

ANNOUNCEMENT

OF THE

FACULTY OF MEDICINE

Queen's College.

THE Faculty of Medicine of the University of Queen's College announce, that their third Session will commence on the first Monday of November, 1856, and continue till the end of April.

The following is the course of study required for the Degree of Doctor of Medicine :---

* Three months' Medical Jurisprudence and three Midwifery will be considered equivalent to the six months' course of Midwifery. The candidate for Graduation must have been at least FOUR YEARS engaged in the acquisition of professional knowledge; and, during that time, must have attended, for THREE SES-SIONS, Lectures in some recognized Medical School.

ONE YEAR engaged with a respectable medical practitioner, previous or subsequent to the THREE SESSIONS' attendance on lectures, will be equivalent to attending lectures a fourth session.

One Session, at least, must have been passed in this University; during which time all the above-named classes must have been attended.

The candidate will be required to give proof, previous to his examination, of his classical attainments*; and to present to the Faculty a Thesis, written by himself, on some medical subject.

He must be twenty-one years of age before receiving his Degree.

Certificates of attendance on Lectures will be received from any incorporated Medical School in the British dominions; and, also, from others recognized by the British Colleges. Other certificates of attendance on Lectures will be admitted at the discretion of the Medical Faculty.

spectus, or ical Schools ssion. The fees payable will be \$12 for each class; except Clinical Medicine and Surgery,* which will be \$6 each, and will entitle the Student to Hospital attendance.†

Attendance on two courses of any class entitles to a perpetual ticket.

The Graduation Fee is \$30, and the annual Matriculation Fee \$2.

A grant of money having been obtained from the Provincial Legislature, the Professors will be supplied with everything necessary to conduct the course with efficiency. A large increase of accommodation in Lecture Rooms, &c., will be afforded this sesson, by the Trustees of the College, to the Medical Faculty.

Abundant material will be supplied this Session, as it has been during the two past, for Practical Anatomy.[‡]

* Students attending the Surgical Clinique will have the benefit of the experience of Dr Thornton, Surgeon of the 9th Regiment; who will deliver a series of Lectures relative to the Surgery of the Crimean campaign.

† In the "Announcement" of last year, it was stated in a foot note that "Should any general arrangement be entered into by the Provincial Medical Schools, the same fees will be charged here as elsewhere; but no advance will be made on the fees above named to students matriculating here next session." Accordingly, a correspondence took place on the subject with other Upper Canadian Medical Schools, and the result has been the Tariff above. This change, however, cannot affect tho se who matriculated here last session; as the Faculty consider themselves bound by their previous announcement.

[‡] The Professor of Anatomy will be assisted in the Dissecting Room by Dr Meadows, one of the Assistant Surgeons of the 9th Opportunities will be afforded, in and out of Hospital, of studying Obstetrics practically.

Five Lectures a-week, each of an hour's duration, will be delivered by each Professor. An exception will be made in regard to Clinical Medicine and Surgery, which will be twice aweek.

A Weekly examination of the Classes will take place; such examination being equivalent to a Lecture.

Regular attendance on Lectures will be compulsory.

The University of Queen's College being incorporated by Royal Charter, those possessing its Degree in Medicine will be entitled to their Provincial License, to practise Physic, Surgery, and Midwifery, by presenting their Degree to a District Judge, identifying themselves on oath as the persons named therein, and paying \$4the fee now paid by British graduates in Medicine to the Provincial Secretary for a License to practice in the Province.

The attention of Parents and Guardians is directed to the fact, that it is the wish of the Faculty to place their students as far as possible under strict tutorial guidance. To such there-
