London, evening, 27th.—Official despatches from Madrid to-night contain the following:—The rebel forces under Gen. Searano and the Royal army under the Marquis of Novalischez are gradually approaching each other and it is probable that a decisive battle will soon take place. The Marquis asks for reinforcements. Gen. Prim is not well received by the other Rebel generals, and is carrying out his own plans without their co-operation. The Spanish Government has received reports that the rebels have been drawn from Alcoy in the province of Alicante. Madrid remains quiet. No revolutionary demonstrations have been made in the north-eastern provinces.

Madrid, 27th.—The insurgents have torn up the railway in the Sierra Moreno. Count Girgenti with his troops is compelled to remain in the mountain defles. Gen. Prim is expected at Barcelona to day, where the people are only awaiting its arrival to riss. Madrid and Siengoes are also rape for revolt. The vanguard of the army under Novalichez, numbering 3000, joined the insurgents, Novalichez in consequence is obliged to await reinforcements. A French equadron has arrived at Barcelona.

London. 27th.—A battle is hourly expected between Novalichez and Sersno near Cordova. The royalists lost over 600 in the fight at Santander, but sue-ceeded in regaining possession of the city. Gen. The New Militia Law---General Or-

The New Militia Law---General Orders.

The following appeared in the official Gazette of Saturday: Officers commanding corps of volunteers organized prior to the 1st of October, 1868 are notified that the following section of the Militia law which comes into force on that day must be complied with, within three months thereafter. Every volunteer corps duly authorized proviously to and existing on the day on which this Act shall come into force, including the officers thereto, shall, for the purpose of this Act, be held to be existing, and shall be continued as such subject to the provisions of this Act, and within three months after the day on which this Act shall come into force, all such corps shall be mustered by their captains or commanding officers. The provisions of this Act shall be explained to them, and such of the men as have not previously given notice of their desire to be discharged, shall take the oath hereinafter prescribed, and be re-enrolled as Volunteer Militia; and each man shall sign a muster roll, and thereafter such men of any Volunteer Corps in any regimental division as complete three years continuous service in such corps or contemplate three years including ny previous continuous service in the same corps, immediately before such muster, and are discharged after giving the required notice, shall not be liable to be balloted for any period of drill or training of the active militia, until all the other men in the first, second and third classes of militia men in the company division within which they reside have volunteered or been balloted to serve. Such men as re enroll within three months after the years, including their previous continuous service may be premitted to cut it the contract of the court the years, including their previous continuous service may be premitted to cut it the lst day of October to complete three years, including their previous continuous service, may be permitted to quit the corps should they desire to do so after their three years service shall have expired. Mr. O'Reilly would have very much liked to call Doyle, but by doing so he ran two risks—one, that he would deny all he had previously acknowledged; and the other, that his mouth would be shut by the Camerons the moment he entered the witness box. 
