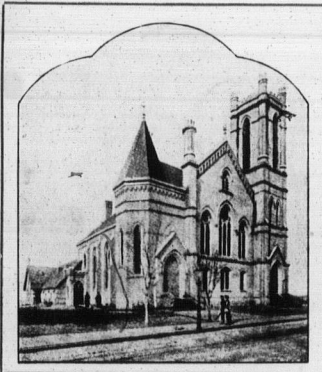

REPORT OF SESSION

THE bountiful mercies which have been vouchsafed to us and the many blessings bestowed upon us as a congregation, during the past year, are causes for much gratitude and thankfulness to the giver of all good and perfect gifts. It is very gratifying to learn that there has been unbroken harmony among the workers in the various departments of Church work, and this, while affording pleasure in our humble efforts to follow in the footsteps of our blessed Master, is a mark of acceptance by Him, who through His servant, the great Apostle, has said, "Rejoice and again I say rejoice."

During the year the membership roll has had the names of 76 members added, 48 being by certificate and 28 by profession of faith. The removals by certificate were 40, and by death 8, leaving the number of 718 on December 31st, 1898. Seventeen children and adults have received the rite of Baptism.

Mr. Hewish and Mr. Telfer, members of the Session for many years, and who have given valuable services to the congregation, have removed, the former going to Philadelphia, and the latter to Mimico. We regret to learn that Mr. Telfer has lately been sadly bereaved by the death of his wife, and he has the heartfelt sympathy of the congregation in his loss.

Mr. Sutherland, Mr. Hunter, Rev. R. Leask, Major Carlaw, and Rev. D. C. Hossack, were appointed delegates to the General Assembly in Montreal in June last, to represent this congregation in what they have contended to be its rights in relation to the Cowan Avenue congregation, and we are happy to be able to state that the decision was favorable to this congregation, and we trust that with God's blessing it will also prove beneficial to the sister Church. The General Assembly, after a careful consideration of the entire subject, arrived at the following finding :

"It was moved by Mr. President Forrest, seconded by Mr. F. M. Dewey : 'Dismiss the appeal of the Presbytery of Toronto and instruct them to carry out their original resolution of April, 1895, with the understanding however, that in the peculiar circumstances of the Cowan Avenue congregation, it be allowed an additional period of two years

to make arrangements for the removal to another site, to be approved of the Presbytery."

The excellent service rendered by the Choir, under the efficient leadership of Mr. Gorrie, is to be commended. It has undoubtedly been conducive to the hearty congregational singing.

We regret that owing to unforeseen circumstances the erection of the new Sunday School building has been delayed. The progress of the school has been hindered in consequence. We trust however that early in the coming year the work upon a new building will be undertaken.

The Missionary schemes of the Church have not been so well maintained during the year as compared with previous years, and it is to be hoped that an effort will be made to increase the amount this year.

Application has been made to the Session by a number of residents in the vicinity of Sunnyside who wish to form themselves into a Mission Church, under the auspices of this congregation, and the matter has been laid before the Presbytery with the result that neighboring Sessions have been called to appear for their interests before the Presbytery, when the matter will be finally settled.

THE MANAGERS REPORT

FINANCIAL STATEMENT, WEEKLY OFFERING
STATEMENT, AND ESTIMATED
EXPENDITURE

It is again the duty of the Board of Managers to present their Annual Report, upon the financial position of the Congregation, and, while the contributions may be said to be a fair Average, they are certainly not up to the expectations formed by your Board.

If we take the last five years as a criterion, 1894, \$6072; '95, \$6011; '96, \$5944, '97, \$6228; '98, \$6036, we may assume the normal contributions of this congregation for ordinary purposes, to be \$6000. The fixed charges, as we may call them now amount to \$5300, leaving \$700 at the disposal of the Board.

The congregation having voted \$1,400 at its last meeting for Repairs, Decoration, etc., the work has been carried out under the direction of the Property Committee. Much improvement has been made in the Appearance, Ventilation, Lighting, etc., of the Building, and we trust the changes made have met with your general approval.

Your Managers wish to acknowledge the kindness of the Ladies' Aid Society, in granting us the the sum of \$125, to assist in improving the Church. These improvements amount to \$1155; there are still unpaid bills to the amount of about \$440, which we hope to be enabled to meet at an early period.

We therefore, have been unable to do anything in Mortgage Reduction this year, but have made provision in the Estimates for that purpose in 1899, as the congregation should endeavor to do something in that direction annually. Such encumbrances render us less able to do our part in supporting those Christian undertakings which look to us for assistance.

The following Members retire this year, and are eligible for re-election :—Messrs. Forbes, Grant, Leask, Ross, Major Hall, and Dr. Sloan, but we would strongly emphasize the desirability of introducing new material each year, so that more of the members would become practically interested in the financial position of the congregation.

