CURRENT TRADE CUNDITIONS
ONTARIO.
It is difficuit to gave a statement of the lumber market that will show the true situation, but it may be said with ceriainty that the tendency of white pine prices is upwards. Very rew manufacturers are now issising price lists, for the reason that they have not sufficient stock to offer. Almost every grade is well sold out, the heaviest stocks, perhaps, being in mill culls and common pine plank: Prices of the higher grades inave shown a wide fluctuation during the past two weeks, as some manufacturers are appareatly more impressed than others with the scarcity of these grades, and are asking conespondingly bigher prices. This is also true in respect to lath and shingles, as is demonstrated by the fact that an Oitavea valley manufacturer is asking \$3.50.for No. 1 lath at the mill. This figure, however, does not represent ithe average market quotation. There is considerable inquiry lor stock for future delivery, and the trade are inclined to
the opinion that prices next season will be fully as bigh as in 1901.

In hardwoeds there has been some improvement. Carloanl shipments of eim, birch ard maple to the United States are being regularly made by manufaciurers in the Wiarton district, and it is said that the uspection has not been as severe as last vear, thus indicating a stronger mar. ket. It is now certain that fewer hard. wood logs will be taken out this season than last winter, as millmen are bepinning to renlize that it is more profitable to leave the timber on the stump than it is to sell it as lumber when prices are low and inspection hard.

QLEBPC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.
Late report from the eastern provinces seem to show that conditions $2 .-$ quite favorable for spruce lumber. Stociks in most districts are below what they were one year ago, while enqüuities for next year's cut are quite numerous. South Ancerican specifications are much in favor, and if the demand should contince large shipments will be made to that country next season. Full prices are being asked and will no doubt be obiained, as the log supply is likely to be small and insufficient to keep the mills at work throughout the season. Cedat shingles continue strong, on the basis of $\$ 3.30$ for extras: Bosion delivery. Ocean freights have fallen and are dull, while rail freights to the United Siates rule high. MANITOBA AND BRITISII COI.UBBIA.
The lumber movement at the present time is confined largely to finishing material. This is comparatively large: as building operations in Winnipeg during the past year were on an extensive scale. There is a good outloole for next spriag, as retail dealers are not heavily stocked. British Columbia mills continue busy. Several vessels are loading at Chemainus for Australia. The frcight market has strengthened considerably, the rate being fully three shillings higher than six weeks ago. There is an exceptionally strong demand for cedar logs. More camps than usual are at work, and a scarcity of men is reported. It is feared that there will be a break in the shingle market owing to the increased production resulting from the several new mills aboút to be put into operation.

## UNITED STATES

The holiday season has curtailed the lumber demand, but the market has lost none of its strenglt. On the other hand,
the year closes with high prices and the outlook favorasiefor a continuation of a firm and adman cong rnarkef. This apples to almost evert class of lumber, with white piaceocurpying the first position. The upper grades are soscarcethat it is inpossible so find a sufficient quantity to meet the requirements of the market, while the lower grades are gradually becorning stronger. It is reported that in Tonamands prices of the lower qualities haverecentlybeenadvancedquite sh apply, and dealers are predicting a further adrance os s some items sulthin the next month. It is estimated that Chicago dealers who incetofore bought most of their stock at Duluth and Ashland have pu, chased at least one hundred million feet of waite pine lumber al interior mills to be ship pipped to their yards next season. In Clever and dealers are asking an adrance of from $\mathrm{St}_{1}$ to $\$_{2}$ a thousand on selets, fine common and No. 1 and No. 2 shop. Numerous enquiries are in the market forherrilock lumber. The base price in New York is now established at $S_{15}$, while during ellie last week prices have ad vance in North 7 onzwanda until some items are selling at the base price of $\$ 16$ and as high as $\$ 17$ in a lew instances. The hardwood market conlinus to show a far degree of activity. There is a good demand for basswood. elm, and black ash. At a meeting of the Chicago Hardwood Lumber Exchange held last week, discussion revealed the lace that firsts and seconds bass wood, birch and ash were extremely scarce, also that many of the dealers were selling some varieties ollurnber at less than they could be replaced. Accordingly, adprances wert decided upon.

## gREAT BRITAIN.

Asustralat this period of the year, the business dons in lumber is of a quiet character, yet the British market seems to be breaking away from the weal. ness and uncertainty which characterized it through the grate $=$ part of the past year. Somme shippers have not yet submitted
their price lists for next season. The question now seems to be how much higher prices will 80 for the irstopenwater stocks. This is particularly the case in respect to Canadian lumber, which is showing marked strength. Considerable quantities of spruce deals are said to have been bought for next year at high figures, but even if freight's can be obtained at the present rates, which are ex: remely low, the opening prices are not likely to be below those now ruing. The stock of spruce in all the United Kingdom ports is abnormally low, especoaly in Liverpool and the Bristol Chan nee. A very light stock of $11 \times 3$ and 9 $x$ is held. While pine deals are in heavier stock than spruce, theyare rapidly going into consumption. The stack of waney pine is very small and the prices asked for next season's production are said 10 be the highest ever known. The 1 m . porters Section of the Timber Trade Federation took no action at their meeting last week regarding prices, on the ground that it was not practicable to pass a resolution defining any particular course.
