Death of a Man Who Made \$10,000,000 in Mining Speculation.

San Francisco, July 18.—John Skag, once prominent in the list of California speculators, died on Friday. Skag ranked among the great mining speculators. Nearly all of his immense wealth melted away, as it was gained, in stock speculation.

Skag was a poor Hebrew boy, born in Canada, and came to California in 1857. He was employed as a telegraph operator in San Francisco. Afterward he was a clerk in the San Francisco waterworks office.
