



RAILWAY PROBABILITIES

There are evidences on the American side that next year will witness great activity in railway building. Already the coming season's output of rolling mills has been purchased, and there will, no doubt, be many new mills started. The Pacific coast will especially be the scene of large operations, as it is pretty well understood that several of the great railway corporations outside of the U. S. Northern Pacific is now constructing the switch-back over the Cascade division to Tacoma, which work also comprises on the long tunnel. By securing a line of its own terminals it will be freed from the present dictation of the O. R. & N. Co. a system, which changes local routes over its line from Walla Walla and Lewiston to the Northern Pacific will also put a line of steamers on the route between Tacoma and Victoria. Plans will be made to give shipping rates that will compare successfully with any other route. This is itself would be of great advantage to Victoria. The Northern Pacific company have been pushing the construction of their line from Omaha through Nebraska and Wyoming, the direction being westerly to Ontario, in Idaho, through the mountains by a practicable route to a connection with the Oregon and Pacific coast. This would furnish the most direct route between Chicago and the West. The Pacific coast, and direct rail connection with Portland and San Francisco, and by acting in concert with the O. R. & N. Co. would provide the shortest line between the American east and Puget Sound. This would bring rail communication to the coast, and the steamer run from Victoria. In the event of this transcontinental line being completed, and the route to the coast will be, it would compel the Northern Pacific to draw still nearer to the seaboard. It has long been the contention of those who have watched the various moves that have been made on the railway chess-board, and who have acquainted themselves with the railway situation in the Northern Pacific most intimately, that it will be a termination at Ship Harbor on Puget Island, in an almost direct line with Victoria. This would furnish a terminus of magnificent facilities, and would provide the shortest line to the harbor at all seasons, and its terminus would be not an hour's steamer run from Victoria. While all this is being done, and every one's eyes are eager to see an accomplished fact, Victoria is waiting quietly, and with nervous hands, for the news of three transcontinental railways ready to carry her traffic, and who will be in a position to successfully compete for business which she so firmly holds, but which is being looked after by other centers. ### RAILWAY COLLISION IN ROCHESTER PASS

The following is a copy of a lengthy description of the Rochester Pass train wreck, which occurred on the morning of Nov. 10, 1903, at the junction of the Canadian Pacific and the Great Northern railways, near the town of Rochester, Ont.

The train, which was composed of a passenger car, a baggage car, and a freight car, was traveling from Toronto to Montreal. It was struck by a freight train from the west, which was also carrying a passenger car. The collision occurred at a crossing, and the passenger car was crushed.

The driver of the passenger car, Mr. J. F. Carling, was killed. The driver of the freight train, Mr. W. H. Smith, was also killed. Several other passengers were injured, and the freight car was derailed.

### Loss on the Grade and Golden Rule

Both Trains Ditched and Completely Wrecked.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 8.—Private dispatches from Rochester, Pa., give information respecting a collision which occurred there on Saturday night between the Canadian Pacific railway passenger and freight trains. Two passengers, and one of the drivers, were reported as working near the wreckage. The passenger train was derailed, and the freight train was completely wrecked.
