Abalong, containing 200,000 and 300,000 people. The principhl products for exporta. tion are sugur, coffee, ten, rice, indigo and tobneeo, but the chief trade is in sugar; coffee and tobreco.
-The ege tride with Great Britain, while fairly large, has not been equal to exbectations. At the closo of last season sonne inferior stock went out, and the mode of packing did not give satisfaction. This caused a slow demand at the opening of the new year., but shippers profiterl by the mistake, and the business latterly has been on the increase. Exports from this port during the season of mavigation just closed amounted to 29,586 eases, or almost $1,600,000$ dozen, compared with 38,015 cases, or about $1,900,000$ dozen, durmg; the season of 1891.
-Winuipeg advices give details of the Stewart Sills' estate. Sills died of small-
pox in July last and it is believed: that his stock became infected, as he lived above his store and was about until within a few days of his death. His stock is valued at $\$ 5,000$. It is stored in Morden, Man., but camot be sold bufore it is disinfected nuder the supervision of govermment henlth officer. The process may be expensive and is also likely to diminish the ralue of many of the goods. Notes and book accounts to the amount of about $\$ 1,100$ lave been handed to the administrator for collection, but what they will realize camot even be conjectured at the moment. A few cases of stock, which were not exposed to infection, are to bog sold this week. Croditons' clams are not all in, but will probably reach $\$ 5,000$. It is not unlikely that the govermment will offer the creditors a sum of money for the relief of the muncipnlity, which is supposed to be legally liable to the estate for the way in which the groods iwere hunded. it is clatued that the books kept by the deceaseil have been lost or destroyed, and that it will be impos. sible to get in a large amount of the book debts, which otherwise might have been collected.

lication shows that some word of command gas been given which is being obeyed all along the line. As publicists, we can searcely say that the question is appronched by them in the way the real position of the interest concerned amongst us demands and we shall endeavour to place it in what seems to us to be the true light.
The oll industry in Canada is not a new thing and there is scarcely a business in the civilized world since the discovery of Petroleum that has been exposed to more severe and

## violent fluctuations.

In the carly days of this industry amongst us, when the Canadian production in proportion to United States production was much greater than it is now, our United States friends imposed a duty of only T wenty cents a gallon on our Crude, and Forty cents a galloa on our Refined entering there-the small American gullon at that. It was not a question of percentage of duty with them at all Calculatec according to the methods some people use, the duty then imposed on us averaged one thousand to three thousand per cent. It was intended to be-and it was what it was intended to be-Prohibtion of importation of our on there.

The early oil operators in Cunada thus had a vary bitter experience, but the effects of confederation in giving a larger home market-the increase in consumption-gradually remeded this state of matters, and the time came when the general market conditions admitted of its export to Europe. Now, to show how closely this industry was watched and repressed. Reiners began to shlp to U. S. the residues, for which then, in Cumada, Hiere was not much use. the ordinary gencral tapif rate was mposed ut first, as the articio was not particularly speci.
ficd; but so soon the the importation began to be felt, the condilions of admission were alteret so as to be virtually a Prohibitions of the import of this-the same as with straight Erude and Refined. Their erude at that time was $\$ 5$ to $\$ 6$ a barrel and ours $\$ 1.95$ to $\$ 1.50$.

By and bye the conditions of produetion changed, and Crude there becime much cheapor. Canadian yofiners could not continue to export and the disistrous losses experienced in consequence by the oil interest can only be understood by those who luave gone through a shrinkage crisis.
The altered conditions of the business generally called for re-consideration of the Excise and Customs laws regarding it, and in 1877 the Mackenzic goverinmeat made the duty at the point at which it now stands, and abolished the internal Revenue tax which then was on Fetroleum.
But about the time the Conservative government took office, a very serious evil began to manifest itself. Our Inspection system as to safety was not so complete as now, and our tire-test was much lower. Importations of unsuie oil were made and a.great number of fatal accidents ensued. In the interest of the public safety, the Goveriment had to get down to its'primary dutyprotection of Mif. This was dealt with in 1881. The regulations under which the public administration of this business is carried on, were all made then, having the
public safety in view.
and they have worked well and most efficiently for the puipose aimed at.

