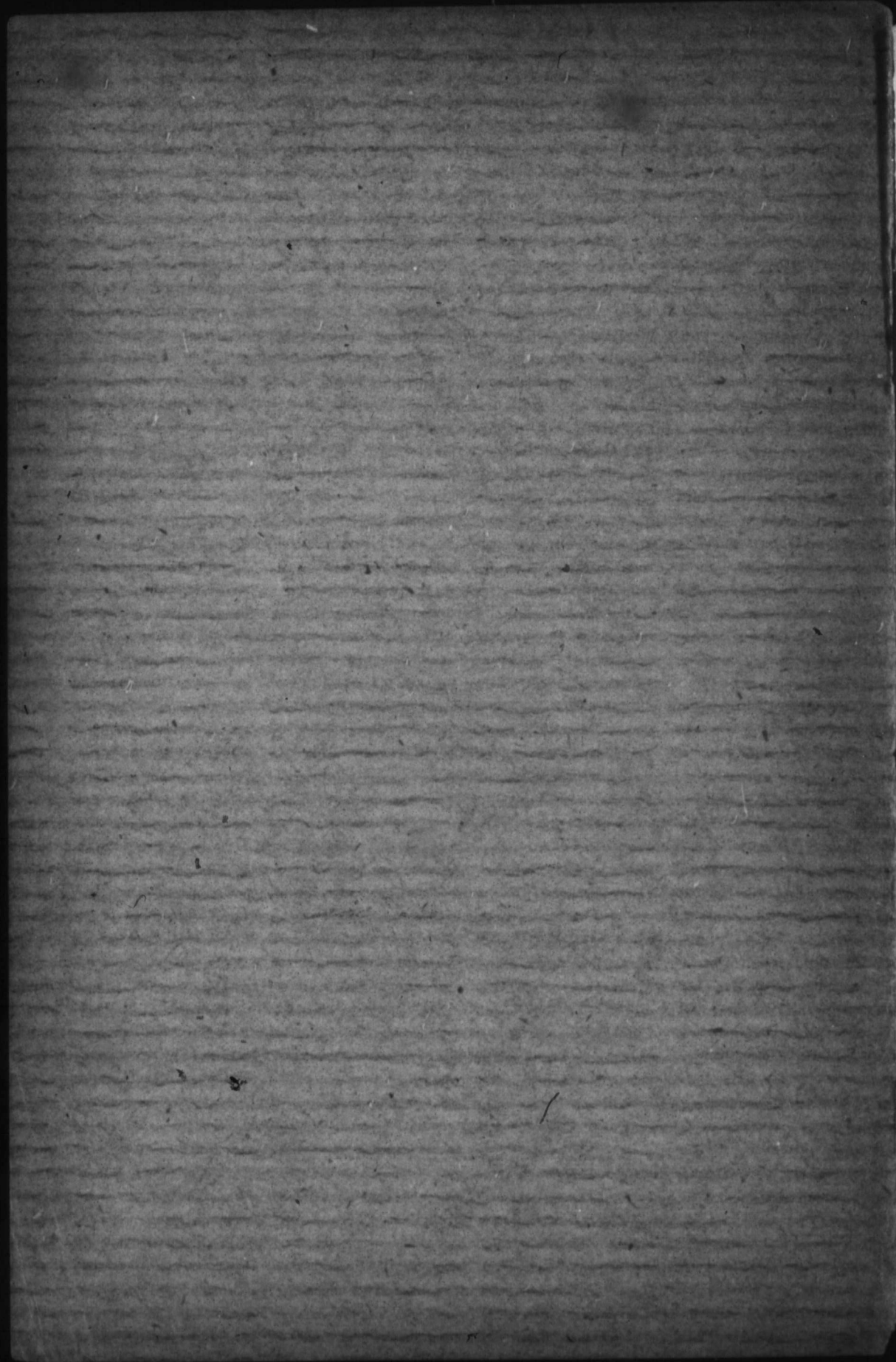

THIRTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Industrial Refuge, and the Eighth of the Aged Woman's Home.

