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EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

With the termination of another Association year, it becomes the duty of the Council to present a report for the consideration of the Annual Meeting, and as the year has been a successful one in every particular, the Council feels assured that the report will prove satisfactory to the members.

Reference must first be made to the Prize List and to the changes which it was deemed necessary to make in its arrangement.

The Council at its first meeting referred the whole question of prizes and conditions to the Executive Committee, and subsequently held a special meeting, at which the suggestions of the Committee were considered. As the result of the consideration, thus given to the subject, a programme was framed, the chief features of which were an addition to the number and value of the leading prizes in the several matches, making these prizes more worthy of keen competition; an alteration in the ranges of the All Comers and Provincial matches, by which these two became single range competitions, the one at 500 yards and the other at 600 yards; and the introduction of entrance fees, in all the matches, save that for the Prince of Wales Cup. The necessity of this last step had already been pointed out in the Council report of 1883. The only alternative was to reduce the total amount of the prize-money, but rather than take such a step backward, the Council felt that it should add to the receipts by imposing a further tax on the riflemen, in the form of entrance fees, though to no greater extent than would suffice to meet the year's expenses.

The want of side matches, in which members might fire when so disposed, was also in some measure supplied. Two extra series matches, one for Snider and one for Martini-Henry rifles, allowing of unlimited entries, were added to the programme, and notwithstand-

ing the lack of target accommodation, proved successful. It will be in the interest of the Association another year, to provide one or two additional targets for these matches, as they are likely to gain in favour with the competitors.

While on the subject of the Prize List, the Council would recognize the generosity of several persons who made contributions to it.

The Association's first debt is to the Hon. David McLellan. The offer made by him last year of a prize, has since taken the form of a valuable silver cup, and under the conditions printed in this year's programme, and which have received the donor's approval, it is now one of the most attractive of the Association's prizes. Such an evidence of interest in the association must awaken the hearty appreciation of the members.

To Lieut. Col. Maunsell are also due the thanks of the Association, for having shewn his old interest, by presenting once again a cup to go as first prize in the Nursery Match. Like those which he has presented in former years, this cup will be to the winner a pleasent memento of the time when he took his place among the first prize winners at the Provincial Meetings.

From the St. Stephen Rifle Club, the Association received a silver Ice Pitcher, as a prize in the Extra Series Match. It together with prizes presented by J. S. Neil, J. D. Fowler and M. S. Hall, of Fredericton, Major Markham and Messrs. Page, Smalley & Ferguson, of Saint John, were placed in the Martini Match, and had the effect of making that match more interesting and much more successful than it would otherwise have been.

To these several contributors the Council gratefully acknowledge the Association's obligation.

It should also be mentioned that His Excellency the Governor-General has honored the Association by continuing the yearly gift of a silver and bronze medal, such as were received from his predecessors the Earl of Dufferin and the Marquis of Lorne.

The Dominion Meeting having been fixed for the 1st of September, Tuesday the 19th of August was necessarily selected for the annual gathering at Sussex, though a little earlier than was desirable. Favoured once more with exceptionally pleasant weather the meeting passed off agreeably and rapidly. In point of attendance it was the most successful meeting for some years, the number competing in no

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of September, r the annual irable. Favthe meeting ce it was the peting in no

match being lower than 94, and in the Association match reaching as high as 103, the largest figure since 1872.

This increase was, in some measure, due to the presence of a contingent from the Infantry School Corps, stationed at Fredericton. Being a permanent organization, it may confidently be hoped that each year will see this Company furnishing recruits to the shooting ranks of the Association.

The presentation of prizes was made on Friday afternoon, but, as usual, had to be hurried through with to enable the competitors to leave by the Intercolonial train. It is much to be regretted that the presentation should thus be made with so little ceremony, and be so lightly regarded by the competitors.

A question having arisen during the matches as to the terms, if any, governing the final winning of the Domville Cup, and there being no Association record of any terms, the question was referred, by the Executive Committee, to the donor himself. It will henceforth be understood that the cup is a permanent Association prize to be held for the year by the winner and competed for at each ensuing

The proceedings of the Association in 1883, and with them the shooting returns of the County Rifle Associations were printed in the

A return of the Sussex shooting was made to the National Rifle Association and appears in its annual report.

Twelve Martini-Henry Rifles, part of those recently sent out to the Dominion Association by the N. R. A., have been loaned to this There are thus some 30 M. H. Rifles at the disposal of the Council. Those which have not already been issued are in store at St. John and can be obtained for practice until next season.

The accounts of the Secretary-Treasurer are submitted with the remarks of the Audit Committee thereon. As far as they go they show a small balance in favour of the Association, though in reality there remains unpaid an account of Wyon London of \$71.50 for medals, which had to be obtained to wipe out two year's indebtedness to the affiliated Associations.

It will be seen that the Dominion Grant of \$1300 and the Provincial Grant of \$300 were duly received. The former amount was devoted to the Prize List and the necessary expenses of the Sussex competition.

The grant of \$300 was used to defray the expenses of our Team to Ottawa, and the Council has much pleasure in submitting the report of the Captain of that Team. This report shows that this Province was represented by men who were well able to uphold the credit of New Brunswick, and to return laden with prizes won in competition with the best shots of the Dominion; and won with the highest scores that have ever been made in a Dominion competition.

This is a great satisfaction to the Council, and they are sure it will be appreciated by the Government of the Province, which has so generously aided in sending this Team, to know that the honour of the Province has been so well sustained.

In addition to the other successes of the year the Canadian Team has again carried off the Kolapore Cup at Wimbledon, after a sharp competition with the picked teams of Great Britian and India, and we are proud to have had one of our New Brunswick members on the winning eight.

AUDITORS' REPORT.

