As The World retired, after thanking the P. M., Mr. Patteson called after him to ask why The World was pitching into the exemption of dominion salaries from municipal taxation. He asked if he could possibly defend the exemption, the P. M. admitted that it was based on me good or fair business principles—but, and he: "The cities should be grad to forge the trifle in question, when you consider that the heads of the civil service on whom the taxation would fall most heavily, are the worst paid men in the sountry. I have no end of correspondence and interviews, to preserve discipline among 120 men, am responsible for an immense sum of cash handled in the money order and savings bank offices, and am paid \$3000. The salary paid to men with equivalent responsibilities in private business would be double mine. My predecessor had \$3500, when the business here was less than half what it is now.
