EXPLANATION

OF THE

PRINCIPAL ARTICLES

IN THE

CALENDAR FOR 1884.

All the calculations are reduced to the nearest minute of Local mean time at Charlottetown, with the exception of the Data required for Solar observations for Time and Latitude, namely:—The Equation of Time ("Sun fast or slow of clock) which is given for the instant of apparent Noon and the Sun's Declination for Mean Noon, both Greenwich Time.

If required, the Sun's Declination at Greenwich apparent Noon can be obtained by multiplying the hourly variation of Declination by the Equation of Time reduced to the decimal of an hour and adding or subtracting the result according to the conditions as given below.

From the Sun's apparent Semi-diameter which is given for each day of the year, may be found the Sun's horizontal Parallax, (which equal to the earth's apparent Semi-diameter as seen from the Sun's distance) by dividing the Semi-diameter by 107.44 which is the ratio of the Sun's actual diameter to that of the earth. Thus on July 1st when the Sun is at his greatest distance, Semi-diameter 15' 46"= \$\frac{946}{107.44}=8.805 horizontal Parallax on December 31st, the Sun being in perigee 16 18.2=978.2 \$\frac{918.3}{107.44}=9.106.

To find the Sun's Parallax in altitude, multiply the horizontal Parallax as found above by the cosine of the altitude.

Example:—What correction for Parallax is to be applied when Sun's altitude is 20° 30′ 30″ on the 31st December.

may be found by multiplying the time of sunset by 2. This is the case on April 14th, June 14th, August 31st and December 24th.

On the Right hand page of each month are the changes of the moon, its Rising, Southing, and Setting, with the time of High Water at Charlottetown. The bearing of the Moon at the time of the changes, the time of Perigee and Apogee, crossing the Equinoctial and of reaching its greatest North and South Declination, are given for the purpose of assisting and testing weather. It being generally found that the Lunar Equinoctials are marked by atmospheric disturbances, the stronger the more nearly the times agree with the moon's changes or Perigee. $\times \times$ and $\times \times \times$ are added to mark when two or three of these influences concur within 48 hours space.

ECLIPSES.

During the year 1884 there will be five Eclipses, three of the Sun and two of the Moon. Only one of the latter will be visible at Charlottetown.

I. A Partial Eclipse of the Sun, March 26th. Greenwich mean time of conjunction 18h. 15m. 33. 4 sec. Duration 1h. 40 m.

II. A Total Eclipse of the Moon, Greenwich mean time of opposition April 9th, 23h. 53m. 51.5 sec.

III. A Partial Eclipse of the Sun, April 25th. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 2h. 17m. 17.8 sec., visible at Patagonia and South Africa.

IV. A Total Eclipse of the Moon, October 4th. Greenwich mean time of opposition, 10h. 8m. 5.1 sec., partially visible at Charlottetown.

VENUS.—Venus, motion direct till June 19th, retrograde till August 2nd, after which direct till the end of the year, an Evening Star previous to her inferior conjunction with the Sun July 11th, after which she will reappear as a Morning Star_during the remainder of the year.

MARS.—Mars, apparent motion retrograde till March 13th, direct during the rest of the year, he will be in opposition to the Sun coming to the meridian at midnight, January 31st, after which an Evening Star throughout the year.

JUPITER.—Jupiter, apparent motion retrograde till March 2nd, direct till December 21st, then retrograde again in opposition to the Sun on the 19th of January, an Evening Star previous to his conjunction with the Sun after which he will reappear as an Evening Star during the rest of the year.

SATURN.—Saturn, retrograde till February 4th, direct till October 7th, after which retrograde again, in conjunction with the Sun June 3rd, in opposition to the Sun on the 11th December.

URANUS.—Uranus, retrograde till June 1st, then direct to the end of the year, in opposition to the Sun March 15th, in conjunction with the Sun September 20th.

NEPTUNE.—Neptune, retrograde January 29th, direct till August 26th, after which retrograde to the end of the year, in 'conjunction with the Sun May 10th, in opposition November 13th.

OCCULTATIONS.

In the course of every lunation the Moon passes each of the Planets in succession, the Planet being sometimes hidden by the moon. There will be eleven such occultations during the year, Mercury, August 22nd, Venus, February 29th and August 17th, Mars, August 24th, Saturn, January 8th, Neptune, January 7th, February 3rd, March 2nd 29th, June 20th and July 17th, but none of these will be observable here as they will all occur either in the day time or when the Moon is below the horizon.

