

All the reports to be presented this morning tell of substantial increase in all departments. From them it is learned that the surplus at the end of 1899 in the relief fund reached \$208,047, an increase of nearly \$44,000 for the year. Of this sum \$50,000 is invested in Dominion Government stocks and \$90,000 is deposited in various Provincial chartered banks.

Increased Membership.

At the end of 1898 the membership was 18,132, and at the close of 1899 was 18,233, an increase of over 2000.

The receipts for the year on account of relief fund were \$159,380, and interest on bank balances and Government stock \$5777, making a total of \$165,166. During this period there were paid out in death claims, \$113,750; in disability claims, \$6000; transferred to the indemnity fund, \$1600; leaving a balance of nearly \$44,000 on the year's business. Satisfactory increase is also shown in other branches.


