TWENTY-SECOND SESSION,

(Being the Fifth under the Act of Incorporation of 1874.)

FIRST DAY.

The Synod was convened in London, on Tuesday, June 17th, 1879.

Morning Prayer was said in the Chapter House, commencing at 10 A. M.

The Ordination Service began at II A. M., when the Bishop admitted six candidates to the Diaconate, and advanced eight Deacons to the Order of the Priesthood.

The Sermon was preached by the Bishop of Toronto, from St. Luke, iv., 32.

The Holy Communion was administered by the Bishop to the Clergy and Lay Representatives.

The Synod assembled at 2:30 P. M. in the Chapter House.

The Lord Bishop in the chair.

The customary prayers having been offered by the Dean, the rolls of the Clergy and Lay Representatives were called by the respective Secretaries, when 89 Clergymen and 73 Lay Delegates answered to their names.

The balloting papers were, in accordance with Canon XXX., distributed to the Clerical and Lay members of the Synod as their names were called.

Election of Secretaries.

The Bishop informed the Synod that he had requested the Rev. J. B. Richardson, Rector of the Cronyn Memorial Church, London, to act as Clerical Secretary, since the elevation of the Ven. Archdeacon Sweatman to the See of Toronto, in accordance with the provision of Section 18 of the Constitution. He had pleasure in testifying to the willingness of Mr. Richardson to act ad interim in that capacity, for which he felt grateful; and, while he did not wish to interfere with the Synod in their choice of a Clerical Secretary, he deemed it his duty and pleasure to inform the Synod that Mr. Richardson had manifested such an ability and efficiency in this department, that he only hoped who ever might be appointed would be equal to him.

It seems but as yesterday that I took leave of you in June last to visit the Mother Country, and yet in reality another entire year has passed away since we last met as a Synod. Many and great have been the temporal and spiritual blessings which the Giver of all Good has bestowed upon each and all of us. May we truly appreciate His unfailing goodness, and yield Him in the future a more loving and devoted service. May the rapid flight of time remind us all of the imperative necessity of "so numbering our days that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom," remembering that at no distant period the hour cometh in which "no man can work."

LAMBETH CONFERENCE.

One of the objects that I had in view in visiting England was the attendance at the Lambeth Conference, which was convened by His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, and attended by one hundred Bishops of the English, American and Colonial Churches. We trust that much good will ultimately result from such a brotherly gathering. I only regret that I was unable to be present at the commencement of the Conference; but what I was permitted to witness in connection with it impressed me deeply with the conviction that these periodical meetings of the Chief Pastors in the different branches of the Anglican Communion, might be made subservient, under God, for the maintenance and diffusion of those pure Gospel principles for which the Reformers of our Church suffered martyrdom.

I would notice first, in connection with the Conference, the marked respect which was deservedly paid to the Presiding Prelate, His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury; his years, his learning, his experience. His long, devoted, and able services as a follower of the Chief Shepherd and Bishop of our souls, and his severe domestic afflictions, endured with such Christian fortitude, alike entitled him to the affectionate respect of his assembled brethren. But it is as the unfaltering champion of the all-sufficiency of the Holy Scriptures; the

earnest advocate of the principles of the Reformation and the purity and simplicity of worship; and the uncompromising opponent of all Romanizing tendencies, that he merits the admiration and respect of all true members of the church.

The various able reports presented by the several Committees were, many of them, of the deepest interest and importance, and will have been read by all with much thankfulness and appreciation.

In regard to the warm sympathy expressed towards the churches and individuals protesting against the pretensions and errors of the Church of Rome, the distinct proclamation delivered as to "the sufficiency and supremacy of the Holy Scriptures as the ultimate rule of faith," and the deliberate reiteration of the principles of our Reformed Church on the subject of "Confession," &c., &c., it will be a source of the sincerest satisfaction to many anxious minds that in the Episcopal Council at Lambeth there was no uncertain sound as to the maintenance—under all circumstances, and at any cost—both of the integrity of the faith and the Protestant character of our worship. Let us thank God and take courage.

I may observe here, that during may stay in England I had many opportunities of noticing the condition of the Church in the Mother Country, and estimating the extent of the efforts that are being made by every school of thought with a view of meeting the spiritual necessities of all classes of the community, and to ameliorate the condition of the ignorant, the abandoned and the destitute. Whatever opinions may have been formed in in times past, as to the value of the Church of England, as the chief instrument under God for the moral and spiritual advancement of the Empire; and however speedy the downfall predicted for her by those who envied her temporal privileges, or feared her restraining influence, there is no room for doubt at the present time, in any candid mind, that she is one of the noblest and mightiest bulwarks of divine truth, and the acknowledged leader in every Protestant Christian enterprise both at home and abroad. There is an amount of zeal, energy, liberality and self-denial exercised by her godly ministers and laity, which is beyond all praise, and on which we may confidently look for the Divine blessing. Indeed, intense earnestness is the prominent feature in the church life of to-day in the "old country," and in this respect we, her offspring, may do well to emulate the noble example her clergy and laity present to us.

During my stay in England I was requested by the Lord Bishop of London to represent him in a confirmation tour through the above-named countries. I was glad to have the opportunity, not only of being of service to so excellent a prelate, but also of visiting those interesting countries, and observing not only the condition of the brethren of our own communion in those lands, but also the state of religion generally. It was gratifying to notice, as far as our own brethren were concerned, the provision made for their spiritual oversight and instruction. Owing to the efforts mainly of "The Colonial and Continental Church Society," chaplains are stationed at all the chief places of resort on the part of English Church members. The ministrations of these Godly ministers of the Gospel are not only an unspeakable comfort to invalids and other travellers separated from their homes and home privileges, but they are a testimony in those countries to the purity of the Gospel, and to the great zeal and activity of English Churchmen; and are the means also of making them acquainted with the Scriptural character and beautiful simplicity of our liturgical worship.