SAINT JOHN, N. B., 1st October, 1884.

SIR, -We beg leave to report that we have examined the Accounts submitted to us by the Secretary-Treasurer of the Association, for the past year, together with the vouchers, which we have found correct. The Accounts shew an income of \$2,495 63, which includes a balance of \$22.48 from the preceding year. The expenditure has been \$2,473.60, leaving a balance on hand of \$22.03 in cash. We find also on hand Martini Ammunition, worth \$54, and Snider, worth \$40, making in all \$116.03, and the Association owes Wyon \$71.50 and Venning, for engraving, about \$25, which after being liquidated would leave net balance of \$20.

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OTTAWA TEAM REPORT.

SAINT JOHN, N. B., September 30th, 1884.

SIR,—Through having been once again honored with the Captaincy of the Ottawa Team, it becomes once again my privilege to prepare and submit the Prize Return and Report which constitute the record of the Team's doings. What may truly be called the great success of the Team does away, however, with the necessity of anything but the briefest report. The Prize Return will be found to furnish a sufficient, as well as a gratifying, statement of what the team accom-

The annual visit to the Dominion Wimbledon is evidently growing in the favour of New Brunswick's rifle shots for the contingent this year numbered twenty-eight, the strongest, numerically, that has attended from the Province since the meetings have been held at Ottawa. The mere fact of this yearly competition with the crack shots of Canada, apart from all else, has this in it, at least, that it must result in the continued gain of the experience that is necessary

If what I ventured to suggest in my report of last year is correct, viz: "that the success most to be welcomed is that gained in representative matches," the Association has indeed cause to rest satisfied with the year's record, for in this particular it excels that of all previous years. In four of the five competitions, teams from this Province held places; the 71st Battalion Team, third place in the Battalion Match, with a score of 405, or an average of 81 points per man; the 8th Cavalry Skirmishing Team, fifth place in the Gzowski Military Match and second place in the British Shield Skirmishing Match; last of all and chiefest, the New Brunswick "eight," first place in the Provincial Match for the London Merchant's Cup, a signal success at any time, but rendered especially so this year by the fact that it was a repetition of the victory which befell the Province in the same competition last year.

On that occasion we were constrained to feel that the winning of the top position was greatly owing to good fortune at the 500 yard range, but the score of 423, which gave us the place this year was made on a fair field with no favour. The total is historically interesting as being the highest yet registered in this match.

I may here appropriately suggest what I know would be greatly appreciated by the winning "eights," viz: that this Association follow the example of Quebec and present to the members of each "eight," a London Merchant's arm badge, to serve in each case, as a token that the wearer was a member of a victorious team.

But I am able to make reference to individual, as well as to team success. In what is known as the MacDougall Match Sergeant O'Shaughnessy, A. Co. Infantry School Corps, deservedly became the winner of Lady MacDougall's Cup and first prize, with an H. P. S. score of 50 points, 25 at 400 yards and 25 at 600 yards. This is the first time that the cup has come to New Brunswick since the Dominion Matches were shot at Fredericton and at Halifax, though it bears on itself the evidence of having been secured by New Brunswicker's on those two occasions.

Lieut. Kirkpatrick, third in the MacDougall Match, Staff Sergeant Winter, second in the Minister of Militia's Match, Sergeant Loggie, second and third in the two series of the Hamilton Powder Matches, Sergeant Langstroth, third in the A series, and Lieut. E. A. Smith, second in the 800 yard extra series, complete the list of high places taken in individual competitions.

The aggregate scores of five members gave them prizes in the Grand Aggregate, so the Province had a good representation in the Governor General's fifty, and now, with two in the first twenty, perhaps its fair representation on the Wimbledon Team.

These five did not succeed in capturing any of the valuable Lansdowne prizes, but, much to the satisfaction of all New Brunswickers present, an officer, who has hardly yet ceased to be a New Brunswick representative, Captain Perley, came in third. We had every pleasure at his good fortune, short of claiming it for the team and for the Province.

By reason of the 8th Cavalry Team taking part in the Military matches, all the members from this Province were rendered eligible for the special Provincial prizes, offered by the Marquis of Lorne for competition amongst the representatives of the various outlying Provinces.

The prizes open to New Brunswick men were three in number, of the respective value of \$50, \$30, and \$20, and were shot for at 200 yards in heavy marching order, though it was originally intended that Private I 8th Caval

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they should be shot for at disappearing targets. Private F. McMillan, Saint John Rifles; Sergeant G. Langstroth, The winners were 8th Cavalry; and Lieut. S. Langstroth, 74th Battalion.

The Dominion Meeting of 1884 will be a memorable one, because of the exceptionally high scoring which prevailed throughout the matches. In the three opening competitions, an average of inners failed to win prizes, and in the 500 and 600 yard match, and also in the one at Queen's Ranges, scores of within four of inners were counted out. This high average was very marked in the aggregate totals, the highest of which was sixteen points in excess of the winning aggregate of last year, whilst the fiftieth total of this year, had it been made in 1883, would have taken second place. The chief cause of this improvement was the alterations which since last year have been made in the range itself. The whole line of targets has been carried back giving a level prospect at 500 yards, and bringing the 600 yard firing points forward to the very edge of the hill. changes have made it almost another, and certainly a much better

If there is one thing entering into our Ottawa experience which we can recall with pleasure, it is the good feeling which, year by year, is on all sides shown us. On the part of the officers of the Association, it takes the form of a kind attention to our wants, and on the part of our fellow competitors, the form of hearty congratulation at our success. The riflemen who assemble at Ottawa are properly animated by a Provincial feeling to gain all honour for their respective Provinces, but, apart from that, their mutual bearing is that of fellow members of the same Militia Force.
