QUESTION XIII. - What Ministers or Probationers for the Ministry have died?

Asnwer: George Johnson. George Johnson, a native of Yorkshire, Eng., who, in the 83rd year of his age, passed away at Horton, on Aug. 21st, 1891. When but a child, his father's family was caught in the tide of emigration, even then strongly setting westward. The wreck, in the Bay of Fundy, of the *Trafalgar*, in which they sailed, with other emigrants bound for the Upper Provinces, led the family to seek a home in New Brunswick, at Coverdale, where they settled. The son was early converted, but, through unhallowed associations, was led back into sin. In 1828, during a very extensive revival, under Arthur McNutt, then in the 1st year of his regular itinerancy, he was again awakened to a sense of danger, and, after a week of deep sorrow, bordering at times on despair, was blessed with an unusual manifestation of Christ, and with a consciousness of pardon and of which, more than half a century later, he spoke with graceful emotion. Having resolved to make the most of himself for God, his studious habits soon became a subject of general remark among the Methodist itinerants in that section of New Brunswick. After several preaching tours in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, he was accepted, in 1830, as a candidate for the ministry by the English Wesleyan Miss. Committee, on the recommendation of the N. B. District. The itinerant Ministry, then commenced, led him into various important circuits, in the two provinces already named. In none was his ministry more greatly blessed than in the Woodstock Mission, where, in 1842. long-continued special services led many into the fellowship of the Church, some of whom proved pillars in He was a diligent student to the last, well acquainted with the history of Methodism, and well read in her theology, and his sermons were clear and impressive presentations of the fundamental truths of the Gospel. At the end of 40 years' service he settled, as a supernumerary, at Horton, his residence until his death. The congregation at that place welcomed him to their pulpit as long as he felt himself able to enter it. As if to greet his brethren once more, he attended the Conference last year at Windsor, where he met them with genial spirit and attended the sessions with the punctuality and regularity which had been characteristic of his whole life. His final illness was brief; unconsciousness during his later hours, preventing any expression of personal feeling, but from the recollection of his faithful service and unblemished record, his family, and his brethren and successors in the Ministry, derive satisfaction which even dying utterances could but slightly increase.

CONSTITUTION FOR SUSTENTATION FUND.

This Fund shall be called "The Sustentation Fund of the Nova Scotia Conference."

П

The general management of this Fund shall be in the hands of a Committee, which shall consist of a Minister and Layman from each District, who shall be chosen at the Annual Session of the District, together with a Secretary-Treasurer, who shall be elected by ballot by the Conference.

III

The Fund shall consist of such monies as may be raised in the bounds of the Conference in the manner following, viz.:—

(a)—By Legacies or Special Donations.

(b)—By Donations or Annuity.

(c)—Subscriptions and Collections on various Circuits.

IV.

In making disbursements the Committee shall be governed by the following regulations.

I.—Probationers to receive a salary of \$350, and ordained unmarried men in full connexion. \$400.

II.—All married men in full work claimants on the fund to receive \$600 for the first five years after ordination, afterwards to receive \$650.

Should there be any balance remaining after raising the salaries to the figures above mentioned, such balance to be divided among all men of upwards of five years standing, and a deficiency of \$50 greater among ordained married men of five years standing or less, until all receive \$750.

III.—The basis of distribution shall be the amount estimated by Finan-

SABBATH SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPORT.

An examination of the statistical returns from our several districts for this important branch of church work enables your Committee to report progress, and gives them ground upon which to base their recommendations for future work. We have two hundred and thirty schools, an increase of seven upon last year, and to that extent an encouragement; but on the other hand we have four hundred and twenty preaching appointments. It is plain, therefore, that for the most part the preacher is with us the forerunner of the Sabbath School, and not so often as we could desire does the Sabbath School worker precede the preacher. Then, again, more than one-third of our schools are winter-killed, and while it is plain that all our schools cannot be kept open the year through, we cannot but feel that more of them might be so kept than are. In places where they cannot we recommend the formation of Home schools for the study of the lessons, household-gatherings in which two or more families might join; such Home schools to be regarded as classes of the regular school.

It is gratifying to find a large increase in the number of officers and teachers. We urge the attendance of our teachers upon S. S. Conventions, whether it be our own district conventions or the inter-denominational conventions held in our midst. We are workers together with Christ and the workmen are all the better for acquaintance with each other.