I can bear testimony to the admiration expressed, almost universally, by those Protestant populations for the church which I had the privilege of representing on that occasion. I feel sure that such intercourse on the part of our English Bishops must have a tendency to knit together those various portions of the Church of Christ on earth in closer and more intimate fellowship.

We should see in all such spectacles the types of that full and complete communion of the saints of God which will be hereafter consummated in the presence of the glorified Redeemer.

THE WESTERN UNIVERSITY.

We trust that this Institution, which has already engaged so large an amount of public interest and attention, will soon be a living reality. This enterprise has thus far been owned and blessed of God; and I feel sure it will be gratifying to you to learn that sufficient progress has been made in connection with this important undertaking as to leave its final establishment, humanly speaking, no longer a matter of doubt, and to render the completion of the work merely a question of time.

Independent of the sums subscribed in this Diocese, it is a cause of great gratification to me that I am able to report that a sum of over thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) has already been subscribed by our English friends. When we consider the depressed financial condition of the Mother Country at the time of my visit, and the very many appeals from other Colonial Bishops for their respective dioceses, I think you will agree with me that the sum subscribed represents an amount of sympathy and interest in this effort which may well encourage us to hope for a larger measure of support in the near future. In view of this external assistance which has been extended to us, it must surely be seen that it is incumbent that we, on our part, should do our very utmost to speed on the work. The grant of two thousand pounds (£2,000) so generously bestowed by "The Society for the Promotion of Christian Knowledge," will naturally be expected to stimulate the home effort; and the best proof we can give of our worthiness to be aided in this, as in all our church movements, is to be found ready to devote our personal time, strength and substance, wherever and whenever we may be called upon to do so.

Whilst, then, in regard to this enterprise, we are prepared to see some little time elapse while we are gathering together the materials for its consummation, we can look forward with confidence to the time when in this Diocese men of scholarly ability, high culture and ministerial zeal and fidelity will not have to seek, cap in hand, for academic honors at the doors of distant Universities, where their talent and worth are neither known nor appreciated; but where in this, our Cathedral City of London, those legitimate honors which are due to the scholar and the divine may be righteously and inexpensively awarded.

That every Christian who is zealous for the efficiency and intellectual condition of the communion to which he belongs should contribute generously to this end, we have no manner of doubt. The great educational work carried forward by our Presbyterian friends in Kingston at this time, for which we award them all possible honor and praise, should stimulate us to redoubled exertions.

Many of our brethren, I have no doubt, will be very glad to hear that our old friend, the Rev. John Hurst, late Assistant Secretary of the Colonial and Continental Church Society, is so deeply in sympathy with us in this great and good work,

that he has most unselfishly placed his services at my disposal, with a view of helping forward our good cause amongst our friends in England, where he is now prosecuting the work I commenced. He will in due time (D. V.) return to this Diocese, which he loves and delights to serve. In this country our valued friend, the Rev. John Gemley, will continue his labors for the University. Let me commend him, beloved brethren, to your warm and cordial support.

IMPORTANT ECCLESIASTICAL CHANGES AND EVENTS DURING THE PAST YEAR.

The past year has been one of the most eventful in the general history of the church in this Dominion that has ever been known.

Among the most important of these, I may notice the resignation of the Most Reverend Bishop Oxenden, the late Metropolitan of Canada. By the retirement of this godly man and most exemplary Bishop (whose practical religious works are read and appreciated wherever the church exists), this country not only lost a wise and loving administrator, but the office of Metropolitan, hitherto supposed to be attached to the See of Montreal, has, by the mutual consent of that Diocese and the Province, been placed upon a different footing, and one which, perhaps, will afford more general satisfaction to the church at large.

In the present Metropolitan, the Lord Bishop of Fredericton, the senior Bishop of Canada, the church will recognise one who, by reason of his age and experience, is well fitted worthily to fill the exalted and responsible position.

THE BISHOP OF MONTREAL.

In the recently elected Bishop of Montreal—Dr. Bond—we have the satisfaction of recognising one who, by his long and faithful ministry in this country, as well as by his administrative capacity, displayed not only in pastoral, but in various kinds of missionary work, is eminently constituted to fill the position with honor to himself and acceptance on the part of those under his spiritual oversight and care.

THE LATE BISHOP OF TORONTO.

In the removal of the late venerable and amiable Bishop of Toronto—Dr. Bethune—from the scene of his earthly labors,

we recognize another marked event in our Canadian Church history; the more striking, perhaps, in our eyes, inasmuch as it led, in the course of Divine Providence, to the elevation to the vacant See of one who had for some years filled a succession of most important positions in our own Diocese and in whom I have always found a loyal, faithful friend and co-operator in every good word and work. Most keenly do I feel my loss, personally and otherwise, in his removal from among us. It is a comfort, however, to know that he is a great gain to the church in our sister diocese, and that he is still bound to us by the ties of Christian love and friendship; and that we shall occasionally be cheered with his presence and counsel to advance the cause of our common Lord in this Diocese. I am confident you will join heartily with me in invoking the blessing of our Heavenly Father upon him, that his episcopate may be owned and blessed of God in every department of the Church's work. Rarely have so many changes in regard to the Episcopate in this country taken place within so brief a period. It is our comfort to know that they are all in the direction of Him who moveth about "in the midst of the seven golden candlesticks, and holdeth the seven stars in His right hand."

OBITUARY.

It is with the deepest sorrow that I also draw your attention to the gaps that have been made in the ranks of our own Diocesan dergy during the past year, four of these having been summoned from the scene of this their earthly labors to their heavenly home.

The Rev. B. Bayly, well known in this city and throughout this section, as the Head Master of our High School in this city, was a striking instance of high talent and laborious effort, allied to a quiet, unostentatious and truly Christian disposition—ever ready to assist his brethren in the ministry, and much esteemed wherever known for his high Christian character and genial courtesy.