3. If a storm arises from the East, on or immediately preceding the Spring Equinox, or a week after, the following Spring or Summer will be wet four times out of five; if from the West, North or South-west, the Spring and Summer will be dry five times out of six.

The rate of Postage on a letter posted within the Dominion of Canada, for transmission by Mail to any place in Canada, is three cents per half ounce weight; but the Statute provides that this rate must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the time of posting the letter.

Any such letter posted wholly unpaid (or prepaid less than one full rate of three cents) cannot be forwarded to its destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, with the reason plainly written or marked upon it—"postage not prepaid."

On letters posted at an Office to be delivered from it, commonly known as "drop letters," the rate is one cent per ½ oz.; to be in all cases prepaid by postage stamp affixed to such letters when posted.

The charge for the Registration of a letter is 2 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

Letters for Newfoundland are charged at the rate of five cents per half ounce, and must in all cases be prepaid.

The Registration fee to Newfoundland is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by Registration stamp.

CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

The rate of postage upon letters passing by mail between Canada and the United States is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by postage stamp.

The Registration fee to the United States is 5 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS ADDRESSED TO PLACES IN CANADA, NEWFOUNDLAND AND

UNITED STATES.

On all newspapers and periodicals other than those from the office of publication, including all newspapers and periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the postage rate is one cent per 4 ounces, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals weighing less than one oz. may be posted singly; if prepaid by postage stamp, one-half cent each.

Newspapers and periodicals published in the United Kingdom, and re-posted by News Agents to regular subscribers, are not liable to any additional postage.

PARCEL POST.

To any part of the Dominion, for each parcel weighing Not more than 4 ozs., 6 cents,

Exceeding 4 ozs., and not exceeding 8 ozs., 12 cents, Each additional 4 ozs. or fraction, 6 cents.

Parcels should not exceed 5 lbs. in weight or 24 inches in

MISCELLANEOUS POSTAL MATTER,

VIZ., BOOKS AND PAMPHLETS, PRINTED CIRCULARS, PRICES CURRENT, HANDBILLS, ENGRAVERS' BLOCKS, ETC., ETC.

When posted addressed to any place in Canada, and not exceeding 5 lbs. in weight, 24 inches in length, and 12 inches in breadth, or depth, must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the rate of 1 cent per 4 ounces in weight, and must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Such books, papers, returns, etc., must not be accompanied by any instructions or directions.

Legal and Commercial papers generally are liable to letter rate of Postage.

The rate of postage on Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs and Roots is 1 cent per 4 ounces, the weight of a package not to exceed 24 ounces.

USEFUL HINTS.

Register all valuable letters, and use sealing wax for letters containing money.

Transmit money by Money Orders.

Make complaints and enquiries in writing.

Preserve and request correspondents to preserve envelopes' of mis-sent or delayed letters,

Send to the Postmaster envelopes of letters about which you seek information or make complaint.

Business men should be careful to authorize but a limited number of persons to receive their letters, and only those in whom they have full confidence.

A Letter or Packet once posted becomes the property of the person to whom addressed, and must be forwarded to its destination. On no application, however urgent, can it

Letters addressed to initials or to fictitious names cannot be delivered, but will be returned to the writers through the Dead Letter Office, unless the address contains a designated place of delivery; thus, a letter addressed to A. B., Post Office, Charlottetown, would be returned to the writer, but a letter addressed A. B., care of John Jones, box No. 781, would be delivered at the address designated.

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit by Money Order, if possible. If sent by letter, it should always be registered.

No single Money Order, payable in the Dominion of Canada, can be issued for more than \$100; but as many of \$100 each may be given as the remitter requires.

Money Orders on the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, the United States, British India, Italy, Germany, Switzerland, Jamaica, New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania, are drawn in Canada Currency, and may be had for any sum not in excess of \$50; but Postmasters are at liberty to issue several orders of \$50 each, if required by the remitter.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

CANADA.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandize, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of *One Cent* per 4 ounces weight, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection.

UNITED STATES.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandize, posted for places in the United States, are subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, prepaid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ozs. in weight.






