion, create distrust, promote dissension, and embitter feelings that ought to be kindly and confiding."

Thus admonished, the Executive Committee were bound to give an earnest reconsideration to the course on which they had entered; and having fully weighed the question how far their "feelings ought to be kindly and confiding" towards those who, as it seemed, were doing the work of Rome under the guise of members of the Church of England: in Occasional Paper No. V. they asked the Church at large "*Is There Not a Cause?*" Unhappily, it was only too easy to show that in the very Diocese which was affirmed to be so free from Ritualism, and in a parish little beyond the bounds of Toronto, the "Mass" was openly celebrated, with wafer bread, elevation of the cup, &c., the Reformation was denounced, and fasting communion, the confessional, and much else most characteristic of advanced English Ritualism, were systematically practised. There, as in other parishes, books of the most pernicious character, inculcating the same Romish errors, were being placed—in some cases with Jesuitical reserve, and in others openly,—in the hands of children at Sunday and Church schools. In view of this, the members of the Church Association might well exclaim:—"How false is the plea of charity that would call upon us to close our eyes to such Romanizing tendencies and teachings, and to take for granted that they will die out. Does it not rather summon us in love for those who come after us, and for our Church, not to allow the well-known land-marks so to be effaced, but that our children may be enabled to walk with equal confidence and certainty in that path of sound Protestantism in which our fathers were led?"

Again, in Occasional Paper No. VI., entitled "*Read! Mark! Learn!*" in which a renewed effort was made to awaken the friends of the Church, and those in authority over it, to the real dangers to which it is exposed, special attention was directed to a work recently issued from the Canadian press, styled "*Vox DEI AUT VOX POPULI*," and its true character and most pernicious teachings were shown. To this the Lord Bishop referred in his address at the Episcopal Visitation in December last. He "grieved that the prejudice of party should override the bounds of Christian charity and truth," and thus proceeded:—"In consistent keeping with this is the purport of a tract issued by the

Church Association. It devotes several pages to citations from a publication entitled '*Vox Dei aut Vox Populi*,' no clergyman that I am aware of, in this Diocese at least, endorsing its opinions or countenancing its statements."

The Church Association had specially invited the attention of the Bishop to the fact, that the headquarters of those engaged in this Ritualistic work were in his own diocese. A "confidential" circular of "*The Catholic Layman's Guild*" was produced inviting the contributions and help of "good Catholics;" who were to address themselves to the Secretary of the Guild, at his Toronto P. O. Box. The evidence seemed indisputable; but the only response was the charge that overriding the bounds of Christian charity and truth, this Association was giving publicity to the very false teachings it denounced.

Not only timid cravers for peace at any sacrifice, but those who, in a true and faithful spirit, say of our beloved Church, "Peace be within thy walls, and prosperity within thy palaces," might be led to fear, lest those to whom they had entrusted the issue of such publications had rashly committed them to statements which could not be sustained. Yet little more than a month thereafter, it was proved before the commission appointed by the Bishop to inquire into the charges against the Incumbent of St. Philip's, Weston, that he had placed this very book in the hands of his churchwardens, commending it to them as a work, "which takes a plain, unflinching, and masterly view of those differences, which the Church Association and other ignorant people *have dragged to the surface.*"

Nor let it be assumed, as has since been done, that the Weston case is a wholly exceptional one. There is a periodical regularly published in Toronto under the name of "*The Church Chimes*," filled with the most childish follies and superstitions of the Church of Rome; "profane and old wives fables." In this organ of the most extravagant Ritualistic teachings, the regular chapters of the Holy Guild of St. Lawrence were advertised; and its annual commemoration was announced to be held at Weston, under the special favor of the incumbent of the Parish. It took place accordingly, with the co-operation of other sympathizing clergymen, who joined in a procession, with banners, crosses, &c., "wearing stoles of the colour of the day." Then followed "a high celebration of the Holy Eucharist," with the Rev. C. P. Mulvaney as celebrant, the Rev. E. Day as deacon, and the Rev. W. A. Johnson as subdeacon, while the *Missa de Angelis* was rendered under the direction of the distributor of the notorious "*Path of Holiness*" among the Sunday-school

children in the parish of the Holy Trinity, of which the Rev. E. Day is one of the Clergy.

