Trafalgar coast. From Niagara-on-the-Lake take the westerly stone road direct to St . Catharines. A more direct route to St. Catharines from the Falls is via Stamford and Thorold, branching west at Stamford. Leave St. Catharines by crossing canal and climbing western hill, thence direct to Hamilton, the whole road being good gravel and macadam. Leave Hamilton by York street and Lake Shore road to Oakville, where choice of routes is offered to Toronto, the northerly route via Trafalgar and Dundas street being the better, though the Lake Shore road via Port Credit is not bad unless after rain, and is certainly more picturesque.

Leave Hamilton by King street west, until Hamilton and Dundas R.R. is passed, then south to Ancaster over good stone road, rather hilly; thence west to Brantford, road fair. From Brantford to Woodstock is fairly level, mostly good gravel with some sand, and $A_{1}$ after rain. Leave Woodstock by Dundas street to Woodburn Mills, then west to In: gersoll and London, over good gravel roads. Leave London by York street bridge and along Wharncliffe road to Lambeth and south to St. Thomas, good gravel. Thence via Talbot road to Port Talbot, and north-west to Wallacetown, the latter part of the road being hilly. Very heavy sand between Wallacetown and Clearville, with many hills, then road improves in surface and hills disappear, becoming finally a regular race track for the last 45 miles. See also route Wallacetown to Blenheim.

This road is all fine gravel, and by taking train from Ridgetown to Dutton the sands around Clearville are escaped. No hills. This was the route always chosen in the days of the solid-tired ordinary. Tourists not wishing to enter St. Thomas may continue over fine gravel north-east from Shedden $63 / 4$ miles to Talbotville, on the Hamilton to Windsor route.

Leave Hamilton by King street west, following stone road through Main street of Dundas, under G. T. R. tracks to Greensville, continuing north to Freelton. (The latter part of the road is somewhat heavy after rain, as it passes through a swamp.) A good gravel road runs from Freelton to Guelph. Leave Guelph by Woolwich street, proceeding to Marden, where take the right fork of road going north-east to Fergus, thence to Mount Forest, the whole distance being over fine gravel roads. Leave Mount Forest by the Garafraxa road, which leads straight into Owen Sound. These roads are somewhat hilly, but surface generally is good, with some perfect stretches.

The hills on this road are numerous, but all rideable, the worst being near Toronto. At Oak Ridges, between Bond Lake and Aurora, is the height of land between the waters of Lakes Erie and Simcoe,

From Barrie take the Ridge road along the shore of Lake Simcoe, good gravel as far as Hawkestone, thence over sand roads into Orillia. Leave Orillia by the Muskoka road, which is rather poor and sandy most of the way, though there is a fair stretch between Ardtrea and Severn Bridge.

the limits of the regular city drives. Then ferry to Repentigny and clay roads to St. Sulpice, with fair clay roads intermingled with long grass; then passing through St. Felix, St. Joseph, St. Gabriel, which are only a few miles apart, meeting sandy roacis towards Lanoraie, where walking is the only alternative, for acres of sand can be seen on all sides, but getting better tuwards Berthier.

Clay roads will be found to St. Cuthbert and heavy clay roads to Maskinonge, and lumpy with deep dust to Yamachiche, inclining to sand towards Point du Lac. Good walking to Three Rivers on eccount of the sand mixed with long grass; and where wheeling can be taken in it would be best to take the wagon-wheel track. Crossing the bridge from Three Rivers to Piles Branch, heavy sand will be encountered for about 4 miles, getting better towards Champlain, and contiuue about the same to Batiscan; here cross by the ferry, which consists of one of the latest inventions and rowed on the "windlass" plan. When across the tourist will do well to enquire of the natives which is the proper road to take.

After a couple of miles a novelty in the line of roads will be encountered in the form of sawdust, which is not as bad as sand, but is very heavy wheeling until past St. Anne de la Parade, where macadam roads will be found through Grondines, La Chevrotiere, Deschambault, and then the nicest piece of road of the whole trip is from the latter place to Portneuf, a distance of 6 miles. At this place a boarding house only can be had instead of a hotel as is usually the case, and the traveller is advised here to fill his pockets (so to speak) for future occasions with the necessaries of life, it being very hard to get anything

that is palatable for a good many miles afterwards.