In closing our accounts for 1898, we look forward hopefully to the future, and trust that the year now opening may be brighter and more prosperous than any this Church has hitherto enjoyed.

Weekly Offering Secretary's Report.

In the year just closed there were the names of 286 contributors on the books, 25 old names were removed and 21 new names have been added during the year, this will leave the probable number of active contributors at about 282 at the end of the year. Of this number 242 promised definite sums and 44 did not promise any definite amount.

From this amount should be deducted the known arrears of \$257 40 less amount of over contributions \$183 75, leaving the sum of \$330 59 which will be made up, or accounted for by the fact that several contributors names were on the book for periods less than the year varying from 1 to 51 weeks.

There are 86 contributors in arrears for the sum of \$257 40, averaging \$3 each.

49 contributors gave \$74 65 more than promised, averaging \$1 52 each the above sum deducted from the arrears leaves the net arrears at \$183 75 or about 4% of the sum expected and promised.

There were 11,880 promised contribution weeks during the year, thus showing an average contribution of 32 1-5c to each promising contributor.

There were 2,054 unpromised contribution weeks during the year, showing an average contribution of 24½¢ to each non-promising contributor. It is thus plain that it is to the financial interests of the church that contributors should promise some definite sum as a regular contribution.

There are now 29 pew holders who do not contribute by the envelope system holding 63 sittings.

In conclusion I desire to call special attention to the importance of the envelope system as a source of income to the church. In the past year it has been fully 72% of the receipts controlled by the Managers. This fact should commend it to the careful consideration of every member or adherent having the financial interests of the Congregation at heart.

REPORT S. S. BUILDING COMMITTEE

YOUR Committee consisting of five members chosen from the members of Session and Board of Managers, have given their most earnest attention during the past year towards securing the new building which is so much needed for the constantly increasing number of scholars attending our Sabbath school.

It will be remembered that at the last annual meeting the congregation authorized the erection of a new school building affording accommodation for 1000 scholars at a cost not exceeding \$8,000, and at a subsequent meeting decided that the building should be erected to the south of the present school.

Your Committee thereupon, having already ascertained the requirements of a modern school building by inquiry from various sources, called for plans for a building such as would be suitable for the school costing not more than the amount appropriated by the congregation.

Several plans were submitted, many of which would have satisfied the requirements of the school although possibly not entirely satisfactory in design, but it was found on obtaining tenders for the work that none of those designs that were at all suitable and giving accommodation for even 800, could be erected for the amount stipulated.

Considerable time was occupied in our endeavor to procure the erection of the school on the site mentioned within the amount

specified, and although our efforts have been unsuccessful, we have no doubt gained much general information on the subject that will be of service to the congregation.

Finding it impossible to erect the building on the site mentioned for the amount voted by the congregation, your Committee after carefully considering the situation, and having in view convenience in heating of the new building, and the outlay that would be necessary to maintain the present school building in proper repair, decided to recommend that the school be erected at the rear of the Church, and now submit plans for a building of more modern design, which, besides affording a rear entrance to the Church galleries, and suitable and commodious vestry, session and board rooms, will at the same time afford comfortable accommodation for over 800 scholars.

An estimate of the total cost of the building based upon tenders from the various trades including \$1000 for ventilation and incidentals is submitted herewith at \$10,646.

The Treasurer of the Building Fund reports cash on hand as of 1st January, 1899, \$1,688.37, and in addition to this upwards of 40 members of the congregation have subscribed \$2,500; and further sums have been promised by some of them as soon as the work is commenced, and your Committee confidently expect that a further sum of \$2,000 will be subscribed by members of the congregation whose subscriptions have not as yet been solicited, which will make a total of \$6,188.37.

The ordinary annual revenue of the school over running expenses is estimated at \$300, which can be used in liquidating the balance of the amount required.

Your Committee are assured by the present mortgagees that the congregation can obtain from them a further sum of \$5,000 at 5%, repayable in yearly instalments of from \$500 to \$1,000, as desired, and that this advance will be made without in any way disturbing the present mortgage already on the Church property, and it is hoped that the congregation will have such moral and financial encouragement to the undertaking as will result in having the building operations commenced at an early date.

It is hardly necessary for your Committee to urge the necessity of the new building for the welfare of the school and indeed of the Church itself, and your Committee trust that an opportunity will be given them to proceed with the erection of the new edifice on the designs indicated as early as the season will permit.

REPORT OF MISSION COMMITTEE

As may be seen from the Treasurer's Statement, the results of our congregational offerings to missions during the past year have been disappointing, having not only fallen below those of the previous year, but with one exception, are the lowest for the past ten years, notwithstanding that our membership and numbers attending our Sabbath services are as large if not surpassing those of previous years. We doubt not that this unsatisfactory showing is due more to a lack of appreciating the great need of those who are less favored than we, rather than from any want of generosity on the part of our congregation.