In the decease of Revs. W. H. Halpin and A. Zimmerman, we have also to deplore the loss of two of our clergy, whose scholarly attainments reflected honor upon the Diocese to which they belonged; whilst in the removal of the Rev. J. Padfield we are called upon to mourn the loss of an old and faithful missionary of the Cross. In the early demise of the

Rev. W. Logan, Rural Dean of North Middlesex, we have sustained a serious loss. One of the first to enter Huron College, he gave early promise of a bright and useful career, and his subsequent life showed this promise to have been well founded. As an earnest and zealous worker in the cause of Christ, and a loyal son of the Church, he was greatly beloved by his brethren, the clergy, as well as by myself. In all these dispensations we should recognize the uncertainty of human life, and the need of throwing ourselves more devotedly into the work to which we have been called of God; remembering that we may soon be summoned to give an account of our stewardship, and that "the night cometh when no man can work."

SUPERANNUATED CLERGY.

The additions which have lately been made to the number of our superannuated clergy prove the wisdom of that course of procedure recently effected by the adoption of Canon xxvii.

"On the Appropriation of the Commutation Fund." In thus providing for our aged and infirm clergy, when they are no longer able to discharge their duty, we not only benefit the actual recipients, but take a burden of care from many a faithful laborer in the field, while the fact that the Church is now mindful of her duty in this respect, will increasingly secure the energies and devotion of her clergy in the discharge of their onerous and important duties.

ORDINATION.

Last year it was my privilege to hold the largest ordination that ever took place in the Canadian Church. Nine were ordained Deacons, and seven were advanced to the Priesthood.

This morning we had another gratifying sight of witnessing the setting apart to the Ministry of the Gospel, a number of godly and faithful soldiers of the cross, ready and well prepared to enter the field of the Lord as laborers, and determined to work loyally for the Master who called them into His vineyard. Six were ordained Deacons, and eight were advanced to the Priesthood: Such accessions from time to time to the ranks of our clergy must greatly cheer the heart of every Christian who is anxious for the extension of the Redeemer's Kingdom.

Let us thank God, and not cease to pray that all those who have been ordained to the Ministry of the Word, may be endued with heavenly grace, and prove themselves, everywhere, able Ministers of the New Testament.

DIOCESAN WORK.

Without entering, on this occasion, upon any detailed account of diocesan and parochial work, I am thankful to state—in a general way—that, with very few exceptions, all our parishes and missions are supplied with the ministrations of the Church. This must be regarded as an encouraging sign, not only of a present vigorous vitality, but, I trust, of the near approach of a day when, by a more prosperous condition of the country—of which we can see the dawn already—the church in this Diocese will not only be better able liberally to support her clergy, but take the lead in this Dominion in carrying the Gospel into "regions beyond." May God give us grace to recognise and fulfil the increasing responsibility which an increasing ability imposes.

MINISTERIAL USEFULNESS.

In order to real ministerial usefulness, the indispensable requisites are personal religion and faithfulness in the discharge of pastoral duties. No mere external decorum; no attention to the mere ex-officio duties of the clerical profession will avail for the good of souls, unless there is spiritual life, and the mind of Christ seen in the minister, and he be a man who has himself experienced a change of heart by the power of the Holy Ghost. Personal spiritual religion in the heart and life of a minister is essential to the spiritual life and prosperity of his flock. A lifeless minister will have a lifeless flock. The secret of his service and the surest augury of his success is that his labor must be a labor of love. "Simon Peter," says the Saviour, "lovest thou me?" As the proper consequence of this love, the charge which he subjoins is, "Feed my sheep." Look at what the Master requires of His followers and laborers in his vineyard, and see whether nature is equal to the task without the animating principle—"love." "The love of Christ constraineth us." Let us remember that the charge given by the Chief Shepherd to Peter is equally given to us—"Feed my sheep." Let us "be instant in season and out of season," in pressing upon men-not only from the

pulpit, but from house to house—the things which belong to their peace. Let us, according to our ordination vows, which are upon us, "never cease our labor, our care and diligence, until we have done all that lieth in our power to bring all such as are or shall be committed to our charge into that agreement in the faith and knowledge of God, and to that ripeness and perfectness of age in Christ, that there be no place left among them either for error in religion or for viciousness in life." Let us, according to the same vows, "apply ourselves wholly to this one thing, draw all our cares and studies this way, and use public and private monitions and exhortations, as well to the sick as to the whole within our cures."

I am sure you will agree with me that the prosperity of a parish depends, under God, upon the personal piety, zeal, sound doctrine and holiness of life of the minister who has given himself in earnest to the ministry of the Gospel, determined out of the fulness of his own heart to preach "the unsearchable riches of Christ;" preach Him and Him crucified, as "the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth." mistake on the doctrine of the perfect atonement of Christ would be fatal to the end for which the ministry was established, and no external attention to duty can compensate for such a mistake. In order successfully to feed and keep together the flock of Christ, the pastor must live and labor amongst his people. The visits of the faithful pastor will not be few and far between, and the occasion of idle, or frivolous, or fault-finding gossip; but he will strive to render his visits always of a pastoral character, and the means of spiritual profit. When practicable he will read a portion of God's Word, with devotional exercises suitable to the necessities of those thus visited. Again, in such visitations he will avail himself of every opportunity, if needed, to allay dissensions in his parish, inculcating and practicing that "charity which thinketh no evil;" he will stimulate his people to increased efforts in the furtherance of every good word and work; and he will draw their attention to the great field of missionary operations, in which it is well his people should be led to feel a deep interest if they are to aid in any appreciable degree in their successful accomplishment. The careful and frequent study of the ordination service will enable the minister of Christ to keep before him his solemn duty in all these respects. He will see that it is incumbent upon him to guard his people from all

false doctrine, and unfold to them the simplicity of the truth as it is in Christ Jesus. He will see also that it is incumbent upon him by faithful, sound Gospel teaching, kindly sympathetic intercourse, and considerate guidance and counsel, to keep his flock united as the family of Christ, striving together to do the Master's will, and exhibit in his deportment whose he is and whom he seeks to serve. I feel sure, my brethren, from my knowledge of you and of your work in the past, that by the Grace of God you will continue your efforts, not only to further to the utmost of your ability, the spiritual well-being of the flocks committed to your trust, but will also endeavor to advance the cause of Christ in the Diocese of your love and choice, and in the Church of God at large.