But againsince thac time producing conditions in the United: States have somewhat changed and at present Crude is produced there chaper-than we can do it.

The general conalition of our indus-
trial policy must now be referred to. The question of Security to Investiment, which was made the fundamental utterances of the Government in 18S2, when appeting to the country, was endorsed and ratilied by the Country, and the government continued in power.
The well-known policy of a civilized country, where rested interests are concenned, and the specific assurance given by the country to investors and those who develop its resourees, have thus kep totl-men in Canadr pushing on, with the result that the

## production has dounied

 In ten years. That ratio of increase without any of the favouring-influences of large strikes, such as the United States has had experience of recently, is very good.It will, of course, be kent in mind that the economical conditions of oil production are largely affected by the genmal tariff system : and all articles re: quired etther in production or manu. facture, have thenr pilees affected by the mational system. Outsfide competitors, of course, are not subject to these conditions at this stuge.
It lukewise has to be kept in mind that the National Policy system; which is intended to develop growth and diversity of industry, cannot necessarily come to its maturity in one year or in ten years. Industries nust an have a begiming in-some locality, somewhere, and the cry that the whole country is taxed for one locality is thus ridiculous. : As a nation we are aunit. Inside the national area, favouring circumstances will speedily determine individual investment in speelfe industries. Oil prices remained so low in Canada tor years: that no encouragement existed for exploration after now fields. 'From recent atteimpta' it 'would not be surprising to find
 und there are some places in thls Provinco:tiotabiy In Gaspe- that under favoutable conations might develop Into ollicenties: ata to our North-Weat, the Goverments' own report shows it only to $100 \cdots$ a question of time, with setticment, and establishment of communtications, for an enormous ficla to be develoned there.
Therefore, because at present, the conditions of production in Un!ted States make it cheaper to produce than in Cantha, are we to forcget the past, when the conditions were different? are we to lgnore the contribution the oil industry makes to the general taxation syetem of the country, and the vested vights the industry has acquired?

The accumulation of such experiences In every business created that feeling which grew and was formulated into TheNatioualPolicy, and any chunge that may bo made should be in harmony with the general principles of that system.
At present, ofl men require the pro. tection, but the duty itself is not added to the cost of the goods. Some most
rumishy statements as to prices are circulated. In a recent gigantic mental effort on the part of some one, oil was satid to be 10 cents in Porthand anil 28 ecs , in Montreal. The 10 cts . In Portiand means 12 ets. for our gallon, and as good oil of Canadian manufacture has been sold all season in Montreal. at $1: 23$ ets. Our readers will remember our recent reference to Wine gallon and haperial gallon measures.

Twe can play with statistics. There are statisties and statistics. If the battie is to be by statistics, the workings of the general syytem of oil distribution in United States may be statistically referred to, and two things would be established, namely that $U$. S. oll-men and their satellites are no phlanthropists, and that the Gunadian operator gives full value for the price. The amount of capital, time, and life efforts expended in the development of The Cunaditu Oll industry should really keep. people of any power of thought, or: even common sense, from indalging in the:

in pecent years which were put up as high at one time as ours. Such alteration of test-law would involve some change in system of manufacture, which it would take some time to adjust; but if any other legislative change is called for at present, we would say let the Industry have due and timely notice, so that its case can be properly presented, and the enquiry entered into Whether the last fourteen yeur, policy meaus anything, and whether our industrial system is to be irittered away piecemen whenever changes in price take place in a competing commodity from another country. Against such disturbances and the fluctuntions arising from them, the National Policy was specially intended to protect. Operatious in Canada have been entered into under this idea, and the fact of U . S . laving at present an abnormally large Crude production, should not intluence governmental action so as to wipe out th community. For quality and price, the people of Canada

## are better served

by their own oil men than ever before and the general polley will ere long in this matter, receive an ample vindication.
The state of production in U. S. today may be that of Cunada to-morrow. The result of the drill cannot be anticipated. Commercial policy must be fixed and consistent to secure any result whatever. The purtisuns who talk swindle, monopoly, oil-kings and sueh trash, are
absolutily ignorant
of what they profess to write about. The real stake in the matter is-the existence of the entire Oil industry of Cunada, and we do not think at present, that ofle country is prepared to vote that out of existence with all the inevitable consequences.