Our scholars number thirteen thousand three hundred and fifty-eight. We have room for more, and advise special effort to bring into our schools all our young people. Let there be a children's day on all our circuits, and let everything lawful be used to draw the heart of our young to Christ. To convert the young is the glory of our work, and we rejoice that in this respect the past year has been the most successful that we know of. It is not enough to convert—we must build up character. We advise our Circuit S. S. Committees to provide a catechism for every scholar. We strongly recommend every librarian to see that his library contains Dr. T. W. Smith's History of Methodism in E. B. A., and we recommend our committees to see that our schools be well supplied with our own S. S. papers.

We also record our convictions that greater care should be exercised in the selection and dissemination by the Book-Room of books which form the Sabbath School libraries.

Our returns of pledged abstainers are unsatisfactory, and we recommend our Superintendents to report not the number who have taken pledge during the year only but the total number of pledged abstainers in the schools.

REPORT OF STATE OF WORK.

1. On a review of the year's work your Committee rejoice to report a vigorous state of Christian activity and life throughout the Conference generally. We thank God for an ingathering of souls, numbering about 1,500; but deplore that, owing to emigration and removals, we have lost 562; 304 have died, 57 have withdrawn, and 377 are reported as "dropped," leaving us a net increase of 189.

We hail with pleasure the special mention in all the District reports

of the organizing and effective work of Epworth Leagues.

We regret that so little mention is made of the Class Meeting as a distinctive means of grace, and we would urge that this matter receive very careful attention on the part of the brethren. We would also recommend that our own Hymn Books be more generally used in our social services.

4. We regret the frequent mention in the District reports of the prevalence of a worldly and careless spirit amongst some of those who are identified with us in membership, and we would emphasize the counsel of the Committee of last year, and urge the members of our Church to avoid indulgence in the amusements specially forbidden by Discipline.

5. Believing that in many of our Circuits Love Feast services are not observed, we would call the attention of the Conference to the Discipline,

REPORT OF THE EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

There are 51 chapters of the Epworth League, an increase of 26 during the year. There are enrolled 1797 members, showing an increase of 956 as compared with the returns of last year. The amount raised for League

We recommend all such Societies to adopt the constitution provided by the General Conference, thus placing themselves in line with the legislation of our Church.

REPORT OF CAMP MEETING COMMITTEE.

Your Committee recommend that Rev. John Craig, of the Berwick Circuit, be appointed by this Conference to cooperate with the President as Superintendent of the services to be held during the approaching season.

Your Committee also desire to emphasize and to bring prominently before this Conference the large attendance and the deep spirituality characterizing

the services held last year. As in the mass of modern Camp Meetings the social services of Church life and its development occupy an increasingly large place in their work, so the building up of spiritual life in believers is becoming a more prominent result in Camp Meeting Agency. This was especially so last year; and we would kindly impress upon our ministers the importance of commending the institution to our people, securing their attendance and coming themselves whenever practicable, for the larger the attendance of Church and pastors, the richer will be the spiritual results to Christians and the greater the prospect of success in Evangelizing. By donations from persons unselfishly devoted to the cause provision is made for the accommodation of a number of ministers who will devote themselves to the work for at least a part of the week, good board being furnished for a mere trifle. No help outside our own Conference was employed last year, yet many pronounced it the most spiritual and blessed of our Camp Meetings.

Your Committee and the Association are looking to the same means, our own ministers and people for even richer results this year.

That in view of the woe and ruin wrought for both worlds by strong drink,—this Conference affirms that the maintenance of any complicity with this evil, either by the personal use of liquors as a beverage, or the affording of any facilities for, or encouragement to the prosecution of the trade in the same, and of membership in the Methodist Church, whether official or private, is incompatible with a correct Christian sense of duty to man, degrading to the Church and dishonoring to God.

With respect to political action, we declare our unalterable resolve to accept no compromise with the drink evil. *Unconditional surrender and complete extirpation* is our demand. We regard with utter condemnation the acceptance of monetary consideration—whether as license fees or Federal revenue—as any sufficient justification for the perpetuation of this trade in drink in any of its forms. "Woe to him that buildeth a town with blood, and stablisheth a city by iniquity." (Hab. II., 12.)

Believing that every legally qualified voter within this Dominion is solemnly responsible to God for the influence he does or might exert upon the government of the country, we enjoin upon every Methodist of this class, that the great privilege of the franchise be tenaciously employed to rescue our country from the guilt and dishonor which her past complicity with the liquor traffic has brought upon her.

