THE MARRIAGE QUESTION. "Most marriages are made by God but some are made by the devil."

"I think," said Rev. Mr. Scudder, "that divorce should be granted on at least eight grounds," including, of course, incompatibility.

The Church, commissioned by the pitiful Christ, teaches the doctrine that man may not put asunder what God has joined together.

There are at present nearly two million divorced persons in the United States; annually there are more divorces granted than in all the rest of the Christian world together.

The search for good reasons always forbade mixed marriages, granting dis-

ensions for reason in particular cases. Until 1908, however, mixed marriages before a Protestant minister, though illicit, were valid.

Now, in the eyes of the Church, it is essential to the Sacrament of matrimony that the mutual consent to marriage be absolute.
