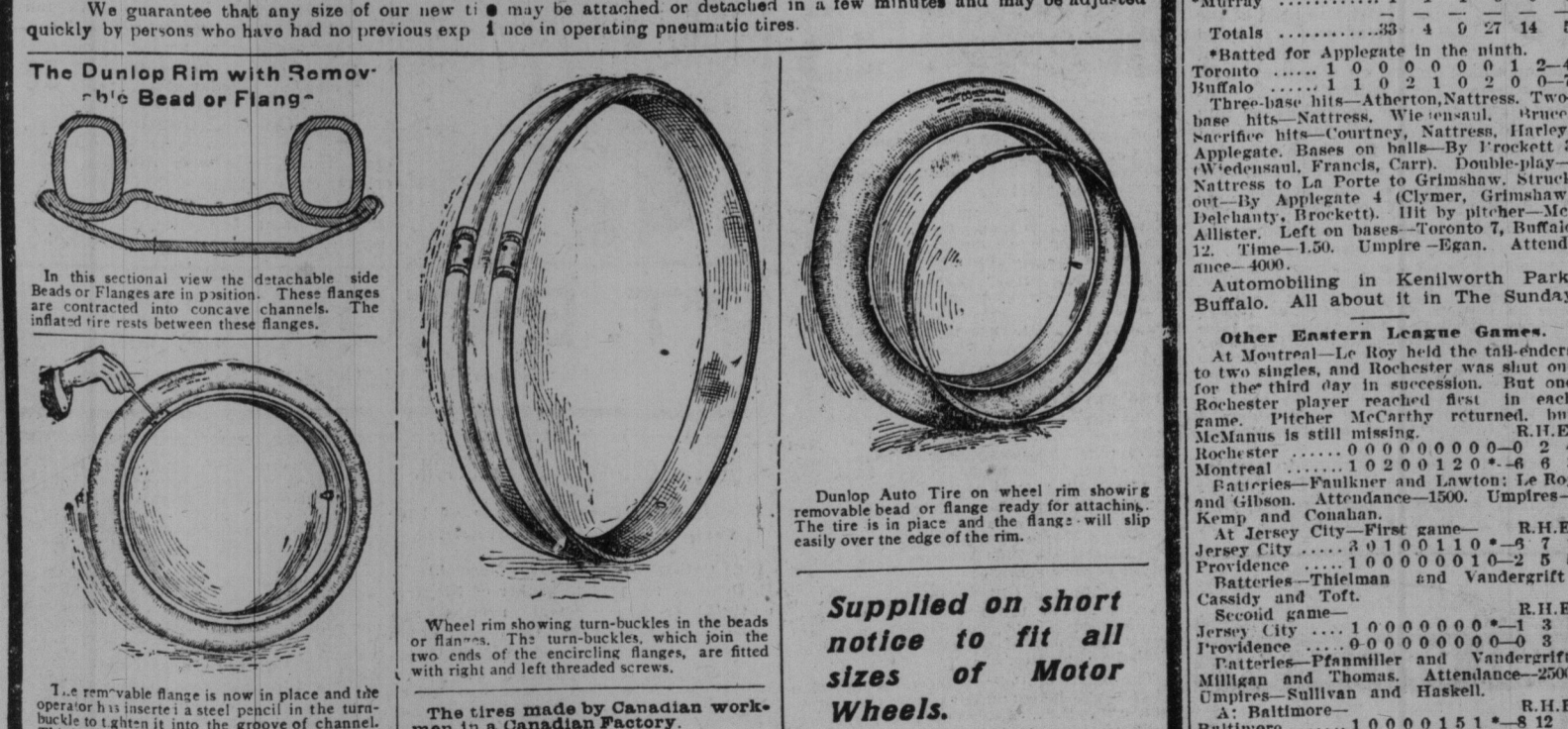

MAY BE ARRESTED SOON
INQUEST AGAIN ADJOURNED

Mrs. Butler and Harry Nokes Tell of the Coatsworth Nuts Couple.

The inquest on the body of the infant found in Coatsworth's Cut on Aug. 3 was resumed last night by Coroner Pickering, and adjourned for two weeks.

Mrs. Lillie S. Butler, 25 Forrest-road, who was the man, woman and child in the King-street car going to Munro Park, on Wednesday, Aug. 3, gave her evidence. It was a repetition of her story, as already published.

Mrs. Butler identified a portion of the clothing found on the dead child as that worn by the child she had seen on the car with the man and woman.

She thought the child was nearly a year old. After reaching the park, she took a rowboat and rowed away quickly from the shore. After going a considerable distance, the man rowed in one direction and then another, as if in doubt which way to go.

Mrs. Butler said she was under the impression that the man and woman were contemplating suicide. The woman wore a peculiar looking white bow in her hair.

The Two Babies. Harry Nokes, who rented the rowboat, retold his story. It did not differ from what has already been published. Witness thought that there was an Englishman or a Scotchman, who did not see him with a roll of money. He was not prepared to say whether the man he saw on the Wednesday was the same that he saw in the morgue.

Dr. Hutchinson, who made the post-mortem, in his report stated that there was a bruise on the right side of the head. There was no evidence of drowning. Death was caused by violence from the blow on the head.

May Be an Arrest Soon. The detective department is pretty certain that it is only a short time, perhaps only a few hours, before one or more arrests will be made. It is advanced that the man and woman may have been attached to a band of gypsies who have been visiting the smaller towns, and were for a week at the island. A young man says the description of the man and woman with the woman and the baby tallies with that of one of the gypsies who told his fortune on the Tuesday before their disappearance. 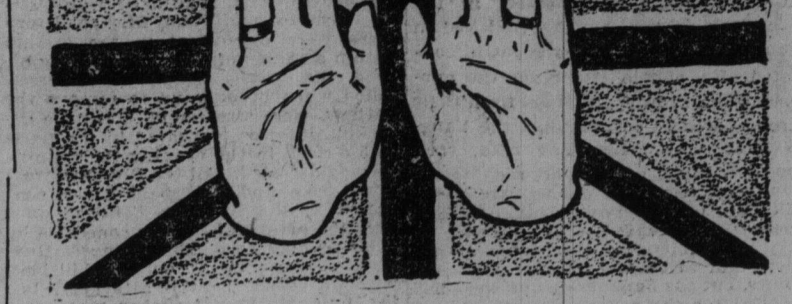
