The Harvest Festival will be held on Sunday, Sth of October: Professor Clark has kindly promised to preach at the Evening Service, and the Rev. Edward Cayley in the morning.

Sunday, October 15th, will be observed throughout the Church as a Day of Intercession for Sunday Schools. The day will begin with a Celebration at 8 a.m., at which the Rector will give a short address to Church Workers.

During the absence of the parochial Clergy on their summer holiday, the Church was under the care in July of Rev. F. Davidson, and in August of Rev. E. C. Cayley. During August the Rector paid two short visits to Toronto, but spent most of the summer on his island in Muskoka. Mr. Rounthwaite was away all August taking summer duty at a parish near Boston.

With October the work of the various parochial organizations begin. The W. A. hold their first meeting on the 6th, and the Harvest Festival inaugurates the special work of the Chancel Guild. Most of the Sunday School teachers have now returned from their holidays, but more are still wanted to take the place of two who are leaving.

There is so much to be done and so few to do it. Can we not rouse ourselves? Can we not say: "Be no longer a chaos, but a world or even worldkin. Produce, Produce! were it but the pitifullest infinitismal fraction of a Product, produce it in God's Name. "Tis the utmost thou hast in thee; out with it then.
