SAFEGUARD NEUTRALS IS NORWAY'S REQUEST. Foreign Minister Hopes Germany Will Limit Submarine Activity.

London, June 23.—The hope that German ships from submarine attacks was expressed by Norwegian Foreign Minister M. Ilen, at the opening of the Storting, says a Reuters dispatch from Christiania. Discussing the torpedoing of the Norwegian steamships Belridge and Svein Jarl, M. Ilen declared: "Whatever differences of opinion may exist regarding rights under international law, it is my hope that the German Government, having learned through experience how easily mistakes are made, will give commanders of German warships such instructions as will make neutral shipping safe."

RUSSIAN COMMANDER LANDS IN NEW YORK. New York, June 23.—Baron Vladimir De Stackelberg, a lieutenant-general of the Russian field artillery, who recently was wounded in battle, arrived here last night on the French line steamship Niagara from Bordeaux. He left for Washington to join members of his staff and later expects to return to France.