In preparing to send forth the thirty-eighth Annual Report of the Industrial Refuge, we are once more called upon to testify to the ever unchanging and watchful care of our Heavenly Father, and to praise and bless His holy name for the many tokens of His loving kindness toward this institution and the many needy ones in it. We would thank Him also, that, though it has pleased Him to remove during the past year, three of our oldest members, He still raises up others to carry on the work. Mrs. Freeland, Mrs. Watson, and Mrs. McMurrich have passed away from this earthly scene; but while here they labored earnestly and faithfully from the formation of what was then known as the Magdalen Asylum and Industrial Refuge, until the last few years, when age and failing health obliged them to withdraw from active service, though they never lost their interest in its well-being and prosperity. And prospered, we think we are safe in asserting, it has, not perhaps in large numbers—there are too many refuges in Toronto to look for large numbers in any one—but in the many, who have for years forsaken their evil ways and are throughout the country leading happy, industrious lives. Only the week before last we had a visit from one such, who, being in Toronto to see her mother-in-law, came to the Refuge to express her gratitude for what had been done for her many years ago. While others still in the Refuge show, in the most un-

mistakable manner, that they too are grateful for the kind hands held out to help them from the degraded, miserable lives into which they had fallen.

Then, too, this year, like several past ones, testifies to the interest they take in the welfare of the institution, and their willingness to do what they can to meet its expenses. The net amount for work done by them was \$1619.83, being a little over one-half of the total expenditure, exclusive of all the house-sewing and house-work needed for themselves.

On Sept. 30th, 1890, there were in the Refuge 23 inmates. To these were added during the year 37, making a total of 60. Fifteen of these left before the time of probation was up; one sent to the Mercer, one to General Hospital, two were received back by their friends, and nine went to service, leaving twenty-eight in the Refuge, Sept. 30th, 1891.

We have the great satisfaction of knowing that though the number 60 may appear small, there are only three of these re-admissions. And this means that the full probation of twelve months has been passed in the Refuge by nearly one-half, while 13 of those admitted during the year are still trying to overcome their evil propensities.

The one we were obliged to send to the General Hospital died there. She had to undergo an operation from which she was too feeble to recover. For several years she had been a most faithful and uncomplaining worker, though often suffering much pain, and in every possible way showed her gratitude for the care taken of her, and we trust was forgiven and accepted in Christ Jesus her Saviour.

In such an institution we have, of course, many restless and wayward ones (especially restless and wayward when deprived of the stimulants they have been in the habit of indulging in), and I had almost added—the hopelessly incorrigible. But having been secretary for twenty-six years and having watched the results of patient, persevering, prayerful dealing with such, I dare not use that term.

These qualities so essential to the successful management of a Refuge, added to great firmness in enforcing the rules

we have, we are glad to say, combined in Mrs. Spence and her daughter, and consequently the usual routine work of the Refuge goes on in a comparatively quiet and regular manner. Many of the women look on the Refuge as their *home*, and Mrs. and Miss Spence as their best friends.

The New Year's entertainment given by the teachers who so faithfully attend to the religious instruction on the Sabbath, was, as usual, a decided success, and very much enjoyed by all; friends assisting by sending contributions of money or cake. We heartily thank the young friends who so materially added to the enjoyment of the evening by reading and singing. Also to the choir of old St. Andrews, we are indebted for a very pleasant musical evening.

The religious instruction on the Sabbath, is also very much helped by the assistance of these young ladies, both in playing the organ and leading the singing. While our kind friend, Mrs. Renaud, never fails to speak a kind word and read to the inmates whenever she is in Toronto. We thank them all and pray God to greatly bless them in their labour of love.

Mr. Alcorn, Mr. James Brown, and several of the students from Wycliffe College attend most regularly to the religious services on the Sabbath; Mr. Anderson taking the place of our old friend Mr. Mair, who, for many years, not only visited regularly, but was ever ready with a kind, earnest, sympathetic, and yet warning word, to each inmate. He died last August. We thank them most heartily.

To Dr. Britton and Dr. Moore we cannot too strongly express our appreciation of their very great attention to the sick inmates.

Our thanks are also due to Dudley & Burns, for printing our report at greatly reduced rates.

THE AGED WOMAN'S HOME.

Before entering on our Report we would acknowledge the protecting and over-ruling care of our Heavenly Father, who has from the first inception of this Home greatly strengthened the hands and encouraged the hearts of the Managers.