Again in a special letter from the lay members of the Executive Committee to the Lord Bishop, called forth by the necessity of responding alike to the charge delivered at the Visitation and to the action which followed: among other points pressed on the Bishop's notice was the introduction of a "Sisterhood," or Nunnery, into this Diocese. There, and in a subsequent paper, the dangerous significance of this innovation was pressed on the attention of the Bishop; and he was specially urged to note the novelty—unheard of till now in Canada at least,—of a "Sister," the member of a "Church Sisterhood," having the so-called "Altar" of a Protestant Church committed to her care; along with the still more significant novelty of this Sisterhood making bread specially "for the celebration of the Holy Communion," in open contravention of a rubric which forbids this, for the very purpose of "taking away all occasion of dissension and superstition." The Bishop produced the defence of the Rev. Mr. Darling, who was grieved at the uncharitableness that could find "a ground of offence and accusation" in such proceedings.

Not long after, a member of the Church Association was present at a meeting of Clergy at which one of them produced a little volume, entitled, "THE RITUAL REASON WHY." The book is a Manual of the very extremest Ritualistic excesses in rites, vestments, and doctrine. On opening it, he was surprised to find within the board, the printed label of the Sunday School Library of the Church of the Holy Trinity, Toronto. In this book is to be found the key to the true significance of much, which some in high authority assure us is no more than the innocent and seemingly gratification of a more refined or ornate taste. Here we read on p. 53, "The chalice-veil, corporals, pall, and burse; the linen cloths of the Altar; the chasuble, dalmatic, and maniple. *These, after benediction, cannot be handled by lay people without permission,*" and this, "out of reverence to the Blessed Sacrament, in the celebration of which they are more immediately used." The explanation of the Rev. Mr. Darling, as communicated to the Church Association by the Bishop, was this:—

"The mind of the Church of England, as I read it, is strongly in favour of everything connected with the highest and holiest rite of our religion being treated with reverent care. Instead, therefore, of the altar-linen being thrown amongst soiled clothes at a laundry or at a washerwoman's, it is surely more becoming that one who is a regular and devout communicant

should charge herself with the duty of seeing that the linen is 'pure and white,' and that it should not be treated as a 'common thing.'"

Such is the explanation rendered to us. But at this very time "THE RITUAL REASON WHY," on the shelves of the Rev. gentleman's Sunday School library—with no such reserve,—furnished this other explanation: "*Corporals, and other linen which is brought into immediate contract with THE SACRAMENTAL PRESENCE, have for a similar reason to be washed by one in holy orders. prior to being washed by laics!*"

The Lord Bishop rebuked the Association for uncharitably confounding "the kind Christian ladies" of the Holy Trinity Sisterhood with those of the Roman Catholic Church; remarking that "many pious and excellent people will be pained as well as astonished at the sneering and disparaging tone in which you express yourselves of the useful and benevolent 'Sisterhood' which has been formed in connection with that Church, and the mischief you intend in designating it a 'Protestant Nunnery.'"

The language thus characterised in such strong terms, as "sneering," was as follows:

"It is in this parish that the first attempt at the organization of a Protestant Nunnery has been made; and while, as in many Romish sisterhoods, this 'Sisterhood of S. John the Baptist' aims at works of piety and charity, we read in its report for the past year that 'The Altar linen used in the 'Church of the Holy Trinity is washed and ironed at the 'House; the bread for the celebration of the Holy Communion 'provided, and Sister Sarah has the care of the Altar which 'occupies one afternoon each week.'"

"Such 'Altar' services; providing the communion-bread specially by the hands of a Sisterhood; and the 'Altar' of a protestant Church prepared for its novel rites under 'the care of Sister Sarah:' it seems to us, can end here in no other results than those which have followed from the like imitations of the Monastic Institutions and Sisterhoods of Rome in England."