## DEPOSITS BETWEEN BANKS.

In dealing with the figures of the October statement we hinted that the deposits between Banks might partake of the nature of borrowings,' It was not intended to convéy the erroncous impression that all these deposits should bo classed under that head, for we are aware that there are Banks not possessing branches in Montreal, To-
ronto, and other lerge cities requiring the interventiou, there; of :other,instilutions as Agents, with whomideposits are lodged on Current Accolint for the purpose of protectingevaluitions on those centres.
Again, there are Bunks in the larger cities whose convenience is suited"by becoming depositors with the larger institutions in the same place, and creating credit balances of considerable proportions in their hands.
In both cases, where the figures prepouderate over a fixed or fair working balance they are movable to special aecount or are represented by a 'depositreceipt;' but in both instances included under the headiug of the Return 'deposited on demand or after notice with other Banks in Canada.'
Further, Danks with casual correspondents in the various provinces allow their remittances of cash, or their discounts and coliections matured and paid, to aecumulate with these correspoudents until lage enough in amount to warrant the issue of a drait in reimbursement, but we incline to the belief that the relative entries for these items whll be found in the columin of the 'dally exehtuges' rather than in that of the ' leposits with other Banks, etc.'
The point, however, to which at the time of making our comments in a Lormer issue, we gave the greater heed was the disagreement between the two sides of the Return in regard to these same 'deposits,' certain of the Banks claming to have
placed elsewhere a sum of $\$ 3,667,835$ of which only . . . . . . . 3,102,931 was neknowledged,
leaving a difference of . . . $\$ 564,90$. In some cases it is ayparent to even the unprofessional eye where the deposits have gone, but taling the Returu ats a whole we cannot account for the wide disparity between tho totals.
All the current account balances, we tan be certain, are acknowledged by the larger Baulis, aud this only helps to give a graver aspect to the disagreement of the If igures. With so many Banks in cach locality between which Interchanges of funds, and settlements, are effected, it is unlikely that items in transitu by either post or expressitems outside of the tellers' holdings -would aggregate so large a sum as $\$ 564,004$. If proof however be forthcoming to the contray then the whole matter is at rest and we need glve the discrepancy in the figures no further concern.

That there are borrowers amongst the Banles owning receipt of deposits, we are quite convinced, but they cannot be mamed, and others who would disduin to borrow come under an unjust suspicion of belongitig to the borrowing class.
The Banks will no doubt in the course of time have the specifications of the Returs amended.

## DLECTIRIC JIGET IASPECTION.

We understand that the Cundian Fire Underwriters Association propose to make arrungements for the inspection of the wires used for electrie lighting. We are not aware to what extent it is intended to curry such inspection, but if, -as it is rumoured-it is proposed to examine the interual wires of all buitdings fitted up for lighting by electricity we camot help thinking that the fite insurance companies will be attempting an impossible task, the reasous for which ure two-fold. Fiirst, while-it may be tolerably easy to inspect the wires of those buildings, into whick the clectric system of illumination has been introduced, subsequent to the erection of the said edifices, because the wites are exposed to view, as is sometimes the case witb gas pipes, which have been put in, after the buildlings have been completed, yet it must be remembered, that as the new method of lighting becomes general-as we believe it shortly will do-the wires will be inserted in all new buildings, as much concenled from sight, as are the present gas pipes. Then the iuspection will be a very different affuir, and will have to be performed, before the floors, cellings and walls are closed, and a periodical re-inspection would le proctically out of the question. Even the first iuspection alone would entail an amount of labor and expense, which if added to the premiums, would make the electric system of lighting more costly than that of coat oll lamps, and this rould surely be one of the nost grotesque bat res eyer perpetrated in fire uuderwriting