Leaving Portneuf, roads begin to get very hard with clay lumps, making very slow wheeling to St. Bazile, and getting rocky and very "hilly" towards Point Rouge. Up to this point the land has been very level, but steep hills where "walking is good" will be encountered from here to Quebec. Macadam roads continue from Pt . Rouge to Belair, a distance of 15 miles, the longest distance between any of the towns. The roads then incline to clay passing through Lorette and getting better towards Quebec. Of course these clay roads were passed over on dry days; when it rains - - This journey was performed by Mr . Louis Rubenstein, of the Montreal Bicycle Club, who was accompanied by Mr. J. H. Thomlinson, of the same club.

Leave Quebec by Island ferry, sailing from Champlain market wharf. The landing is at Beaulieu on the Island. Take road to left and wheel to St. Pierre, 5 miles. This is best starting point for round trip.

At Beaulieu is the only hotel on the Island, but it is first-class in every respect. Good boarding houses everywhere else. The road from St. Laurent to St. Francois is very good, but the remainder is not much to brag of. Near St. Laurent you have to face a steep hill. It is not absolutely necessary to go round by St. Pierre in starting. The trip may be made from Beaulieu straight to St. Laurent, but perennial mud covers this road for 3 miles or so. The other road is longer and rough, but it is a long way preferable to mud.

Once the Levis Heights are surmounted the roads are generally level until nearing the boundary. As far as St. Henri the road is good macadam. Leaving St. Joseph the country gets gradually wilder and more unsettled, and the roads less beaten by traffic. Wheeling is very good. C.W.A. consuls at St. John, Sussex, Moncton and Amherst. Nearly all the above hotels give special rates to C.W.A. members. The road from this point to Halifax is little used since the railroad has been built, except in a roundabout way through Pugwash, Wallace, Tatamagouche, River John, Pictou and Truro to Haliax. A considerable portion of the road is through a disinteresting part of the country. There is another road from Amherst which follows the raiiroad over the Cobequid mountains, but it is poor wheeling. The most popular route from St. John to Halifax is to cross the Bay of Fundy to Digby and ride up the Annapolis valley.

Go straight from Winnipeg via Main street north to Selkirk-one road, and no one could miss it-a good clay road, but not passable after a shower.

At Selkirk, is a historic church and graveyard, as it is here all the old first settlers are buried. At St. Paul's, 2 miles further on, is an Indian Industrial School, carried on by the Episcopalian Church. At Lower Fort Garry is a stockaded fort yet used by the Hudson Bay Co. At Selkirk is a Lunatic Asylum and the Government Fish Hatcheries (the largest in the Dominion). A trip further north to the Indian Reserve might be interesting, especially if the tourist could arrive about the time "treaty money" was being paid.

Little more may be said about this road than that it lies almost parallel with the railway track, and is well traveled, affording good wheeling the full distance. The soil is clay with slight mixture of sand, and gets into wheeling shape very soon after even a heavy rain. Virden, a nice Manitoba town, built mostly of stone, is by all odds the best midway stopping-place.

This is a clay road all the way through and is well travelled. Except after a rain it is excellent wheeling the whole distance.

Starting trom the Leland House, Winnipeg, turn south on Main street across the Assiniboine and down River avenue and Pembina street. Follow the electric car track as far as the Pembina school, turning there to the right, and by taking this trail it will-lead right out towards the river and to St. Norbert. From here on the road runs between the river and the railway track, and the scenery is very pretty. Around St. Agathe the road is more apt to be cut up. With the roads in anything like their normal condition, Morris can be reached by noon, and the tourist is sure of a good meal at the Commercial. The road from Morris to Letellier runs along the track, sometimes on one side and sometimes on the other. After leaving Letellier cross the track below the elevator and take the first good trail running to the left (towards the river), and this leads right to the bridge crossing the river to Emerson. From Emerson to Pembina, N.D., is only about three miles and is a good road.

## Portage la Prairie to Brandon.



Follow Saskatchewan avenue west as far as McCulloch's, take the trail to the right and go direct west again over a good road. "This is one "trail," and follows almost parallel to the railway track clear through to Moosomin. After passing McGregor the road to Austin goes through the sand hills which are practically "unwheelable," as the machine would sink up to the hubs in the soft, yielding sand. From Austin to Sidney the road is fair but sandy, and from Sidney to Carberry is again through sand hills. As the road leaves Carberry it is light, but after getting past Sewell is much better wheeling and improves until Brandon, " the wheat city," is reached. The tourist is advised to board the C.P.R. at Portage and stay on board until Carberry is reached, as on this road there would be a lot of "get off and push." hard. grand ; railway