The terms, "Protestant Nunnery" and "Monastic Institutions," were used, not sneeringly, but as the strictly accurate definition of this attempt to imitate the Nunneries of the Romish Church.

We learn from the Report of the "Sisterhood of St. John the Baptist," that its "Sisters" have been "admitted formally by the Bishop as members of the Community, and sent forth with his Episcopal Benediction." They are thereby no longer "laics;" and so they are qualified to wash "corporals and other

linen" which have been "brought into immediate contact with the Sacramental Presence" in the Holy Communion: precisely as the Nuns of the Church of Rome are held to be qualified for this work. This, is, beyond all question, one of those pernicious and Romanizing novelties and innovations which this Association was specially formed for the purpose of exposing and resisting. The doctrine of the Real Presence, implied in all this intangible sanctity of "the Altar linen," is set forth in the grossest form in the above named Sunday School Library book. For example: "Why does the priest genuflect after each consecration?"—Ans. "In lowliest worship of our Lord, now present under the forms of bread and wine." It would be no charity; but treason to the cause of evangelical truth and honest protestantism, if such Romanising novelties were not exposed and denounced.

The Executive Committee deeply feel the responsible trust which has been committed to them, in conducting the publications designed to give expression to the opinions and the aims of an Association now numbering 1445 members. They have, therefore, felt it their duty thus far to review the action of the past year; and to set forth the above facts in justification of their proceedings; to show that if, as the Bishop affirms, such publications "excite suspicion," it is a suspicion which is well founded; and if they "create distrust" it is of those who have proved themselves to be utterly untrustworthy. It is such revivers of anti-protestant errors and superstitions, and not those who thus expose them, that are justly chargeable with promoting dissension.

In so far the Executive Committee pursued the same course in the papers issued to the members as in the first year. But more recent publications have owed their special character to unlooked for events, which must now be very familiar to all members of the Association. A Committee to whom had been referred the important question of the sound evangelical education of candidates for Holy Orders,—which had already been practically dealt with in other Dioceses,—and the no less urgent need for a more liberal support to missions throughout the Diocese:—issued a Report. In this they felt it unavoidable to set forth the reasons why many members of our Church, who would otherwise gladly take their share in the necessary expenses connected with the training of men for the ministry, refuse to contribute anything towards the Divinity Student Fund of this Diocese; and the no less influential motives which induced them either wholly to withhold their contributions from the present Mission Fund of the Church; or to give sparingly and grudgingly,

owing to a growing dissatisfaction with the teachings which it was, in part at least, expended to support.

It was inevitable that the statements then set forth should give offence to some. But when at a later date it appeared that a meaning was attached to certain expressions which they had not been designed to convey, the first favourable opportunity was taken advantage of to offer every explanation and concession consistent with fidelity to the principles on which this Association has been founded.

A brief recapitulation will here suffice in relation to events which, though intimately connected with the history of the Association, have excited too profound an interest in the minds of all earnest Churchmen, to require any minutely detailed narrative now. The Lord Bishop held a Visitation of the Clergy of the Diocese in St. George's School House, Toronto, on the 30th of December, 1874; and after delivering an address, chiefly directed to the topics introduced in the above named Report of this Association, the Rev. Rural Dean Geddes "presented" the Very Rev. the Dean of Toronto, and ten other clergymen, charging them as members of this Association, with "depraving the Government and discipline of the Church." The terms of the charge were strangely indefinite; nor was it till, after many vexatious delays—as shown in the correspondence already communicated to the members of the Association,—that, on the Commission proceeding to the trial of the Dean of Toronto, the source of this mysterious incriminating phraseology was revealed by the production of the following Canon, being No. 73 of the Canons of the year 1603, directed against "*the holding of Private Conventicles*:"

"Forasmuch as all conventicles, and secret meetings of Priests and Ministers, have been ever justly accounted very hurtful to the state of the Church wherein they live; we do now ordain and constitute: That no Priests or Ministers of the word of God, or any other persons, shall meet together in any private house, or elsewhere, to consult upon any matter or course to be taken by them, or upon their motion or direction by any other, which may any way tend to the impeaching or depraving of the doctrine of the Church of England or of the Book of Common Prayer, or of any part of the Government and discipline now established in the Church of England, under pain of excommunication *ipso facto*."