Just supgose for a moment that owiug ta the dangers fom leakáse and explosion, the insurance companies were to undertake the examination of all
the gas plpes, with whioh every warehouse; factory oud didelling is fitted up Yet-it will not beevery foug; beforgia similat: examination mill haye torme periormed swhen, electric highting, he: ocmes as unfersal-as gas:is at presenu, if:the compuriesisdeem it necessary; to caryy out a-geperal inspection of: the wires. Secondy the first -inspection, will bo by no means sufficient: to guaantec the permanent saiety: or perfect insulation of the wires. Lamp chimneys break, gas pipes wear: out, and in like manner, $\because$ wires cannot bo: constructed, or laid down, to last for all time. Those wires may be quite sound and perfectsy insulated when the build. ing ,in which they are put is erected, and still in one, six; or twelve months, through the dislodgement of some phaster or other trival ineident, a defect occurs, perhaps not suificient, at the moment, to be dangerous, but enough to require repairing; or it may be a ligit is wanted where none existed preriousily. In such cases-which would aggregute a considerable number-we presume the underwiter's iuspector, - would have to certily that the aepair or addition, was properly completed, and we need hardly point out, that a periect legion of inspectors would be neenssury to carry out this work batisfactorily.
The fict is, every system of lighting is attended with its own particuiar dangers, and in our opinion, fire underwiters have to consider those dangers, in connection with the respective merits of cach system and strike the balance to determine in which lies the greatest sufety. We leelieve that with regard to clectric lighting; the fire hatard "inside " the building is small cthe electric current being comparatively weak) and less than gas, or, of course, coal oil. Such hazard exists prineipally "outside" the "building or where the dynamo is situated; and we thitik inspection can be only successfully èxercised respecting these points. aThe Oity of Montreal is not only becoming more and more disigured, by a' network of telegïuph; lighting, and tröley wire, but the increased fire risk from such is growing more apparent every week, and it would bo wher for the lusurance companies to deal with those manifest dangers to lie and property, to when our wutcipal rulers appea itterly indiffere (so long as the contracts suit themj, tian to attenpt to in. augurate a system of Inspection, when besdes beng beyond their powers woula be of such an inquistorial taturo that would not only disgust the pubHe, butbing dsrepute upon to wothy assoclation.

We deemit inadvisable for the insuirance companics to endeavour to handicap new inventions. Gas was as littecunderstood at one time as electrielty is now, and has its own inherent danger ; but the companies consider the latter is more than counter-balanced by the merits it possesses over oil or candles. Let-the companies judge in a like manner of the new method, and, agdinst tine danger which it' must have in respect of wites becoming not'insulated ete., set off the absence of matehes or inflammable vapor, and rate accordingly.

## HIGHEL LDDUCATION.

The namerons seminarics, colleges, and institutions of learning in the province tes'tily to the great worlk that has belen. attempted in the cause of higher education. The eures, especially, lave linterested themselves in this matter, and their offorts linve largely ted, not only to the ercetion of the necessary buildings, but to the peopling of them with students.
In the old days of the colony the leaders of our French population recognizad that fi their rights were to be secured and ruarded, istatumen and ehurehnen wero wanted, and they looked to the diffusion and progress of elassienl studies as the means to this emb. Mora than one cure has sent a dozen or more selolats of his parish to college at his own expense, and lnes lived to set some of them becone distinguished in the service of the state and chureh. The result of these efforts has 'been to develop a tasto for higher edueation, all very well in its way, but a mistake lans been to muke theology, medicine and law the chief aim of the student, to the neglect of other proctical studies. 'Phe system pursucd luns crowded the professions, and the present financial condition of the province will convince none that luwyers aind doetors make the best legishators, in fact most people are of the opinion that practical business men only should be at the hend of afinirs, especinlly at this c!risis.

