

Whipping for Burglary

Ottawa, March 27.—(Special.)—By a military order issued to-day, Lieut. Robert Beckett, Canadian postal corps, has been given the local rank of captain in the Imperial army while employed in South Africa from Jan. 20, 1900.

No Amalgamation With C. P. R.—At a meeting of the Railway Committee to-day, the Brandon and Southwestern Railway bill, which was referred back from the Commons on a motion of Mr. Rutherford, to make provision to prevent the company amalgamating with the Canadian Pacific, was taken up. In the original charter of the Brandon and Southwestern, there was a clause providing for amalgamation. A clause was inserted in the bill, which provided that the road should not amalgamate with any other company. The bill, as amended, was referred to the committee.

The Redistribution Bill.—Contrary to expectation the senators debated the redistribution bill long and late to-day and the vote was not reached. All the arguments were advanced by members on both sides.

Macdonald Conservative Club.—At the meeting of the Macdonald Conservative Club, held last night in Temple Building, Mr. T. A. Hunt read an interesting paper on the condition of the agricultural implement trade in Canada. He showed by statistics that the reduction of the tariff from 25 to 20 per cent. has been detrimental to the trade. The blinder twine trade was also discussed. Mr. T. A. Hunt occupied the chair.

CHICAGO LABOR TROUBLES.

National Building Trades Council is Keeping Men Away From

Chicago, March 27.—The Record says: The National Building Trades Council has taken up the fight of the unions affiliated with the Chicago Building Trades Council. It has sent thousands of circulars all over the country, and has been successful in St. Louis, notifying members of the building trades of the trouble in Chicago. It is said the effect of the circulars has been to prevent the men from leaving Chicago, who otherwise would come here.

In the City Council last night, a resolution was passed authorizing the Mayor to appoint a committee of five citizens to try to effect a settlement of the differences between the Building Contractors' Council and the Building Trades Council.

Woman's World...

Devoted Especially to the Interests of our Women Readers.
Conducted by Katherine Leslie.

Cardinal Gibbons' recent pronouncement against the woman's rights movement in the United States will not, I fancy, trouble the ultra-progressive half so much as the opinion on the same subject of the well-known writer, Mary E. Wilkins, which was subsequently published in a New York paper. For, after all, Cardinal Gibbons, distinguished church dignitary though he be, is but a man, and women suffragists are not likely to be turned aside from their purpose because of "the man's opinion." It is hardly likely that they will hesitate to pour the cold Cardinal's views, when long ago they snuffed scornfully at the opinions of the Apostle Paul on the subject of the rights and prerogatives of women—who also had a man. But when a woman like Mary Wilkins, who is so well known and so endeared to thousands of readers, and whose influence is therefore great, comes out against the suffrage idea, then there is cause for anxiety and alarm. For it is the blow which comes from one's own that hurts a thousand times more bitterly than a keen stroke from an enemy. The latter may be looked for as a matter of course, but it is the unexpected support of one's own side that creates confusion and dismay. "I am not and never have been of that variety of women who spend their time in agitating for the right of suffrage, and I have never been a member of a woman's club," writes Mary Wilkins, "notwithstanding the fact that my name was used as a director in the new Boston Authors' Club." "Personally," she says further on, "I have never felt the need of more rights than the constitution of the United States has seen fit to grant me. But this is perfectly natural, since I am neither a property-holder nor the head of a family. Inactively, however, I recall from active participation in the variety of work which the enthusiastic worker in the cause of woman's rights deems necessary. I have always thought that the women whose names appear more often than others in the daily newspapers are sacrificing their womanhood on the altar of their conception of duty. I cannot hold with those women who preach that it is part and parcel of a woman's duty to her sex to agitate for her rights to the suffrage. I shrink from the idea of a woman mixing with the crowd of ordinary surrounding a voting place. Of course it might not be so bad in certain localities or towns, and I am firmly convinced that the American man would properly conduct himself in the presence of his woman kind, but there are polling places where the average American woman of voting age would not care to be seen, and then, again, for a woman to obtain the full value of her franchise, she must attend the caucuses. As these are invariably held in the evening, her privilege might eventually be obliged to give up many of her most delightful social duties, and if one stops to consider, the horizon of the woman of today is largely broadened by these.

"It seems to me—in the capacity of one who knows nothing at all about the principles underlying a woman's movement—that it has taken ages of civilization to grant to her, or she enters upon new fields, where the chances are perhaps more than even, that she would make a failure of it. Of the family side of the matter there is also much to be said. It does not need a knowledge of political technicalities or of the fundamental differences between the Republican and Democratic parties to understand that a married man does not, of his own choice, sanction the membership of his wife in either 'women's rights' clubs, or any other kind which will oblige her to give a greater or less portion of her time to outside interests. Culture of both man and woman can do and have done much in many ways to change the attitude of the sexes towards each other, but there are certain fundamental principles underlying all human relations which neither time nor culture can change. First of these, as it seems to me, is the duty a woman owes to her home, her husband and her family. No movement of any kind can be or should be more important to her than the welfare of these, and I am convinced that to the by far greater majority of American women the home and all it represents is first and foremost in all their thoughts and hopes. I do not mean that a woman should be 'housebound,' pure and simple, and indeed the American woman never had any idea of becoming such, to the exclusion of everything else. Her husband, father or brother would not let her be, and she wanted to be a happy medium, and she has found it. The ideal American woman of today is not only full partner in her home, but also in her husband's or father's business affairs, and they are the better for such a happy conclusion, and they know it. It is not to be wondered at, therefore, if
