CONDITIONS BAD

(Courier Leased Wire). WINNIPEG, Man., Feb. 25.—Following the report of the smallpox outbreak at Red River, a lumberjack just returned from the winter's work at Hudson Bay Junction relates his experience and expresses wonder that any of the Saskatchewan lumber camps can escape epidemics of fever. The camps, he says, are not cleaned sufficiently often. The bedding is musty hay from the marshes. There is no ventilation whatever, and 60 men of mixed races (mostly Gaiacians) have to sleep in one small camp and are shut in at 10 o'clock every night. Water trickles down the walls into the bunks. The doctor is supposed to attend once a week, but really comes every second or third week. Each man is charged \$1 per month for medical attendance, and should he work but the first three days of the month is charged the full dollar.

BOOTH FOR NOBEL PRIZE

ANNUAL PENSION BILL

(Courier Leased Wire). WASHINGTON, Feb. 25.—The Senate today passed the \$180,000,000 annual pension bill in the record time of 25 minutes, and with less than 15 minutes' debate. It is the largest amount of any annual pension measure in the history of the United States Government.

SILK DYERS ON STRIKE

J., Feb. 25.—Five thousand silk operatives and silk dyers went on strike at various mills here this morning, the former demanding an eight hour day and a "two loom" system; the latter, a minimum wage of \$12 a week. More were expected to quit during the day, bringing the number up to 12,000. The strike was declared in response to an order issued by Ewald Koettgen, a general organizer of the Industrial Workers of the World. No disorder was reported this morning.

#### EPIDEMIC AT RIDLEY

The epidemic is confined to the senior school. The parents of ten boys from Toronto and six from London who are not ill have asked that they be allowed to return home. After consulting with Dr. Hastings of Toronto and Dr. Hutchinson, London's medical health officer, it was decided to allow the boys to return to their homes, providing quarantine restrictions are observed.

#### FELL DOWN CREVICE

SYDNEY, N.S.W., Feb. 25—Lieut. Ninnis, according to a later despatch, was killed by falling down a crevice nearly a year ago. His death was practically instantaneous. He first desired to join Captain Scott's South Polar expedition, but as there was no vacancy he turned to Dr. Dawson and was accepted. #### MOCK WINDOWS.

They were common in England when the window tax in England, a very old tax commencing in the reign of William III., was not discontinued until Lord Halifax changed it to the house duty in 1851.

It must have caused a great amount of consternation, amusements and other foul air maladies, for in 1850 there were only an average of six windows in English houses. Indeed, the British architects are not yet free from the bad influence of this tax.

In very many old houses in England today there may be seen mock windows painted on the walls for symmetry—hidden things. Not only were glazed windows taxed, but any hole in the wall was included. Indeed, in the early days only very rich people in England had glass windows; and so precious were these that they were carried from one home to another when people moved their quarters.

Curious dodges were practiced to escape the tax, such as extending one window across two houses or making a very wide division between two panes of glass. The loss to the nation must have been a hundredfold the revenues collected from this bad tax.—Boston Herald.