TO THE LAITY.

And to you, my brethren of the Laity, I must also address a few words of friendly counsel and exhortation. Never, perhaps, was there a time when, as a rule, the Laity have taken a deeper interest in the Church, and exercised a wider influence in all its concerns. Your very presence here to-day is an evidence of this. But I would earnestly entreat you fully to appreciate the purpose for which you are invited to take part in this important council of the Church. We are aware that there are those who take very low views of this matter, and who entertain most erroneous opinions upon the subject. They imagine a kind of antagonism between the Clergy and Laity. They deem you are here to keep a suspicious eye upon those who minister to you in the Lord; they would bid you, above all, be careful, as Laity, to see that the rights and privileges of your order are maintained. I need not remind most of you, my brethren, of the fallacy of such views as to your position, and your course of action. Many of you, who have sat in council with us here, year after year, and to whom we have been indebted for faithful advice, clear judgment, and generous co-operation and support in all our church work, have a better appreciation of your position and duty as members of this Synod. You know well there should be no antagonism between the Ministry and members of the Church of Christ, but a loving inter-dependence and generous sympathy and hearty co-operation.

On mo suspended t legislate; but for the Church as a whole, as the spiritual body of Christ. Think of the responsibility, as well as of the power, committed to you. If you are indeed the keepers of the treasury of the Church, you will be held responsible for the generous and liberal exercise of this power. By a kindly care for the welfare of those who minister to you, and by a considerate and delicate appreciation of their peculiar position and claims upon your regard, you will so bind them to you in affection and concern for your spiritual advancement, that no question will, on either part, be allowed to intervene, and cause mutual distrust and suspicion. It is only when bishops, presbyters, and laity alike, are thus united in common concern for the general welfare, and on behalf of the progress and prosperity of the Church, that we can hope for God's blessing upon our labors.

The general prosperity of our Diocese calls for our gratitude to Him from whom alone every good and every perfect gift cometh; and if He be for us, who can be against us? To him we will ascribe all the praise, and honor, and glory; and whose gracious promise to be with His Church always, even unto the end of the world, is sufficient to sustain and cheer us in our labors to advance His Kingdom.

I cannot conclude this address without thanking you, my reverend brethren and brethren of the Laity, from the very bottom of my heart for your continued uniform kindness to me personally, and for your loyal co-operation with me officially in my efforts to advance the best interests of the Church in this Diocese. I appreciate and value such encouragements more than I can tell you, and I thank God for all this. My fervent prayer is that the Holy Spirit of Grace and Power may keep us united in Christian love; that we all may be built up together into one Holy Temple, and on the one only foundation, Jesus Christ our Lord, and that "in all our works begun, continued and ended in Him, we may glorify His holy name, and finally by His mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

Resolved—That in view of the memorial annually addressed to this Synod by the Dominion Temperance Alliance, upon which hitherto no definite action has been taken, the members of this Synod now desire to show that they have a warm interest in the claims of the Temperance cause in this Diocese, and do therefore pledge themselves to exert their personal influence towards the establishment in their own parishes, upon a permanent basis, of a branch of the Church of England Temperance Society; and that they do now form themselves, for the furtherance of this object, into a Diocesan Society according to the constitution of the Parent Society in England.

Foreign Missions.

The Synod, at the suggestion of the Bishop, appropriated to the mission work of the Diocese of Algoma the sum of \$553.49, being the offertories made on the Day of Intercession, December, 1878, and the sum of \$150.56 to the Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews, being the half of the sum for Foreign Missions derived from the collections at the Annual Missionary Meetings.

Explanation.

The Bishop explained that, in accordance with the Pastoral of the House of Bishops, the offertories made on the recent Day of Intercession in May last would be devoted to the Missionary Diocese of Algoma.

BUSINESS REFERRED BY STANDING COMMITTEE.

Report of Committee on Canons.

The Committee present the following report:

1. ON PROPOSED CANON ON CLERGYMEN ENTERING THE DIO-CESE OVER FIFTY YEARS OF AGE. (By the Bishop.)

Referred to Canon Committee by last Synod.

The Committee recommend that the following be adopted as a Canon:

No Clergyman hereafter entering the Diocese, either by ordination or by transfer from another Diocese, being at the time more than fifty years of age, shall share in the benefits of either the Superannuation or the Widows' and Orphans' Fund before he has served ten years in this Diocese.

2. ON THE QUESTION OF PATRONAGE.

Referred to Canon Committee by last Synod.

The Committee having examined the mode of Patronage adopted by the other Dioceses of Ontario and Quebec, and the plan now in force in the Irish Church, and having compared these and considered the whole question with reference to our position in this Diocese, and having also considered the resolution of the Rev. Mr. Bartlett, moved at the last Synod, propose that the following be substituted for the existing Canon on Patronage.

CANON ON PATRONAGE.

PARISHES RECEIVING NO AID FROM THE MISSION FUND.

Wherever a vacancy shall occur in any self-sustaining Parish or Mission, by the death, resignation or removal of the Clergyman, the Churchwardens and the Lay Delegates for the time being shall be a Committee to wait upon the Bishop; the said Committee shall first satisfy the Bishop that all arrears of salary that may be due to the late Incumbent have been provided for, and that satisfactory arrangements have been made for the salary of the future Incumbent; the Bishop shall then present the name of one Clergyman to the Committee, and if no valid objection be made, he may be appointed to such vacant Parish or Mission; and should valid objection to such name be raised, a second name shall be presented, and so on until a selection be made.