In the present age there is stopo for nall educated young men in indastrial life and scientific pursuits, where the trained head con assist the trained hand, and if we are not to bue behind the other prorincey of the Dominion, intellectual development must change its aims and objects to $n$ considerable extent. The bonefactors of our leading Montreal university lave given as ar practical oxample of their convictions in this respect by rocent: ontowments to techical departments. Our munfacturing interests lave, in a few scura, beome varied and important; and Lrive a widder fiold to nativo talent but agriculture is still tho main source of our national wealtls. If our towne
are to flourish, our rural districts mug be prosperons. The elergy can devote their real to no better chase than the diffusion of sound agricultural studies. So far the results obtaindal "by'the provincial schools of agriculture liave not been satisfactory: and the commissioner of agriculture recently appealed to the clergy and leading agriculturists Ior their co-operation, which, no ploift, win be ehcerfully gievin. In the old days the cure 'built the college arid found the scholaps, now he is asked to encourage improved methods of agriculture by finding students for farm schools provided by the government.
The Hon. Mr. Beaubien in his place in Whe house last segsion grew quite enthusinstic on this subject, and his words will bear reproduction.
"Sutcess," he sajd, "has been obtained in an enterprise much more arduous than the enterprise I put before you to-day, for, indeed. the task then was not to searels aiter the son of a farmer to convert lime into a farmer, but, so to sjeale, to go to the very antipoiles of things-to visit the ubode of the farmer to find a man who one day might be called upou to govern the nation. The son of the "voy. "greur" Who passed his life in the bush; the son of the peusant-soldier, who degerted the phough for the musket; the youth born ;in the humblest grado of society-all these were taken, educated and then placed at the head of a nution; out of them was ;selected in distiuguished prelate, a Carlier, a pirpineau. (Checrs.) Thus, by going from one extremity of the social scale to the other, prodigies were accomplished. Out of a population composed of a great part of voyageurs and poor peasants, means were found to form men highly elucatel, men who lave worthily occupied the most clevated positions, men who have dome honor to our country, ats they would have dond honor to any country in which they might lave happened to have lived. At the time When we were conquered, and reduced, nolgabraically gpeaking, to our simplest expression; at the time when France was abundoning us, we were endowed with new chicis. Let the elergy agrain afford us the co-operation of their intelligence and of their devotion, and the restoration of our "griculture-is assured."

## the monetary conferbence.

Although the committeo appointed to discuss the Rothschild's plan has reportied adrersely, it is possible that it will yet be brought before the full conference for an expression of opinion. fimong the modifieations suggested in committee were that no limitation be made on the price of the proposed annual Europeai purchases of $30,000,000$ ounces of silver, that the purchases be ovor and above the ordinary
purchases for tokon coinage and metal, and that the purchnses be employed as money, either by coimge or as a metallic basis of notes to be issuced. These modificantions increased the value of the plan in the cyes of the bi-metallists. it has tranbired that the delegntes of the countries belonging to the Latin union roted ugainst the Rothsehild's proposuls on the ground thint they were not able to recommend Gheir goveruments to increase their stock to silver under the limited purchase scheme fand because the Latin Union could not. increase their present silver currency withont international free coinge being established. With regard to the plan of Moritz Levy; which jucludes the withdrawal of all gold coins under the value of twenty' frames, Sir C. Freemantle, deputy master of the British mint, declared he could not: promise the consent of the British government to the withdrawal of its half-sove ereign pieces. The British and Internatiomal Currency association will send a memorial to Sir Wm. Verion Harcourt, chancellor of the exchequer, asking him to instrut the British delegates to the Intermational Monetary conference to entertain any reasomable proposals for the establishment of an intermational currency. It is significam that the leading British financial!phpers reeur to their prediction that the:conference will not adopt anything practicable. One writer to the press stated that he advocated the liothchild plan for the sole reason that a delay in the bilver pole: lupse in the United States woild enablo Indio and other countries to arrange their financial systems.
A. deRothschild's opinion at a recent session apitenss to have hat much weight. He remared that a gold standard in laglana is the only possible one, "and if we consider tinat her whole commerce and a great part of that of other comatrics is carried on by bills of exchange on Loudon, which are payable in gold, it must be admitted that the world generaly transacts business on a gold basis, and that a double standard, except in a wery modifien form, does not exist, even in those countries professing to pay in either.motal. Whatever international agreement should be made, and whatever ratio should be estimated. gold alone will be chosen aty the farorite medium of settling large debts or making large aemittances. It would bo impossible to femit large isums ofi:silver abroad, owing to the bulk.. Gold would be sent if it had to be bought at a premium."

