AINEFICAN DESPECTIONS. New York, 22nd--The steamer Deutch-land, from Europe, arrived this morning. Dexter yesterday trotted one quarter of a mile in 30 seconds, or at the fate of one mile in 20 minutes; equal to fast railway time. Herald's correspondence from the Argentine Confederation says Sarmiento had been elected President. He is un-derstood to favor peace with Paraguay, and a policy to that effect will probably provoks a war with Brazil. Congress was still in session and a bill to abolish all Argentine Legations abroad had been introduced and was likely to become a law. The financial troubles 'n Monte-vido still prevailed. The women in Paraguay, it is reported, in addition to becoming soldiers are also performing civil functions such as justices, recruiting officers, &c. The Tribune's special says, It is asserted that Gen. Rozectans is em-powered by the executive to tender all the naval aid possible to the Juarez gov-erment, and that material aid will not be withheld if it should be fourd necces-sary to enable the Mexican authorities to crush the various factions there and es-torishish a stable government. The Mexi-can authorities are; it appeare, willing to struct a portion of their northern ter-ritory in return for this support, and the whole project commands, it is said, the approval of some of the leading military men.