PARISHES RECEIVING AID FROM THE MISSION FUND.

In all vacancies in Parishes or Missions receiving grants from the Mission Fund, the appointment shall rest exclusively with the Bishop.

And the Standing Committee shall have power, with the consent of the Bishop, to dispense with the services of any Clergyman, upon giving six months' notice in writing or six months' salary.

Proviso.—This Canon shall not apply to the Crown Rectories, the patronage of which shall continue as heretofore, to be vested in the Bishop, as provided by Canon X.

3. ON PROPOSED ALTERATION IN ART. 3 OF CONSTITUTION, AND CANON 19 (formerly Canon 23). By Ven. J. W. Marsh.

Referred to Canon Committee by Standing Committee.

- (1) To amend Article 3 of the Constitution:
- 3. The Lay Representatives shall be Communicants of at least one year's standing, and shall be elected annually, during Easter week, by each duly organized Congregation, from among their own number, at a meeting legally convened; and it shall be the duty of the Wardens of each Congregation to provide a book in which each member of the Congregation, of the full age of twenty-one years, shall subscribe his name as being a member of the [United] Church of England and Ireland [and as belonging to no other religious denomination]; and such, provided that they have paid, during the previous year, either by pew-rent or by subscription, at least \$2 to the funds of said Congregation, and no others, shall be entitled to vote at the election of Lay Representatives.

Each Representative shall continue in office until his successor is appointed.

Suggest that the words enclosed in brackets be omitted.

Move that the words in italics be added.

(2) To amend the 2nd and 3rd paragraphs of Section 1, Canon XIX. (formerly 23), as follows:

2ND PARAGRAPH.—And in any Church of the said Diocese in which the seats are free, the Vestry shall consist of all those male members of the Congregation of such Church, of the full age of twenty-one years, as shall have signed the Cnurchwardens' book for the registering of voters for the election of Lay Representatives to the Synod; and who shall have contributed by subscription at least \$2 each year to the funds of said Congregation. Provided always, that after such Church has been opened for service one year, no person shall be allowed to vote at any Vestry meeting who has not signed such book and made such payment for the current year, at least one month before such meeting.

The 3rd paragraph to be amended to agree with the above.

The Committee, after examining the proposed alterations, would recommend that they be not adopted, on the following grounds:

- Because, in the opinion of the Committee, the alterations are in contravention to the provisions of the Acts of Parliament under which Diocesan Synods are held.
- (2) Because it is not desirable to make the payment of money a basis of Church membership.
- (3) Because it would interfere with the rights and privileges of the poorer members of the Church.

SECOND DAY.

Wednesday, June 18th, 1879.

The Bishop in the Chair.

The said committee shall first satisfy the Bishop that all arrears of salary that may be due to the late Incumbent have been provided for, and that satisfactory arrangements have been made for the salary of the future Incumbent. The Bishop shall then present the name of one clergyman to the committee, and if a majority of the committee present assent, he shall be appointed (if willing) to said vacant Parish or Mission, but if a majority dissent, then shall another name be submitted, and so on until a selection shall have been made.

2.—To assemble, whenever a vacancy in any Parish shall take place, at the request of a majority vote of the Vestry of the said Parish, there being but one congregation, and proceed as in Clause No. 1. If no request shall be made within one month of such vacancy, the Bishop shall appoint; or, at the request of the Vestry, he shall still do so without delay.

3.—In Parishes or Missions with two or more churches, the Wardens, together with the Lay Delegates, shall form a committee to wait upon the Bishop and arrange for the appointment to such vacant Parish or Mission as they see fit.

4.—The expenses of such Patronage Committee shall be paid by the Vestry of the Church requiring the same, and in the case of the Government Rectories, the expense shall be paid from out of the General Purposes Fund.

Address Regarding the Hellmuth Ladies' College.

Address to the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Huron in reference to the Hellmuth Ladies' College.

My Lord,—We, the undersigned, Clergy and Laity of the Diocese of Huron, in Synod assembled, humbly desire to draw your attention to a subject which has occupied the minds of many of us for some time,

We have observed, with deep regret, that the daughters of many of the most respectable members of our Church in Canada are sent to Roman Catholic institutions of learning that they may be educated, and we greatly fear that the influences which will be brought to bear upon them may lead them from the truth, as it is in Jesus, to embrace the errors and superstitions of the Church of Rome.

We all know your Lordship's zeal and Christian liberality in the cause of education, and fully appreciate it. We cannot but regard with pride the noble and invaluable Educational Institutions (which are the fruits of your labor and foresight) as adornments of the city in which we are now assembled, and a blessing and honor to the Diocese at large, and we take the opportunity of expressing our admiration of, and confidence in, the general management of these institutions, believing that they will be a means of laying the foundation of true religion and piety amongst us for future generations.

We particularly realise the value of such a training for the daughters of our Clergy and Laity as the Hellmuth Ladies' College affords, and trust that all who can do so will avail themselves of the opportunities presented to them; but, at the same time, we fear that owing to the charges which such an elaborate course of education involves, many of the educated and refined amongst us will be debarred from sending their daughters to it, and may be tempted (as we know they are) to send them, for economy's sake, either to where their spiritual training will be uncared for or where they will be led to renounce the Protestant faith of our Church.

We would, therefore, affectionately and respectfully request your Lordship to consider whether some scheme may be devised whereby, without serious financial injury to the Institution, the charges may be so reduced that there shall be no pretext for the members of the Church to send their daughters to any institutions but our own, and we humbly pray the Divine Head of the Church to so bless your efforts that our sons may grow up as the young plants, and that our daughters may be as the polished corners of the temple.