A London correspondent, who appears to have full-grasp of the subject, states that only a moderate interest is taken in the conference in Eugland. The gold stendard is so tirmly. establibhed that nobody - believes for moment it can bo disturbed: Couscquatly the discussions Bruspels are
regarded as $\_$partaking of a doctrinaire, rather than of a practical busininess sharucter, and very fer persons appear even to have followed them. Mr. Bertram Currie undoubtedly gave expression to the opinfons of the government, the Buik of Lingland and commercial men gencrally; when he roundly declared that the gold standard would eventually trinmph, even in the United States. At any rate, Englund cannot and will not chauge it. This being the opinion of almost all who have real influence in city affairs, the conference can only end oue way so far as Lingland is concerned, and the majority of the other delegates are avidently prepured to take the same ground. Mr. Currie in his spiecth at the conferance denied that evils are impending to the world from a disuse of the silver standard. The costly silver experiments of the Unites States, lie said, are never likely to fiml imitators. The conference had met to endeavor to raiso hee price of commodities, an object that was entirely opposed tothe ceonomic doctrines accepted in Great Britain. Cheap goods, not dear: goods; plenty, not searcity, had always been held to be conditions favorble to trade. That a gencral fall in prices had been brought about by a searcity of gold had never been proved. Such a theory is at variance with the fucts within ont knowledge. Mr. Currie is the strongest personality among the British delegates and he will not budge an inch towards a compromise.

## RAILWAY ECONOMIES

A western correspondent wrote to a lendjur New York paper recently the presult of interviews held with prominent railway men in Chieago. The manager of one of the largest lines centering in that city said: "It is our aim to place our line in a physical condition that will enable us to handle a greatly eularged business without entailing a corresponding increase in operating expenses. Hence we are making substantial improvements wherever it cun be adrãitageously done." In this comection it is proper to say that there is a growing tendency to the use of heavier fails. The manager of one of the bestknown lines in the country recently said : "The 66 and 70 -pound mils are gradu: aly giving way to 80 and 80. -pound, which I think will prove more conomieal, as they furnish n more substenitinl) and :in consequence a safer track, which is demanded by the large-sized cars and heavy locomotives: now : so rapidly coming in use." The introduction of the latter is' also compelling the displacement of wooden trostles and bridges, as such etractures are unable to xupport tho :heary polling stock and the incensed loads carrich. It is: raid that the main line of tho Chicago, Burlington \& Quincy has now only two wooden bridges on it, and they will be replaced with steel structures before the
close of 1893. The mood trestles have also been replaced by steel, and the present and prospective low miee of the latter materinl renders the cost of structures built exclasively with it not materially greater than if made of wood. The low mates of axpense oi mantenance, and the loug serviee of steel bideges and trestles, compared with those built of timber, also demand that the latter be disended as rapidly as nossible. The cheapness with which lowgrode trucks can be operatted is also roeriving the attention of railway officinls, and nearly all the large corporations whose lines focus at Chicago are discussing the necessity of lowering their grades wherever possible. Manager Merrill, of the Burliurton system, in speaking of the advantage of low grades, said: "I consider the mensure more important than the introduction of very large engines. The fact that the Lake Shore de Michigan Southern is able to earn good dividends and at the same time make heavy outlays for maintaining the physical condition of the propertr on such a high standard, is Jargely due to the reduction of its grade during the last decade and a half. An ordinary eugine will haul a very heavy train over a fifteen-ioot grade with much greater ease than the same load can be moved on a twenty-foot grade by one of the large and heavy locomotives now being intupduced on the New York Central and Pennsylvania, bristems. The saving in cost of track maintemance and motive power by lowerfing grades will also quickly pay for the work necessary to reduce the grades ion most lines." Another experienced railwayt man was equally pronounced in favor of lowering grades, which he said when accomplisled would enable the roads materially to enlarge their net-carnings without any inerease on the present tariff rates. ILe thought standard locomotives amply: sufficient for the work, provided there was a lessening of grades, and that the large engines now coming into use were necessary only on the Enstern Trunk and Transcontinental lines, on which it is in many instanes impossible to secure low grades. But he strongly favored the use of eighty to cighty-five pound rails when tracks are renewod, also the displacement oi woolen trestles and bridges with steel. He thought the stoekholders of railways could atford to wait for tividends while such improvements were being made, ns the futwe caring fower of their property would be materially incrensed.

