HOUSEHOLD RECEIPTS.

DRIED FLOUR FOR INFANTS.—Take one teacupful of flour, tie it up tightly in a close muslin bag, and put it in a pot of cold water and boil three hours; then take it out and dry the outside. When used, grate it. One tablespoonful is enough for one teacupful of milk (which would be better with a little water); wet the flour with a little water and stir into the milk; add a very little sait and boil five minutes.

For the filling : one tablespoonful corn starch, boiled in one-half pint milk; beat the yolk of an egg very light, and stir into the milk, flavor with vanilla, and when cold add the other half of the milk and the whole of the egg beaten to a stiff froth and stirred in quickly ; spread this between the cakes, and ice it with the white of one egg and eight tablespoonfuls of fine sifted sugar flavored with lemon.