The Bishop said that the presentation of the address from this large Synod afforded him great gratification, as it was an evidence that our people were at last awaking to the insidious advances of the Romish Church in not only the good Protestant City of London, but all through the Provinces of our Dominion. The undertaking to provide high educational advantages at a low rate is not so easily accomplished. The Hellmuth Ladies' College affords the highest kind of education in every department of knowledge; hence an expensive staff of Professors and teachers of European reputation are employed for that purpose. But he assured the Synod that he would give immediate attention to the subject, and see that the College fees should be reduced, even if it should involve a personal loss of \$2,000 to \$3,000 per annum. Indeed, he would do his utmost to comply with the petition. The Clergy, he stated, can send their daughters to the Hellmuth Ladies' College at half charges. He must, however, under these circumstances,

(2.) Canon on irregular and unauthorized publications.

That any member of the Synod publishing or circulating, or directly or indirectly, causing to be published or circulated any matter which is intended to be submitted to the Synod, otherwise than through the regular medium of the Standing Committee, shall forfeit his seat in the Synod for that year, and the subject matter thus published and circulated without the previous sanction of the Standing Committee, shall not be discussed or entertained by the Synod until after the expiration of three regular sessions of the Synod, unless with the consent of the presiding officer of the Synod.

(3) To amend Canon XXVI, "On the Episcopal and Archdeacons Fund." Section 2.—To be altered and amended so as to read:

"Whereas, the Bishop has erected within this Diocese the Archdeaconries of Brant, Huron, Kent and London, and has appointed to each an Archdeacon having jurisdiction: And whereas, the sum of \$380 the present proceeds of the sum set apart for the salary of an Archdeacon has been heretofore and is now annually paid to the Archdeacon of Kent.

Be it enacted that the Episcopal Fund and the securities received from the Diocese of Toronto, on the death of the late Right Reverend Bishop Strachan, and the election of his successor, the late Right Rev. Bishop Bethune, formerly Archdeacon of York, shall form one fund from the income of which for the future, the said annual proceeds (now being \$380, but hereafter to be increased to \$400 when the securities produce that amount), shall be equally apportioned between and paid to the Archdeacons the Bishop has appointed, and shall from time to time appoint to such Archdeaconries within this Diocese as are erected or as he may hereafter erect, and who shall perform the duties of that office as provided by the Synod in the printed commission and instructions furnished by the Bishop, and the balance of the said annual proceeds after paying the necessary expenses connected with this Fund shall be paid to the Bishop; Such payments to be made quarterly;

Provided always, that this Canon so far as it relates to the Archdeacons shall only come into force upon the death or resignation of the present Archdeacon of Kent.

The Bishop stated that at the next Synod he would bring the matter before them regarding the appropriation of a certain \$400 specified in the Canon.

At His Lordship's suggestion, consideration of the Canon was postponed.

(2.) By the Rev. James Chance:-

(1) That a Committee be appointed to confer with the other Dioceses in the Province of Ontario, as to the advisability and practicability of adopting a plan, by which Clergymen may remove from one Diocese to another, without losing advantages gained by years of service rendered, and without heing subject to demands for entrance fees.

Address to the Bishop of Toronto.

The following Address was presented by the Dean to the Bishop of Toronto on the previous evening, in the presence of the members of the Synod, assembled at the Hellmuth Ladies' College:—

My Lord,—We, the Bishop, Clergy and Lay Delegates of the Diocese of Huron, in Synod assembled, have welcomed with heartfelt satisfaction your Lordship's presence amongst us at this our first session subsequent to your removal from the Diocese, and your elevation to the high and important post which, in God's good Providence, you have been called upon to fill.

Recognizing, as we must, the hand of God in this and all other events which affect the welfare and peace of His Church on earth, whatever the loss we, as a Diagese, have sustained, we are constrained to submit to the Divine pleasure. At the same time we cannot but feel the difficulty of filling up the many gaps you have left in the different departments of our Church work.

As one of the most active Archdeacons of the Diocese, as the pastor of a large and important congregation, as the Clerical Secretary of this Synod, as well as one who has left a deep and lasting impression upon the higher education of the youth of this Province, you have rendered services to the Church of an ordinary character, and we see in your Lordship's unexpected, though well-merited, promotion to a higher and wider sphere of usefulness in the Church of God, only an appropriate recognition of your diligent and faithful discharge of the very important duties which devolve upon you here.

We are aware, my Lord, that, in your present position, you will meet with many and great difficulties, and that a heavy burthen of care and responsibility must necessarily devolve upon you; but in the spirit which has marked your entrance upon your new duties, and the clear and distinct utterance you have given as to your determination to maintain in its integrity and simplicity, the principles and practices of our Reformed Church, we see an abundant guarantee of the future prosperity of your Diocese, and the high and honorable position to which you will undoubtedly attain in the affection and regard of all true and loyal members of our beloved Church.

The Bishop thanked the Clergy and Laity for their prompt attendance. It afforded him great pleasure to know that this was the largest Synod belonging to the Diocese of Huron which had ever met in annual assembly. He felt much gratified at the interest manifested by members throughout the session in all questions affecting the welfare of the Church. He said that in the unanimity that had prevailed, and the courtesy which had characterized the whole proceedings, his hands had been greatly strengthened and his heart cheered.

Never on any former occasion did he feel so strong, physically and mentally, as now.

The financial state of the Diocese, and the highly satisfactory condition of the Superannuation and W. and O. Fund, must be most encouraging to all.

He spoke in most complimentary terms of the esteemed Secretary-Treasurer, as to his uniform gentlemanly bearing towards himself and the members of the Synod, his efficiency and strict attention to duty.

In conclusion, he reminded the Clergy of his charge to them on their pastoral duties. He counselled them to diligence in visiting their flocks, and especially the sick and poor therein, and to faithful labor for Christ. On the Laity he enjoined forbearance towards and assistance and co-operation with the Clergy. He wished them, unitedly, success in all their labors.