While we are compelled to affirm that it is not within the proper functions of this Conferential Body to dictate or even recommend to its adherents, affiliation with any political party whatever, we must at the same time maintain that the drink trade is a crime of the greatest magnitude against society and against God. That no political issue now before this Dominion is comparable in the urgency attending it with this issue; and we therefore record our solemn judgment that no political party that condones this traffic, or that refuses to place itself in an attitude of decided hostility to it, is deserving of the allegiance of Christian or patriotic men.

In view of the possibility that the Royal Commission appointed by our Federal Government, to secure information touching the drink evil and the best means for its abatement, may visit this Province before we shall again meet in Conference, we recommend that the Executive Committee of the Conference be requested to watch carefully the progress of this investigation; and to collect and submit to the said Commission, such information, and otherwise to represent before it the Methodist Church in Nova Scotia, as our interests, and the welfare of the people at large, may seem to require.

We hail with profound satisfaction and great hopefulness, the introduction into the school law of this Province, of the regulation securing compulsory instruction in scientific temperance in all our common schools.

Your Committee recommend that the Conference commission an equal number of ministers and laymen to attend the next session of the Council of the Dominion Temperance Alliance, provided this can be secured without charge to any connexional fund.

The appalling information that is submitted from the most reliable sources concerning the extent of the opium scourge, especially in China and India, and the unchallenged declaration that the opium habit is increasing its hold upon the people of many Christian lands, including our own country, combine to demand the strongest expression of our sense of shame and repro-

bation of all Imperial legislation tending to fasten upon any people or lauguage this foul wrong; and to call for the adoption of the strongest measures possible for the exclusion and extermination of this evil from our own beloved Dominion.

Also: It is desirable that all Lay Delegates, upon receiving notification of their election, shall acquaint the Superintendent of the Conference town with respect to their attendance.

UNLICENCED MINISTERS.

Whereas, From time to time persons who are strangers to our Conference come amongst us requesting access to our pulpits and soliciting letters of recommendation from our ministers;

Resolved, That this Conference hereby urges upon the several Circuits that all such applications be refused, except to those who produce unmistakeable credentials.

SPIRITUAL REPORTS.

Resolved, That spiritual reports be required of Superintendents of Circuits as well as from Missions at the Annual District Meeting.

VISITORS FROM MOUNT ALLISON.

Resolved, That this Conference recognizes with pleasure the presence, on its platform, of Dr. Allison, President of Mount Allison University, Rev. Dr. Stewart, Dean of the Faculty of Theology, and Prof. Andrews, of the Department of Natural Science.

It has heard with much satisfaction of the continued progress of the Institutions, and is sincerely grateful for that faithfulness, enthusiasm, and self-denial on the part of the Faculty to which the progress in question is so manifestly due.

It appreciates fully its responsibility in maintaining and increasing the efficiency of the Institutions, and pledges itself to do its utmost to commend them to the sympathy and liberality of our people, and particularly to make the approaching semi-centennial a grand success.

EDUCATIONAL JUBILEE.

Resolved, That we re-affirm the action of our last Conference expressive of the purpose of cordial and earnest co-operation with the Board of Regents of the University of Mount Allison College in the celebration of the Jubilee of our Educational Institutions during the year upon which we are entering, and that we will welcome the representatives of the Board of Regents to any of our Circuits on which they may desire to hold Jubilee services.

EDUCATIONAL MEETINGS.

Conference recommends that Circuits and Missions, when possible, arrange to have representatives of the Alumni and Alumnæ of Mount Allison take part in the Annual Educational Meetings.

REV. DR. McLEOD.

Soon after a visit to Nova Scotia, to which reference is made in our minutes of 1891, the Rev. Dr. McLeod finished his course with joy. He died Nov. 1891.

He was born in St. John in 1808, first studied law, but later became a theological student, entered the ministry of the Methodist Church in 1830 and for twenty-three years was connected with the missions of British Methodism in these provinces. Dr. McLeod was a scholar of no mean attainments, a theologian of the genuine Wesleyan type, and a gifted and successful preacher of the gospel of Jesus Christ. He was not only an eminent expositor, but a distinguished defender of our doctrines. He understood the power of the press and was mainly instrumental in founding the Wesleyan as a connexional organ, thus meeting at that time, 1839, a deeply felt need.

The memory of this honored servant of Christ is still cherished by aged Methodists in several circuits of our Conference. During his recent visit to

Dr. Lathern be requested to invite the attention of the N. B. and P. E. I. Conference to the action of the Eastern delegates and to the resolution of this Conference on this subject, and that the Rev. G. J. Bond be instructed to communicate with the Newfoundland Conference, and that both of these Conferences be invited to co-operate.
