

COL. OTTER TALKS BUSINESS.

The Exhibition Directors Must Remove the Fence From the Horse Ring. Mr. Allan, Lamb, Saunders, Bailey, Surveyor Stanley, Park Commissioner Chambers and Col. Otter visited the rifle range yesterday afternoon for the purpose of arriving at some definite understanding as to the amount of work still required to be done there. It will take about \$2500 to complete the range. The most important work yet to do is the construction of the butte for the 1000 yards range and the completion of the buildings. Over \$87,000 has already been spent out of an estimate of \$300,000.

Col. Otter complained that the Exhibition directors and the City Council were not carrying out the agreement made with the rifle range over to the city for exhibition purposes. One instance he referred to was the fence around the horse ring. He claimed that the agreement states that no permanent fence was to be erected, as the land was required for military drill, and that the Exhibition Association was only entitled to use it two weeks in the year. He said it was the intention of the Militia Department to order the fence taken down. This will mean an expenditure of \$2000 annually to the Fair Directors.