May they, like their Blessed Master, go forth conquering and to conquer, and when He comes to crown the conquerors may they receive from Him, the Chief Shepherd, a crown of glory that fadeth not away.

The Bishop then pronounced the benediction, and adjourned the Synod at 12:30. P. M.

Annual Diocesan Missionary Meeting.

The Annual Missionary Meeting in connection with the Synod of the Diocese of Huron was held in St. Paul's Church, London, on Tuesday evening, June 17th, 1879.

The Lord Bishop of Huron in the Chair.

After the opening hymn and prayer, His Lordship Bishop Hellmuth made a short address. After remarking that they owed a debt of gratitude to almost the Church of England as pre-eminently a missionary Church, and upon England as pre-eminently the great missionary nation of the earth. She is doing a great work, planting everywhere the pure Gospel with all its grand and blessed advantages which she herself enjoys. The Church of England has manifested intense interest in extending the Gospel and bearing the banner of the Cross to heathen lands amongst God's ancient people and among professing Christians. In our own Diocese God has been doing a great work for us. He has signally blessed the work here. When his revered and lamented predecessor took charge of the Diocese there were only a few elergymen within its borders. During his life he more than doubled the number, and since then the number has been largely increased, while numerous churches and parsonages have been built. The large number of members added to the Church are all manifestations of how God has blessed the work in the Diocese of Huron, and regions beyond, that others may be made recipients also of the Gospel of the Grace of God. The Bishop spoke also of the success which attend his efforts in connection with the Western University. He referred also to the Lambeth Conference, with its one hundred Bishops, representing the Missionary field of the world. The Bishop then introduced his friend the Bishop of Toronto.

His Lordship said he was thankful to have the opportunity of saying a few farewell words at a missionary meeting before going to the Diocese to which he had been appointed. He congratulated His Lordship and the assemblage on the prosperous condition of this Diocese, and urged them to give all the glory to God. He considered the condition of this Diocese most promising. All were not only working with one mind and one object, but there was marked evidence of progress. Every success which God had given should only spur to redoubled effort. We are a militant Church, and the time will never come while we are on earth when we can lay down our arms and say our work is done. It is our pride and joy to look on England as the greatest military nation of the world, and British soldiers as the most valorous. England's Church is a militant Church, and while we rejoice in the success of Church. It is true that almost every existing mission in this Diocese is supplied with clergymen, but our work does not end here. There is room for further progress by extending the work even beyond the Diocese. He thought in all these missionary meetings a portion of the sum collected should be always

devoted to work outside the Diocese, and he was glad to know that a considerable sum of the Synod's funds was this year to be expended on Foreign Missions. He said they had two great wants. One is for money for the missionary work, and they were justified in bringing this point constantly forward. He placed before them a plan for getting money, which was an association of church women to collect weekly the contributions of those who do not give large annual sums. He thought such a plan would enable them to double the sum collected for mission purposes. He put in a plea for the Diocese of Algoma, saying he feared there had been a growing cold on the part of the community toward that Diocese. He spoke of the arduous toil of the Bishop of that portion of the Church, and trusted that our hearts would be excited to more earnest interest in that Diocese. The second want, he said, was men. He spoke of the success that had already been experienced in getting men, but believed that the more that could be secured the better. In alluding to his removal to Toronto he said he parted from this Diocese with many feelings of regret, but he believed God had called him to where he was going. In that Diocese they needed the spirit of unity, and he hoped to see a renewal of cordiality that would enable them to work with one mind and heart for the progress of the Church. He asked them for their prayers in that direction.

The Choir of St. Paul's then sung the anthem "I will mention the loving kindness of the Lord."

The Chairman, in a few complimentary words, introduced Vice-Chancellor Blake.

Mr. Blake, in rising, alluded to the sympathy which existed between the Dioceses of Huron and Toronto, and said Toronto sadly needed their sympathy. Many prayers had gone to God for the blessings which God had now given them, and he asked them to join with him in thanking God that the clouds which so long hovered over them had burst in such blessings upon their heads. He said we are essentially a Church militant; an aggressive Church. If not, we are a dead Church. He was glad that at last Toronto had got into line. We want men even more than money, men with undying energy. He liked these missionary meetings, for they were like the merchant's time for taking stock, when we find out what we have done, what we have to do, and what we want. He thought they greatly needed men completely empty of self and completely filled with the Holy Spirit. He narrated a story of a dying man in England who felt that it was all well with him for the better land, yet who had never been done so as to explain how the Lord Jesus Christ saved souls. It was necessary for every missionary before he leaves the pulpit to place ruin, redemption, reception, regeneration and responsibility before his hearers, and then there would be no such ignorance of the way of salvation as this. He would like to have every family set apart one member for the especial work of the Church, while every member performed his rightful share for the furtherance of that work. He did not believe much in the Christianity that would not put its shoulder to the wheel. If it is true Christianity it would exhibit itself. He believed with John Wesley that every sound from the pulpit should have a thousand echoes from the pews. Religion should permeate everywhere, no veneered religion, but the true unmistakeable religion of Jesus Christ. We want the progress of the country and the progress of the Church to go hand in hand—national prosperity and spiritual prosperity moving together. Then let us rise and with a strong arm take hold of the mission work that these blessings

In conclusion, he asked them to resolve that they would enter at once upon the work and allow nothing to turn them from it, and asked God to grant that when the great day arrived each and every one would be able to point to some soul saved by his own individual effort.

The Bishop then called on the Rev. G. G. Ballard, M. A., Rector of Trinity Church, St. Thomas.

