A BLOODTHIRSTY FIEND.

John Imboden Brained His Sister and a Man Who Went to Defend Her—Hacked His Sister's Head.

Piedmont, N.Y., Oct. 16.—John Imboden, aged 23, of Reynolds County, killed his sister, brother and an old man who made his home with the Imbodens, on Wednesday afternoon.

Imboden brained his 15-year-old sister with an ax, and when Jacob Imboden interfered, he was brained with the same weapon. He then entered the house, and finding his 20-year-old brother sick in bed, struck him on the head with the ax and hacked his body to pieces.

Imboden then attacked two young sisters, but they escaped and ran to their father who was at work in a cornfield. The father spread the news among the neighbors, and the constable and a posse of farmers found Imboden in the yard. He defied arrest, but was finally caught.

Last May Imboden's wife and two young daughters died suddenly. It is now believed they were poisoned by the bloodthirsty fiend.
