Two thousand persons were in the audience. and when the tiames burst out aroundthe stage on which were two hundred performers, a tremendous rush was made from all parts of the house to escape.Many of the panicstroken leaped from the windows while the shouts and shrieks of ihose unable to escape were heartren ding. During the greatest excitementhe gas meted connected with the theatre exploied, causing total darkness.
