Inflation of the Currency.

The Minister of Finance has a measure before Parliament, making some changes in the banking and currency Act, which deserves attention. The belief is generally entertained among financiers and business men that its results in many ways will prove injurious to the country. Under the present law the Government has to keep a certain proportion of coin on hand for all the legal tenders it issues up to nine millions tion of coin on hand for all the legal tenders it issues up to nine millions of dollars. According to the new bill introduced by Sir Francis Hincks the Government will only have to keep on hand one-lifth of the amount of over issue. Thus for every dollar of com it can issue five dollars of paper money. The Government responsibility being thus greatly lessened, direct encouragement is given to increase the volume of legal tenders, and produce an inflation of the currency.

Another bad feature of this bill is that the Government will not have to depend on its facilities for circulating and redeeming these legal tenders, but they are to be loaned to the banks as deposits not bearing interest. The effect of this will be that the banks can keep a supply of these tenders in their vaults as security for their own circulation instead of coin as at present. By this arrity for their own circulation instead of coin as at present. By this arrangement the Government legal tenders are given a fictitious value, and are made to count twice as gold: once by the Finance Minister who deposits them with the banks as so much gold, and again by the banks who hold them as security in lieu of gold.

It will thus be seen that every opportunity is afforded the Government for the manufacture and circulation of its legal tenders to any amount. But there is still another clause, the effect of which may be even more injurious. The Finance Minister is not-bound to distribute these tenders among the banks according either to their capital or their circulation, but simply according to his own pleasure. He can thus subsidize what ank he chooses. He can withdraw his deposits from any bank when it suits him. By this means he acquires an immense influence over a lank, for he can increase or diminish his gratis deposits of legal tenders, and withdraw these deposits so rapidly as seriously to cripple it. This is manifestly unjust, for the distribution of these tenders should be regulated by the paid up capital of each bank. The tendency of the bill is also to greatly increase the volume of our currency, and to diminish the amount of specie by substituting these tenders in its place.

The Earthquake in Syria.

Particulars of the late earthquake in Syria, which caused such terrible loss of life, are now-coming to hand. At appears that the fatalities were not greatest in the city of Antioch, as the first desputed intimated, but were heavier in the country in the vicinity of that city. A letter from Antioch under date of the 4th of April says the American Protestant church was severely injured. Four of the American community were killed; all the members of the families of the missionaries are safe. The number of persons killed in the city of Antioch is less than 300, but it is known that 1,600 people are, in the surrounding towns and country where the shocks were as severe, if not greater than here, were killed, and this number may be increased. The distress of the people will be only temporary, as the crop prospects are good. The supply of provisions on hand is moderate. Correspondents of the London papers praise the Rev. Mr. Powers, an American missionary, for his assiduity in administering to the relief of the afflicted people.


