CHAMPIONSHIP OF REPUBLICANISM

ADoption OF THE RAILWAY RESOLUTIONS

It is with no ordinary feelings of pleasure, that we communicate to our readers the gratifying intelligence, that the resolutions offered by the Executive have been adopted by the House of Assembly.

The favorable opposition to the Government scheme, which was so boastfully threatened a fortnight ago, by a diminutive portion of the press in this city, became silent by degrees and beautifully less after the sound principles upon which that proposition was based, were carefully examined, and discussed in the proper quarter.

In those countries work has been undertaken for that object alone, not for the mere return which the work, whether railway, road, or canal, would make for itself.