As has been mentioned in a previous report, we were led in 1887 to try to meet a well-known want, viz., a Home for respectable aged women, by utilizing rooms not needed for the Refuge. These were cut off from the main building and a separate entrance added. In this humble way the Home was opened with nine respectable aged women and a kind matron to watch over them. God so blessed these efforts that in these eight years we have been obliged to add to the building two or three times; making room for twenty with the necessary attendants. This success has proved the absolute necessity there is for the existence of such a Home, and, therefore, it has grown more and more on the sympathies of the benevolent. In last year's report we spoke very strongly as to the urgent need of additional accomodation, particularly as many applicants had been refused for want of room; and, also, that the internal arrangements were not such, by any means, what the Managers desired, and, indeed, considered necessary. And the following resolution was passed at our last annual meeting: "That we take immediate steps to ascertain the best, speediest, and most economical way in which we can enlarge the present accommodation in the Aged Woman's Home." The result has been, that after much serious and prayerful consideration we have determined to build a new Home on our adjoining vacant lot, rather than attempt to add to the present building. We have already accepted plans and tenders, and work on it is begun. The building will face on Belmont Street, and will be of the best red brick, and with every necessary convenience and comfort for fifty inmates and the needed attendants; the cost

about \$18,000. The Managers are aware that the liberal citizens of Toronto are being very much pressed just now for contributions to several buildings intended for charitable purposes, and for that reason they do not, at present, intend to tax their generosity by soliciting subscriptions to this Home. They have \$5,000 to begin with, and will borrow the additional sum needed; trusting, with assured confidence, that they will receive in the near future, whatever may be required. At the same time they will gladly receive any donations voluntarily sent for this purpose.

This Home appeals to the very best instincts of our nature. No one would willingly see or hear of a decent old woman being neglected. Aged mothers, perhaps, whose families have passed away, or, sad to say, have wandered far from home, leaving her, who gave them birth and cared for them, to the tender mercies of strangers in their declining years. Or single women who had faithfully provided for themselves till old age and loss of health left them a burden on the community.

No; we as Christian women, do wish, and consider it an imperative duty to see to it, that such women are made comfortable and happy in their last days. And this Home, in the eight years of its existence, has been enabled to give that comfort and care to 23 old, feeble and respectable women who have passed to the Home above. 14 of these ranged from 81 to 86 years of age, and nine from 70 to 79, and all these with few exceptions had been several years in the Home. At the present time there are in it nine above 70, four above 60. Now we unhesitatingly ask, Is not this a charity every one would willingly contribute to? But we must be careful not to be misunderstood when we speak of it as a charity. All of those admitted, either themselves, or their church, or friends, pay \$5 a month, and we get a Government grant, but *not a city one*. It will be easily understood, however, that this is not sufficient to provide the care and comforts they need, and therefore we feel grateful to those friends who, when called upon yearly by the collectors for the Refuge, kindly give donations to this Home.

The list of kind friends (not on the management) is considerable. Miss Ross, Jarvis St., left it a legacy of \$250, and Mrs. Donald McKay, Mrs. Grant and the Misses Crooks have, during the past year, taken the old people to their homes, or to the Island, and treated them in the most hospitable manner. We do with the utmost sincerity thank them. But these names do not by any means exhaust the list. Many others regularly and faithfully visit the inmates, giving religious instruction, encouragement and comfort; reading and singing to them, and in many ways adding to their enjoyment. The young ladies of the Flower Missions bringing flowers weekly. Our Heavenly Father will reward and bless them for it.

In addition, quite a number of clergymen and students from Knox and Wycliffe Colleges have given their services, both on Sabbath and week days, and also at funerals. All of which are much prized by the inmates, and for which the Managers tender their sincere thanks.

The medical attendance necessary for the Home was found to be more than could be expected from one medical man, and in May Dr. Scadding most willingly consented to share it with Dr. Wm. Caven. We cannot too strongly acknowledge our indebtedness to these gentlemen for the time, thought and care so gratuitously given.

We still retain the services of Miss Featherstonhaugh as matron, who is unremitting in her care and attendance to the inmates, and to the best interests of the Home.

To these reports may we not add, Give the prayers and means so necessary to the existence of these Homes, God will assuredly add His blessing.

MEDICAL OFFICERS' REPORT.

TORONTO, OCT. 14th, 1891.

To the Managers of the Industrial Refuge:

During the past year the health of the inmates has been exceptionally good, and we have had occasion to be called but seldom. Though typhoid fever and diphtheria have been so prevalent in the city, not one case occurred in the Refuge. The building is apparently in a good sanitary condition, still we deem it a wise step to have the plumbers occasionally inspect the plumbing, for "prevention is at all times better than cure."

To further the already good sanitary condition, we strongly recommend that the stoves be replaced by furnaces. Trusting that this may meet with your approval, we remain,

Your medical officers beg leave to report that during the past twelve months six deaths have occurred in the Home. Two from Cancer, one from Broncho-pneumonia, one from Chronic Bright's, one from Enteritis, and one from old age.

Although in this list only one appears as having died of "old age," five out of the six were upwards of eighty years of age. At the present time the health of the inmates is satisfactory.