The wonderful inappropriateness of many of these canons to the Government of the Church in this, or any other country, at the present time cannot perhaps be better shown than by an

extract from the next following Canon, being No. 74 of the same body of Canons. It is headed—"Decency in apparel enjoined to Ministers."

"We do further in like manner ordain, that all the ecclesiastical persons above mentioned shall usually wear in their journeys, cloaks with sleeves, commonly called priest's cloaks, without guards, welts, long buttons, or cuts,—and no ecclesiastical person shall wear any coif or wrought night cap, *but only plain night caps, of black silk, satin or velvet.* . . . In private houses, or in their abodes, those persons ecclesiastical may use any comely and scholar-like apparel, provided that it be not *cut or pinked*: and that in public they go not in their doublet and hose, without coats or cassocks: *and that they wear not any light coloured stockings.* Likewise poor beneficed men and curates (not being able to provide themselves long gowns) may go in short gowns of the fashion aforesaid!"

Of the eleven clergymen thus charged with contravening a Canon so obviously framed under circumstances without any analogy to those of the Church in Canada—or even in England at the present day,—the Rev. W. F. Checkley immediately withdrew from the Association. To the others, viz.: The Very Rev. Dean Grasett, the Rev. Rural Deans Cooper, Givins and Stewart, the Rev. Dr. O'Meara, the Rev. Canon Baldwin, Rev. S. J. Boddy, Rev. S. H. Moxon, and Rev. H. H. Waters, this Association and the Church at large owe a debt of gratitude for their faithful and uncompromising stand in a struggle which involved the freedom of conscience, and liberty of action of every member of the Church. The motives influencing those who urged this unwise course were pressed on the notice of the Bishop by the L. y members of the Executive Committee; and they specially pointed out to his Lordship, that the Rev. Rural Dean Geddes, who assumed the invidious task of presenting his brethren as "Depravers of the Government and Discipline of the Church," had recently as rector of Christ's Church, Hamilton, availed himself of the trust committed to him in connexion with the new church of All Saints, in that city, to imitate closely the ritualistic services of Holy Trinity, Toronto, which have been followed by results so justly alarming to every sincere Protestant.

The Commission named by the Bishop included the Venerable Archdeacon Fuller, the Rev. Canon Read, D. D., the Rev. Rural Deans Allan and Brent, and Clarke Gambie Esq., Q. C. But Mr. Gamble declined to sit on the Commission; Archdeacon Fuller withdrew from it after a time; and the trial and judgment were finally carried out by the three remaining members.

The presentation was made by Rural Dean Geddes, in Dec. 1874, but in spite of repeated remonstrances against the vexatious delays and adjournments, it was not till the 23rd April, 1875 that the judgment was pronounced. The grievances complained of were gradually narrowed; the desired investigation into the teachings of Trinity College was avoided; and the whole charge being at last reduced to that of establishing a separate Mission Fund, and thereby, as was unsuccessfully attempted to be shown, tending to cripple the resources of the Synod Mission Fund: The Commissioners reported to the Bishop: "That the strong language put forth by the Very Rev. Dean Grasett, Chairman, and the Clerical members of the Executive Committee of the Church Association, in their occasional papers, proved before the Commission, not being directed against any particular persons or cases, but indiscriminate in its application, is in the opinion of the Commissioners, calculated to create an unfounded suspicion, and inflict serious injury on the Church, by tending to cripple the operations of the Mission Board. But as the Commissioners cannot find that any Canon, or other law of the Church in force in this Diocese has been violated, they do not recommend the institution of further proceedings."

