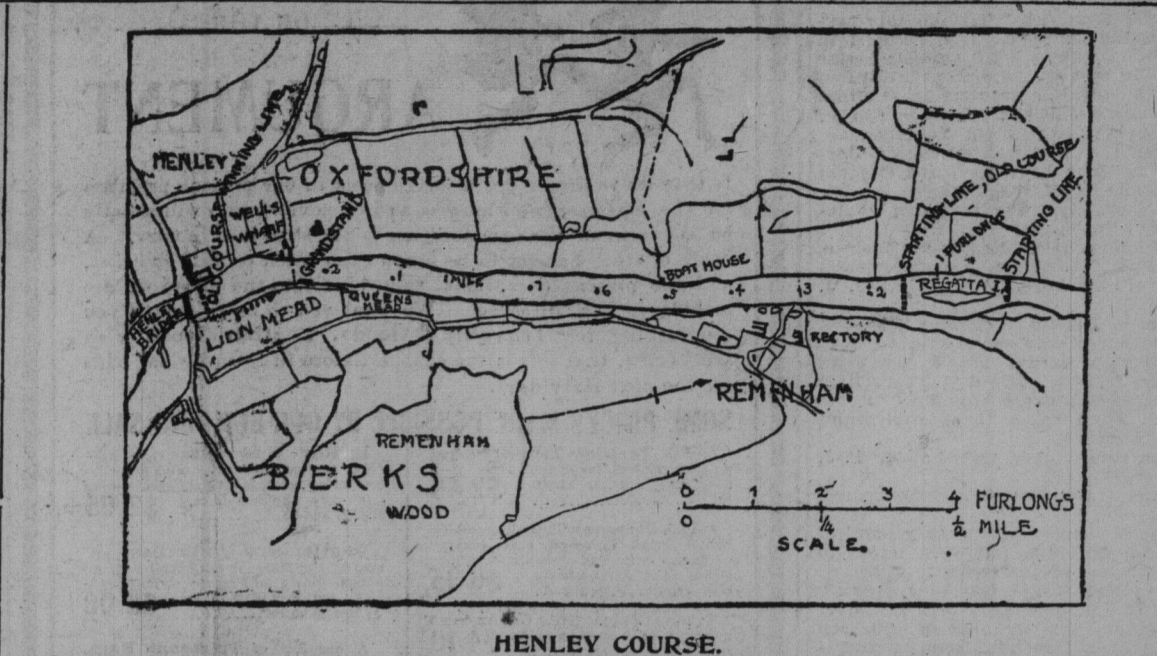

JAP. GUNBOAT GOES DOWN STRIKES A RUSSIAN WINE

Report of a Brisk Advance of Japanese, Driving the Enemy Backward. Washington, July 7.—The Japanese legation has received the following telegram from Tokyo, dated today: 'Admiral Togo reports that on July 5 our gunboat Kaimon while on a special mission in the waters outside of Tientsin, in a dense fog, struck a Russian mine and sank. Three officers, including commander Takashi and nineteen petty officers and men are missing. The rest were saved.'

FORCED RUSSIANS BACK.

Tatechikou, July 7.—The Japanese advanced over the mountain crests early this morning and advanced on Kaichow, compelling General Chirikoff with the centre of the Russian vanguard to fall back. A whole brigade of Japanese, with masses of cavalry, followed and occupied the Village of Narayan, driving out two companies of Russian infantry and two companies of Cossacks, who were entrenched there. The Japanese arrived within five miles of Kaichow. It was then nightfall. Gen. Sannosoff made an heroic attempt to check the Japanese, galloping out with guns to shell the Japanese left and inflicting loss on both belligerents in Manchuria. He was killed. His retreat would be cut off, he fell back and is now holding Kaichow. Gen. Chirikoff's force is stationed southeast of Kaichow.

CHOLERA IN THE EAST.

Washington, July 7.—A cable report from United States Minister Allen at Seoul points to the existence of a great danger to both belligerents in Manchuria. He says that he has learned from a missionary surgeon that cholera has broken out at Manchuria and appeared at Antung.

THRU HIS ESTIMATES.

Ottawa, July 7.—(Special.)—The estimate of finance gives notice to-night of additional tariff changes. On spirits, manufactured from sugar syrup, molasses or other saccharine matter, a duty of 15.00 per gallon is imposed, the same as if the spirit is manufactured from not less than 50 per cent of raw or unaltered grain. Crushed or ground malt hereafter is to pay a duty of 21.25 per pound. The change takes effect tomorrow.

CHALLENGES DURMAN.

London, July 8.—Colonial Secretary Lyttelton, replying to E.R.P. Moon, M.P., who asked why the services of those detailed from the naval service of Canada awarded the medals in 1868, were not awarded the medal, said the medals given were in 1868 and 1870, but it was not considered desirable to grant the medal to the men who defected since their services amounted to the policing of the frontier, and not to actual military operations.

WIDOW CAUSED HIS DEATH

Business Complications Weighed Heavily on Mr. Long's Mind—Body Taken to Collingwood.

In business circles in Toronto, the untimely death of John J. Long was the subject of much comment yesterday. His prominent position as one of the first capitalists in Canada, his association with numerous enterprises having their sources and whole being in Canada, his record as a business man, and his relations, social and commercial, tend to make his taking of a master of more than passing interest to the business world. What the dictum of the coroner leaves no official doubt to the manner of his end, and while his police officers who found the body in the Don declare that with the exception of the fact that the body was bleeding at the nose when found, there was no sign of violence; yet there is a feeling throughout the city that the deceased had been of late so beset by the stress of business pressure, added to the knowledge of the state of his health, that it would not be surprising to say that he died of a heart attack.

MR. LONG'S FUNERAL.

Collingwood, July 7.—(Special.)—The remains of the late John J. Long were brought home today. A crowd of two hundred or more were gathered at the station when the train arrived at one o'clock, the casket being conveyed in a special car. Tenderly it was carried to the house which was waiting and taken to the residence. During the service were read many sympathetic callers, and a large number of telegrams and several cables of condolence were received.