It cannot be impressed too strongly the vast importance of all missionary work, and that our duty to "our neighbor" is equally binding as our regard for ourselves, and only as we realize this shall we be willing to give of our substance to carry the message of salvation to those who in remote corners of our own land are living without the preached gospel, and to millions in heathen lands, who never heard the "glad tidings of great joy," which are for all people. We hope this year our zeal in this very important department of Church work may be awakened and that we may have a very much larger number of contributors to mission schemes who will give a regular monthly offering, thereby enabling the Church to meet the great demands made on her, and to undertake work of importance in new fields of labor which are opening up in greater number as the years go by. And we would especially request new comers in our midst to join us in this great service, and help to maintain the mission funds so that we may not unduly feel the loss of those who by death and removal to new districts have ceased to render valued contributions to the Church schemes.

Your Committee desire to commend the missionary spirit manifested in the work of the various Church organizations, especially those that tend to create a love of service among the young, and pray that the divine blessing may follow all efforts that have for their object the spread of Christ's kingdom and of carrying light to those sitting in darkness and in the shadow of death. In this connection we would record our appreciation of the work, during the past year year of Messrs. Lawson and Duff, the former having returned to his

field of labor in China, but the latter is still with us for a few months, when he too will return to the same country. It speaks much for their love of the work, the manner in which, while presumably taking a much-needed rest, they have devoted to work amongst our young people, spending very considerable of their leisure in doing whatever their hands found to do, and we trust that He in whose behalf they labor may reward them abundantly.

In conclusion, we earnestly desire the co-operation of our membership not only in the matter of contributions, but also in seeking to know more of this great work which is occupying so much of the attention of the christian world, and in helping to foster a greater missionary spirit among the young in our families as well as in the Church, for we believe that missions are of vast importance not only to the Church but to the nation, for the doors are being flung wide open in these days, of countries where it has been almost impossible before to do any good work, and should we withhold our hands the result may have disastrous effects in our own lives as well as nationally, for it is the Lord's work, and He has invited us to go into this great harvest field of the world and garner for Him, and if we cannot go ourselves, we can help to send those who are ready and willing to go, and thus carry light and blessedness where now there is darkness and misery.

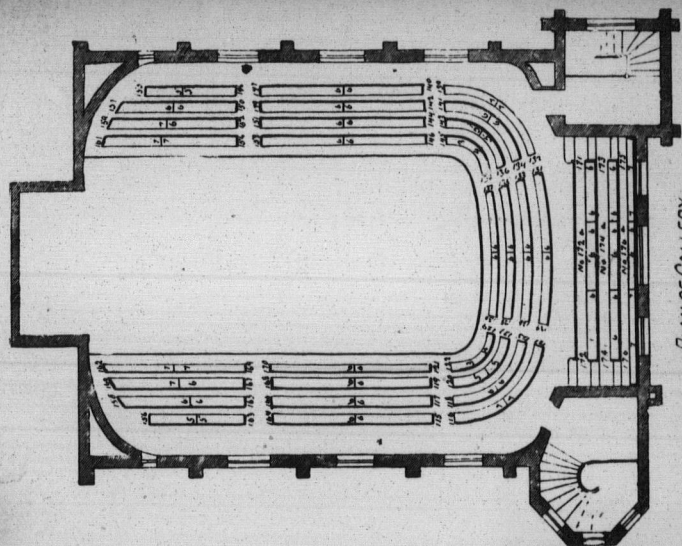

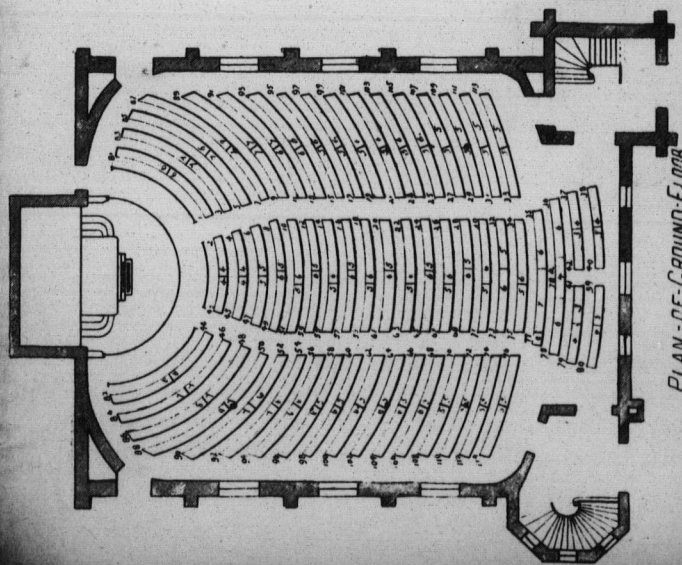
