

At the meeting of the Property Committee yesterday Commissioner Coatsworth presented a report showing the appropriations and expenditures for the various works performed by the department to Dec. 31, 1894. According to this statement the expenditure exceeds the *ppropriation by \$273.76. In the matter of the Western Cattle Market there is a deficit of \$679.39.