It is difficult to understand what the Commissioners mean when they speak of the strong language in the Occasional Papers of the Church Association "not being directed against any particular persons or cases, but indiscriminate in its application." No particular cases were indeed named in the Report on the Students' and Mission Fund; but while the Executive Committee would have preferred, in all their papers, to deal with the evils of Ritualism, without pointing out particular persons or cases; that proved to be impossible. Occasional Paper No. III. did indeed expose the teachings of Ritualists in our Sunday Schools without naming the individual offenders; as a previous Paper had dealt with Ritualism itself. But on being challenged for names and proof, the Commissioners have only to turn to Occasional Papers, Nos. IV., V., VII., VIII., to find that no lack of discrimination was shown in charging the evils home to those who are responsible for them.

Now that it is satisfactorily established that this Association violates no law or canon of the Church by inviting its members to contribute liberally of their means towards the education and the maintenance of Clergymen of earnest piety and sound Protestant and Evangelical principles, the Executive Committee venture to hope that the Lord Bishop will no longer frown upon the efforts of a body of zealous and devoted members of the

Church, to revive a spirit of more earnest zeal and true Christian liberality, the lack of which has long been a subject of unavailing complaint.

Although but very little has, as yet, been done in the way of actively canvassing for your Mission or Students' Funds, yet the subscriptions already given by those who have come forward without solicitation, amount to about \$11,000—extending over three years to 1877. There is no doubt, therefore, of the warm support which these undertakings have received and will continue to receive, and it is to be hoped that your exertions may result in some more adequate support of faithful missionaries labouring in the Master's vineyard; in the opening up of missions where, from want of funds the services of the Church are not at present available; and in stimulating generally the work of the Church where from apathy it has been allowed to languish. It is earnestly to be desired that each member of the Association will do all in his power to influence young men to take advantage of the facilities thus made available to them for preparation for the ministry; and acquaint the Secretaries of the Association with the name and address of any God-fearing man anxious to devote himself to this work. Already several are seeking to make arrangements with the Association; but the frequent calls for labourers in the mission field shew how large a supply will be needed to meet all the demands that are made.

Appended hereto will be found the Annual Financial Statement of the Association, shewing the position of its finances, apart from the Mission and Divinity Students' Funds, which, according to the resolution passed, are kept distinct from all other monies of the Association. It would be a matter of great convenience if the members would from time to time bear in mind when their subscriptions fall due, and remit the same to the Treasurer. To each, the amount, \$1, is but a small matter, but in the aggregate it represents nearly \$1,500 a year, the whole of which is needed for printing and other needful expenses.

The Executive Committee have issued since last report even Occasional and Special Papers; of those 28,000 copies in all have been distributed, and of the fourteen papers thus far produced about 75,000 copies have already been distributed. At the date of last report the members numbered 774: they now amount to 1445.

As the objects and purposes of the Association are becoming better understood, a more hearty sympathy is manifested in its labors. Both clergy and laity in other dioceses have expressed

their cordial approval of its proceedings ; and their belief that, under the Divine blessing, it is accomplishing a great work in the timely warning it has already given of the dangers to which our Church is exposed ; and of the leaven of Ritualism and Romanism already at work in many parishes and Sunday schools throughout this ecclesiastical province of the Canadian Church.

The Executive Committee have been greatly strengthened and encouraged by such expressions of sympathy and approval thus conveyed to them from other Dioceses ; and especially by the numerous signed addresses from the Clergy and the Laity of the Diocese of Montreal. These tokens of sympathy, as the members are aware, have been accompanied by a desire for closer co-operation with this Association. Gratifying as such a desire for united action must be to all of us, the Executive Committee cannot overlook the danger which may result from such concentration, by the increased demands it must make on the voluntary services of those who have hitherto so willingly labored for and with us in this good cause. The matter requires the most earnest and prayerful consideration ; as a false step in this direction may cripple the exertions of those faithful and earnest Churchmen who, in each of the Dioceses of our Church, are contending for the maintenance of scriptural teaching and the principles of sound Protestantism and Evangelical religion, as set forth in the Articles and Services of the Church of England, against the errors of Ritualism, Rationalism, and Romish superstitions.