## BANK CLERKSHITS.

Mr. Jas, G. Cannon, viee-president of the Fourtll Wallonal Dank, New York, is an educator, after the example of his chife, Mr. J. E. Simmona. We had to notice: recently the lattor's pamphet on the Silver question, in which, however, ho guite ignored the colnage of Canadu. In a paper which Mr. Cannon prepared recently, we find the following pertiuent remarks conuerning. "Banking als a profession for young, mon":

There exists a bellef that'for a young man rabout to engago imtsauking, thiore Is ilttle oreno, prospect boyond $a=s$ sat on astool poring ororta ledger, at $n$ salary af a thousand dollaris a year.
To my mlad, however; there is to-day no "more attractive field for an ambitlous young man than is offered aby the banking buginess. I have been trying to dispel the popular prefudice which giems
to exist in regard to employes of bauks: I recoguize the fact that a young man who is the reefpent of ne fali balary in an institutlon and has become familhar with one class of work, which he can'performi witli quielines and aceuraey, the routinues to do that work satislactorily he virtually has secured a lifo position: consequently a harge number of bank clerks settle dowir and are contentito go forward in the snmed rut, year In and yenr out. It is a well-known fact that nithank elerk generally marifes young, and having taken the lenp into matrimony and incurred additional responsibility, if he has a moderately good income, he is reluctant, to take the risk of making a change, con:sequently ho la apt to get into-4 rut from which it is sometimes diffieult to. extricate hlm.
For an ambitious young man, who will start at the very fomidatlon of the business, and be content to sweep out the ofile, and work early and late, in benson and out of season, always keeplag in mind the bank's interests, studying all tinancial problems whith ocem from day to day as best he can, reading tho literature on the subject and posting himselt theroughly on all points pertaining to the busbess, and not being afrusd to movo forward and take responsibility upon hilmself, to this class of men tho doors of the banking laterest are thrown wide open and thepe ts plenty of room within. The banking business has greater demands made upon it from day to day, and is more closely alled to all the diversilied business interests of this country, thau any other pursuit, and there is now more room at the top in this protession than in gny other.
We all know that bank are busy.places, and many times clerks grow despondent and disheartened after having worked hard and faithfulty, feeling that thefr work has not been noticed or appreciated, and they may perhaps allow themselves to get into the habit of shitring when they bellove it will not bo diseovered, or carelessly handing apparenilly unimportant matters. They should never lose heart, for faithful and conselentions work ennnot be concenled and always comes to the front.

\section*{SLLK AND MITBONS}

A large Amerienn ribhom buyer, just returned from Eurupe, state thit be found tha production of raw silk up to and hachaing 1 s 90 , had never been over-taken by tho consumption. In 185a, however, the silk trade ande auch fuprovement that tho crop of that year was fully absorbed, and tho thocks carried over from 1800 disappeared also. This year the trade had therefore to depend upon eurrent stappies, and to face a mospective shortage.
