Latitude 47° 27' 30" North. Longitude 56° 47' 45" West.

The Light Fower burnt down in June last has been replaced by a CICULAR IRON one, in which, on and after 21st November a fixed white light will be exhibited nightly, from sunset to sunrise. at an elevation of 68 feet above the level of the sea, and illuminating the whole horizon seawards, excepting towards the Harbor Rock. This Rock bears N. E. 3 E. 230 ya: ds distant; on this bearing the light is obscured.

The illuminating apparatus is Dioptric of the 8th order, with a single argand burner. The Tower is painted Red and White in alternate horizontal bands.
