



which the treaty adopts for the Panama canal, is that the waterway shall be free and open to the vessels of commerce and war of all nations observing the rules on terms of entire equality, so that there shall be no discrimination against any such nation. It is said that the president's statement of the case is wholly at variance with the real provisions when he treats the words "all nations" as excluding the United States, because it had constructed the canal on its own territory of ownership including the right to allow its own commerce the use of the canal upon such terms as it saw fit.


