BODY'S ISLAND LIGHT HOUSE—THE NEW LIGHT RANGE AND BEARINGS.

WASHINGTON, July 12th, 1872.—The Lighthouse Board has given notice that the lighthouse at Body's Island, on the sea coast of North Carlina, between Cape Hatteras and Cape Henry, has been rebuilt, and that the light will be exhibited on or about the 1st of October, 1872, and every night thereafter, from sunset to sunrise. It is situated North of Oregon Inlet. One and half nau ical miles, and is about 2½ nautical miles northerly from the site of the former lighthouse, which was destroyed during the late w. The local plane is 150 feet above the ground, and 150 feet above the sea. The lens is dioptric, of the first order of the system of Fresnel, and will throw a fixed white light, illuminating the entire horizon, and can be seen from the deek of a vessel, 15 feet above the sea, at a distance of 18½ nautical miles.

The light will also illumnate the waters of Pamlico and Croatin Sounds within the same distance. The dome of the lantern, the railing, the brackets of the gallery and all the iron work will be painted black. The tower will be painted white.

The keeper's dwelling, two stories high, is of brick, has the usual outbuildings, and is placed to the westward of the tower. These buildings will be painted white.

The geographical position of this lighthouse, as shown by the United States Coast Survey Chart, is as follows—Lat 35 49 18 N, 10n 75 31 39 W.
