## Directions to Farmers and Gardeners.

THE laft week in April, fow early peafe, cabbage, parfinips, parley, onions, turnips, radifhes, lettice and mufard.
The firf week in May, fow oats, wheat and rye; alfo forre early Englifh beans, (and the main crop by the 10 th or 12 th), fpinage, and orrice; and by the 20th of May a few bills of cucumbers.

The middleef May, fow hemp and flax ; and any timebetween this and the roth of fune will dofor potatocs.

The firft week in June, plant all forts of kidney beans; alfo cucumbers, fquafhes and pumpkini.

The 20th of June, fow buckwheat; this is alfo a good time to fow in herds-grafs, clover, or any fort of grafs feed, which is thought to fucceed better if fowed in now with buckwheat, than in the fpring with oats. Herds-grafs that is fowed the latter part of June, or through the whole of July, inftoad of running up, heading out, and ripering as that does which is carlier fown, foends the fummer in fpreading into a large bunch, and rooting firmly, ny which it not only bears the feverity of the winter, but fends up from each feed many more ftalks thie enfuing fummer. The farmer thould be particularly careful to fow his clover, if poffible, be-
fore the end of July; for it is very apt to be killed with the win. ter, if not well rooted, and it often happens that crops which come up well late in fall are wholly killed, fo that a fingle plant cannot be found the next fummer.——The ficf week in july fow field turnips-the early Dutch may be fown as late the 25 th. - The zoth is a good time to fow turnip radith, and for a late crop, fome falmon ditto, as late as Auguit ioth.- About the middle of Augua is the befi fime to fow winter wheat and rye, as by being fowed early it will be better rooted to Itand the feverity of the winrer, and he more likely to efcape a biaft by coming in earlier next fummer.

Pericles, for a great number of years, adminiftered the affairs of Athens with ability and integrity. This alone was fufficient to raife againft him a hoft of foes: he was the conftant aim of public hatred-till he had loft a beloved fon: this accident affected him fo much, that he was quite inconfolable. The people, now feeing him upon a level with themfelves, afflicted with like parfions, and liable to the fame misfortunes, turned all their hatred and envy to pity - which too often is but a refpedful kind of contempt.
