THE AGE OF THE HUMAN RACE.—At the meeting of the Polytechnic Association of the American Institute, reported in another place, Dr Stevens read a paper in the geologic period at which the human race was greated, which was listened to with the greatest

was created, which was listened to with the greatest interest. The following is an abstract of the paper:

The great truth that comes out with most prominance from the vast multitude of facts collected by geologists, is the creation of successive races and species of animals which have slowly succeeded each other through immense periods of time, constantly advancing from simpler to higher forms of organization.

Mearly all the rocks that compose the solid crust of our own globe were deposited at the bottom of seas and lakes, constituting formations ranging in geographical extent from a few rods to thousands of miles, and varying in thickness from a fraction of an inch to many thousand feet.