Rev. G. G. Ballard spoke of some of the thoughts which had passed through his mind since coming to this country when considering what it most required. Two words had particularly struck him, and those were "National Policy." If some new feature in national policy should excite so much interest throughout the country, he thought a policy for the redemption of souls should excite the greatest interest. The old Reformers found the ship almost wrecked on the headlands, but they took the helm with a bold and firm hand, and saved the vessel. We are satisfied with what the old Reformers have done and are willing to follow in their steps. Their's were true reform principles, and if the people follow them earnestly the Church will constantly become better. With the advantages they had as a Church, he thought they should be not slow to make marked progress. The risen Saviour requires aggressiveness. Science is teaching us a lesson. There is progress everywhere. By science God is gathering the nations into closer union, and we ought to make that union a Christian union. The world is in the arms of a wicked one, and we have the power to remove it from that control. Surely we should be intensely earnest in bringing about that glorious time when every Diocese will help every other to extend the work of God. He believed in a confederation of Clergy and Laity in this work. While the nations celebrate the centenaries of its heroes, our Church calls us almost Sabbath Day to the anniversary of some word that fell from the Saviour's lips, or act performed by the Most Holy one. All these things call us to more thorough consecration to the work of spreading the glad tidings of salvation to benighted souls.

The Choir then sung the anthem "Thou will keep him in perfect peace," after which a collection was made for the Mission Fund of the Diocese.

THE FINANCIAL REPORT

-OF THE-

Standing Committee of the Synod of the Diocese of Huron

FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 1879.

(Being the fifth under the Synod Act of Incorporation.)

In presenting their Annual Report the Committee desire, in the first place, gratefully to acknowledge the continued Providence and protecting care of Almighty God, without whose blessing all their efforts and labors would be but vain.

INCOME.

The total voluntary income for the past year was \$11,809.46, being some \$380 less than that of the previous year.

Notwithstanding this slight diminution, and although one or two of the Funds have not attained to the amounts of former years, yet your Committee feel that on the whole there is great cause for thankfulness, when the unsettled financial state of the country during the last few years is considered, and, therefore, it affords much satisfaction to your Committee to be able to report that not only have they been enabled to meet all their engagements but also to open up new ground and occupy fresh stations, and that never before has the Diocese had so few vacant parishes or so many labourers in her vineyard.

THE MISSION FUND.

The returns show a decrease of \$402.04 from last year's report. Of this amount \$76 appears against the ordinary quarterly collections, while \$285.48 less was received this year from the collections at the missionary meetings. It is difficult to ascertain exactly the cause of this last decrease, but the extreme inclemency of the weather during the season at which most of the meetings were held militated very much against the attendance.

Your Committee feel that the Synod ought to take into serious consideration the advisability of appointing a thoroughly qualified Missionary Agent, whose entire time should be given to this special mission work, and who should endeavor during the year to visit every Parish and Station in the whole Diocese. If this were done, the present laborious and expensive system of deputations might be altogether abandoned.

During the past year the S. P. G. have taken off £100 from their annual grant to this Diocese, and have signified their intention of making a similar and further reduction during the next two years, so that at the end of the year 1882 the grant will be altogether withdrawn.

This action has been anticipated for some time past, and your Committee cannot but feel that after over twenty years of liberal pecuniary assistance on their part, the Venerable Society is justified in thinking that this large and prosperous Diocese is now in a position to depend on her own

The withdrawal of this grant, however, makes it our bounden duty to put forth every effort to maintain and strengthen the income of our Mission Fund.

In accordance with the suggestions made at the last Synod, the Committee have increased the charges for management of the various Funds, and have endeavored to make each bear its proper share of the working expenses, and by this means the income of the fund has been somewhat augmented.

The expenditure for the year from this Fund was \$13,699.39, of which \$11.771.43 was paid for salaries and \$900 for outfits.

SUPERANNUATION.

The amount paid for this purpose was \$2,561.72. Five clergymen have been placed on the Fund during the year, in accordance with the Canon, and at the present time there are ten receiving superannuation allowance.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND,

Notwithstanding a decrease of some \$87 in the quarterly collections for this Fund, and the addition of three names to the Pension List, your Committee are gratified to be able to report that not only have all claims been promptly met, but they have also been enabled to add \$1,200 to the capital of the Fund, which has now a total invested capital of \$53,501.08.

There are now 17 widows on the Pension List.

DAY OF THANKSGIVING.

The collections from this source, which are given to the stipend of the Bishop of Algoma, were \$775.92, being \$77.68 in excess of last year's receipts.

It is the duty of your Committee to point out that the term of five years has now expired for which the annual grant of \$600 was guaranteed by the

In view of the fact that the Dioceses of Nova Scotia and Frederickton have, since the commencement of this guarantee, been added to this Ecclesiastical Province, your Committee would suggest that a readjustment should now be made of the amounts to be borne by the respective Dioceses, and that the new Standing Committee should be instructed by the Synod to take action in

Your Committee feel, however, that this Diocese should continue to assist the struggling Missionary Diocese of Algoma in every way in its power, and they would suggest that until the readjustment above referred to is made the grant should continue to be paid at the same rate as formerly.

The collections made on the Day of Intercession, held in December, 1878, were \$553.49, being \$163.23 in excess of the previous year.

Various collections were also made for, and paid, during the year to the Cuban Mission and the sufferers at New Orleans.

The amount now at the disposal of the Synod for Foreign Missions is \$843.55, including the half of the collections made at the missionary meetings.

The total amount paid to this Fund during the year was \$821.32, being \$114.02 in excess of last year.

Your Committee would suggest that the time has now arrived when the Church of England in this Ecclesiastical Province should make some united effort amongst her various Dioceses to organize a proper scheme of Foreign Mission work, with a staff of missionaries under her maintenance and control.

It is believed that a most hearty response would be made to such a scheme were it once properly inaugurated and brought before the members of the Church.

That a special blessing would be vouchsafed to such a work no one can doubt who looks abroad and sees how signally God has prospered the Church in the Mother Country ever since she has so vigorously undertaken the promotion of Foreign Mission work.
